## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Citizens Compensation Commission; providing for
- its powers and duties; and repealing provisions of the Public
- 3 Official Compensation Law.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Citizens
- 8 Compensation Commission Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Commission." The Citizens Compensation Commission
- 14 established by this act.
- 15 "Party officer." The term includes:
- 16 (1) A member of a national political party committee.
- 17 (2) A chairman, vice chairman, secretary, treasurer or
- 18 counsel of a State political party committee or member of the
- 19 executive committee of a State committee of a political

- 1 party.
- 2 (3) A county chairman, vice chairman, secretary,
- 3 treasurer or counsel of a county political party committee.
- 4 (4) A city chairman, vice chairman, secretary, treasurer
- or counsel of a city political party committee.
- 6 "Public official." The term includes:
- 7 (1) The Governor, Lieutenant Governor, a member of the
- 8 Governor's cabinet, Treasurer, Auditor General and Attorney
- 9 General of the Commonwealth.
- 10 (2) A member of the Senate or House of Representatives
- of the Commonwealth.
- 12 (3) An individual elected or appointed to any office of
- a county or municipality that directly receives a
- 14 distribution of revenue under this act.
- 15 (4) An individual elected or appointed to a department,
- agency, board, commission, authority or other governmental
- body not included in paragraph (1), (2) or (3) that directly
- 18 receives a distribution of revenue under this act.
- 19 (5) An individual elected or appointed to a department,
- agency, board, commission, authority, county, municipality or
- 21 other governmental body not included in paragraph (1), (2) or
- 22 (3) who has discretionary power that may influence or affect
- 23 the outcome of an action or decision and is involved in:
- (i) the development of regulation or policy relating
- 25 to a licensed entity; or
- 26 (ii) in other matters under this act.
- 27 The term does not include a member of a school board or an
- 28 individual who held an uncompensated office with a governmental
- 29 body prior to January 1, 2006, and who no longer holds the
- 30 office as of January 1, 2006. The term includes a member of an

- 1 advisory board or commission that makes recommendations relating
- 2 to a licensed facility.
- 3 Section 3. Commission established.
- 4 The Citizens Compensation Commission is established. The
- 5 commission shall annually determine the salary paid to members
- 6 of the General Assembly and the amount of additional
- 7 compensation to be paid to officers and leaders of the Senate
- 8 and House of Representatives.
- 9 Section 4. Membership.
- 10 (a) Appointment.--The commission shall consist of members
- 11 who must be residents of this Commonwealth and who shall be
- 12 appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall appoint:
- 13 (1) Two members who are representatives of labor
- 14 organizations.
- 15 (2) Two members who own or operate a small business.
- 16 (3) Two members who are individual taxpayers of this
- 17 Commonwealth.
- 18 (4) One member who is an executive level employee of a
- 19 large for-profit business entity.
- 20 (5) One member who is the director, officer or executive
- level employee of a nonprofit organization.
- 22 (6) Two members who are professionals in the field of
- employee compensation from different organizations.
- 24 (b) Ineligibility.--
- 25 (1) No person may be appointed a member of the
- 26 commission or be employed by or be an independent contractor
- of the commission if the person is, or has been within the
- 28 preceding 10 years, a public official or party officer in
- 29 this Commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions.
- 30 (2) (i) No member of the commission may participate in

- a hearing, proceeding or other matter in which the
- 2 member, or the immediate family thereof, has a financial
- 3 interest in the subject matter of the hearing or
- 4 proceeding or other interest that could be substantially
- 5 affected by the outcome of the hearing or proceeding.
- 6 (ii) For purposes of this paragraph, the term
- 7 "immediate family" shall mean spouse, parent, brother,
- 8 sister or child.
- 9 (c) Terms.--
- 10 (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (2), the
- 11 term of a member shall be three years, commencing July 1,
- 12 2016, and until the member's successor is appointed.
- 13 (2) Of the members first appointed to the commission,
- 14 the Governor shall designate three members to serve for three
- 15 years, three of the members to serve for two years and three
- of the members to serve for one year.
- 17 (d) Compensation and expenses.--Members of the commission
- 18 shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
- 19 mileage and actual expenses incurred in carrying out their
- 20 responsibilities under this act.
- 21 (e) Chairperson. -- The members of the commission shall elect
- 22 a member as chairperson of the commission.
- 23 (f) Action.--The concurrence of at least seven members shall
- 24 be required for formal commission action.
- 25 (g) Meetings. -- The chairperson shall call at least one
- 26 meeting per calendar year, no later than July 1.
- 27 Section 5. Establishment of salaries and additional
- compensation.
- 29 (a) General rule. -- The commission shall establish the salary
- 30 of members of the General Assembly and the amount of additional

- 1 compensation to be paid to officers and leaders of the Senate
- 2 and the House of Representatives for the period beginning
- 3 December 1 of the same calendar year and ending November 30 of
- 4 the subsequent calendar year.
- 5 (b) Limitation. -- The commission may not establish a salary
- 6 amount that is less than the salary amount established for the
- 7 immediately preceding period beginning December 1 and ending
- 8 November 30.
- 9 Section 6. Repeals.
- 10 Repeals are as follows:
- 11 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under
- paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate this act.
- 13 (2) Section 4 of the act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160,
- No.39), known as the Public Official Compensation Law, is
- 15 repealed.
- 16 Section 7. Applicability.
- 17 This act shall apply to any member of the General Assembly
- 18 whose term of office commences after the effective date of this
- 19 section.
- 20 Section 8. Effective date.
- 21 This act shall take effect immediately.
