## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, further 5 providing for Keystone Exams; and abrogating regulations. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 121 heading, (a), (b) (1) and (c) of the 10 act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, amended or added June 21, 2017 (P.L.200, 11 12 No.6) and November 6, 2017 (P.L.1142, No.55), are amended and 13 the section is amended by adding subsections to read: Section 121. Keystone Exams and Graduation Requirements .--14
- 15 The Department of Education shall develop and implement
- 16 Keystone Exams in algebra I, literature and biology. The State
- Board of Education shall promulgate and revise regulations, 17
- subject to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as 18
- the "Regulatory Review Act," necessary to implement this 19

- 1 section.
- 2 (b) The following shall apply:
- 3 (1) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 4 4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements), 4.51
- 5 (relating to State assessment system) or 4.51c (relating to
- 6 project-based assessment) or any statute [or], regulation or
- 7 <u>locally adopted or established ordinance, resolution or policy</u>
- 8 related to a requirement of a public school district, charter
- 9 school or cyber charter school, whether distinct or building
- 10 <u>level</u> to the contrary, [the use of] <u>beginning with the 2018-2019</u>
- 11 <u>school year</u>, the Keystone Exams <u>shall no longer be used</u> as a
- 12 graduation requirement or as a benchmark for the need for
- 13 participation in a project-based assessment [shall be delayed
- 14 until the 2019-2020 school year].
- 15 \* \* \*
- 16 (b.1) Each local school district shall have requirements for
- 17 <u>high school graduation which include locally established course</u>
- 18 completion and grade-based requirements for academic content
- 19 areas and a demonstration of proficiency in State academic
- 20 standards. Each local school district shall include in the
- 21 school district graduation requirements the alternative to
- 22 <u>demonstrate graduation readiness under subsection (c).</u>
- 23 (c) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 24 4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements) or 4.51
- 25 (relating to State assessment system) or any statute or
- 26 regulation to the contrary, in any school year in which a
- 27 demonstration of proficiency [on a Keystone Exam] in State
- 28 <u>academic standards</u> is required for high school graduation, a CTE
- 29 Concentrator shall be deemed proficient provided that the CTE
- 30 Concentrator shall meet all of the following requirements:

- 1 (1) completes locally established grade-based requirements
- 2 for academic content areas associated with each Keystone Exam on
- 3 which the CTE Concentrator did not achieve proficiency. For the
- 4 purposes of this paragraph, completion of grade-based
- 5 requirements in any science and technology and environment and
- 6 ecology course shall satisfy the requirements for the academic
- 7 content area associated with the Keystone Exam in biology; and
- 8 (2) completes one of the following:
- 9 (i) attains an industry-based competency certification
- 10 related to the CTE Concentrator's program of study; or
- 11 (ii) demonstrates a high likelihood of success on an
- 12 approved industry-based competency assessment or readiness for
- 13 continued meaningful engagement in the CTE Concentrator's
- 14 program of study as demonstrated by performance on benchmark
- 15 assessments, course grades and other factors consistent with the
- 16 CTE Concentrator's goals and career plan.
- 17 (c.1) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 18 <u>4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements) or 4.51</u>
- 19 <u>(relating to State assessment system) or any statute or</u>
- 20 regulation to the contrary, beginning with the 2018-2019 school
- 21 year, project-based assessments, as provided for in 22 Pa. Code
- 22 § 4.51c (relating to project-based assessment), and supplemental
- 23 instruction may not be required of any student. Supplemental
- 24 instruction may be offered within the guidance of the Department
- 25 of Education.
- 26 (c.2) Children with disabilities who satisfactorily complete
- 27 <u>a special education program developed by an individualized</u>
- 28 <u>education program team under the Individuals With Disabilities</u>
- 29 Education Act (Public Law 91-230, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq.) and
- 30 22 Pa. Code Ch. 14 (relating to special education services and

- 1 programs) shall be granted and issued a regular high school
- 2 <u>diploma by the school entity, if applicable. This subsection</u>
- 3 shall apply if the special education program of a child with a
- 4 <u>disability does not otherwise meet the requirements of this</u>
- 5 section.
- 6 (c.3) The Secretary of Education shall propose regulations
- 7 for promulgation by the State Board of Education to implement
- 8 the provisions of this section. A student who has achieved a
- 9 <u>score of proficient or advanced on a Keystone Exam may not be</u>
- 10 permitted to retake the exam.

- 12 Section 2. The provisions of 22 Pa. Code §§ 4.24, 4.51 and
- 13 4.51c are abrogated insofar as they are inconsistent with this
- 14 act.
- 15 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
