AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, providing for computer science education; and abrogating a 5 6 7 regulation. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 11 12 section to read: 13 Section 1529. Computer Science Education. -- (a) The 14 Department of Education shall develop a State strategic plan for a Statewide computer science education program and present the 15 plan to the State Board of Education no later than July 1, 2026. 16 17 The following shall apply: 18 (1) The plan shall include at least the following: 19 (i) A statement of purpose that describes the objectives or

goals the board will accomplish by implementing a computer

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- 1 science education program, the strategies by which those goals
- 2 will be achieved and a timeline for achieving those goals.
- 3 (ii) A summary of the current State landscape for
- 4 <u>kindergarten through grade twelve computer science education</u>,
- 5 <u>including demographic reporting of students taking these</u>
- 6 <u>courses.</u>
- 7 (iii) A plan for expanding computer science education
- 8 opportunities to every school in this Commonwealth within five
- 9 (5) years and increasing the representation of students from
- 10 traditionally underserved groups in computer science, including
- 11 female students, students from historically underrepresented
- 12 racial and ethnic groups, students with disabilities, English-
- 13 <u>language learner students, low-income students and rural</u>
- 14 <u>students.</u>
- 15 <u>(iv) A plan for the development of rigorous standards and</u>
- 16 <u>curriculum guidelines for kindergarten through grade twelve</u>
- 17 computer science, including ways to incorporate computer science
- 18 into existing standards at the elementary level.
- 19 (v) A plan for defining high-quality professional learning
- 20 for teachers to begin teaching computer science.
- 21 (vi) An ongoing evaluation process that is overseen by the
- 22 State Board of Education.
- 23 (vii) Proposed rules that incorporate the principles of the
- 24 master plan into this Commonwealth's public education system as
- 25 a whole.
- 26 (viii) A plan to ensure long-term sustainability.
- 27 (2) Beginning with the 2027-2028 school year, and continuing
- 28 in each school year thereafter, each public high school shall
- 29 offer at least one computer science course.
- 30 (b) A computer science course or instruction in computer

- 1 <u>science offered by a public school or public charter school</u>
- 2 shall:
- 3 (1) Be of high quality, as defined by the State Board of
- 4 Education.
- 5 (2) Meet or exceed the standards and curriculum requirements
- 6 <u>established by the State Board of Education.</u>
- 7 (3) Permit a student to apply up to one credit earned for
- 8 <u>successful completion of the course to satisfy a mathematics or</u>
- 9 science credit requirement for graduation if the governing body
- 10 of the student's high school has discretion to determine the
- 11 graduation credit requirement to which the credit earned will
- 12 apply.
- 13 Section 2. The provisions of 22 Pa. Code § 57.31 are
- 14 abrogated insofar as they are inconsistent with the addition of
- 15 section 1529 of the act.
- 16 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
