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AN ACT

Amending the act of December 12, 1994 (P.L.1023, No.139), entitled "An act establishing the Statewide Independent Living Council; providing for the powers and duties of the 2 3 council; providing for a State plan for the provision of services to people with disabilities; providing for grants and funding for establishment of centers for independent 6 living; and requiring centers for independent living to 7 maintain certain standards and give certain assurances in 8 order to qualify for assistance," further providing for 9 10 definitions and for grants and funding. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 12 hereby enacts as follows: 1.3 Section 1. Section 3 of the act of December 12, 1994 14 (P.L.1023, No.139), known as the Independent Living Services 15 Act, is amended by adding definitions to read: Section 3. Definitions. 16 17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 18 19 context clearly indicates otherwise: 20 * * * 21 "Individual who is deafblind." An individual:

(1) Who has a central visual acuity of 20/200 or less in

- 1 the better eye with corrective lenses or a field defect such
- 2 that the peripheral diameter of visual field subtends an
- 3 angular distance no greater than 20 degrees or a progressive
- 4 <u>visual loss having a prognosis leading to one or both</u>
- 5 conditions.
- 6 (2) Who has a chronic hearing impairment so severe that
- 7 <u>most speech cannot be understood with optimum amplification</u>
- 8 <u>or a progressive hearing loss having a prognosis leading to</u>
- 9 <u>this condition.</u>
- 10 (3) For whom the combination of impairments described
- 11 <u>under paragraphs (1) and (2) causes extreme difficulty in</u>
- 12 <u>attaining independence in daily life activities, achieving</u>
- 13 <u>psychosocial adjustment or obtaining a vocation.</u>
- 14 (4) Who despite the inability to be measured accurately
- for hearing and vision loss due to cognitive or behavioral
- 16 constraints, or both, can be determined through functional
- and performance assessment to have severe hearing and visual
- 18 disabilities that cause extreme difficulty in attaining
- 19 independence in daily life activities, achieving psychosocial
- 20 adjustment or obtaining vocation objectives.

- 22 "Support service provider." An individual trained by a
- 23 <u>center for independent living to link an individual who is</u>
- 24 deafblind to their environment by:
- 25 (1) Guiding an individual who is deafblind.
- 26 (2) Facilitating communication between an individual who
- is deafblind and other individuals.
- 28 (3) Providing information to an individual who is
- 29 deafblind about their surroundings.
- 30 Section 2. Section 8 of the act is amended by adding a

2 Section 8. Grants and funding.

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4 (f) Existing centers for independent living.--

5 (1) The Department of Labor and Industry shall provide

6 grants to:

7 (i) Centers for independent living that provide

8 services to individuals who are deafblind. Grants shall

9 be used to provide assistance to an individual who is

10 deafblind who is working toward establishing and

11 maintaining independence.

(ii) Centers for independent living that train support service providers. Grants shall be used to provide the necessary training to become a support service provider in this Commonwealth.

(2) A grant under this subsection shall be in the amount of at least \$250,000. Beginning on the effective date of this subsection and annually thereafter, the minimum grant amount listed in this paragraph shall increase at the rate of inflation as outlined in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers in the Northeast Region for the most recent 12-month period for which the figures have been reported by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. If the rate of inflation does not increase, the minimum grant amount shall remain the same as it was for the
