- 10 § 7391. Scope of subchapter.
- 11 This subchapter relates to the requirements of and incentives
- 12 for certification, training and education opportunities for
- 13 municipal firefighters and volunteer firefighters.
- 14 § 7392. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
- 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 "Board." The State Fire Advisory Board.
- 19 "Commissioner." The State Fire Commissioner.
- 20 "Fire company." A volunteer fire company, a municipal fire
- 21 company or department or a combined volunteer and municipal fire
- 22 company.
- 23 "Firefighter." An individual who is a municipal firefighter
- 24 or volunteer firefighter.
- 25 <u>"Firefighter level 1 certification." A certificate of</u>
- 26 completion provided to an individual who successfully
- 27 <u>demonstrates competency in performance of the duties of a</u>
- 28 firefighter at the first level of progression as identified by
- 29 the National Fire Protection Association, through the completion
- 30 of a fire or emergency service training program under direct

- 1 <u>supervision in hazardous conditions that is provided under</u>
- 2 <u>section 7383.1 (relating to curriculum, training and education</u>
- 3 certification management system) and issued for demonstration of
- 4 the individual's knowledge and skills to function as an integral
- 5 member of a firefighting team that meets or exceeds the
- 6 requirements of the National Fire Protection Association.
- 7 <u>"Fund." The Municipal and Volunteer Firefighter Training and</u>
- 8 Education Incentive Fund established under section 7399(a)
- 9 (relating to Municipal and Volunteer Firefighter Training and
- 10 Education Incentive Fund).
- "Immediately dangerous to life or health" or "IDLH." With
- 12 respect to a fire and emergency service, involving any of the
- 13 <u>following:</u>
- 14 (1) A concentration of airborne contaminants, normally
- 15 <u>expressed in parts per million or milligrams per cubic meter,</u>
- 16 which represents the maximum level from which an individual
- 17 could escape within 30 minutes without any escape-impairing
- 18 symptoms or irreversible health effects.
- 19 (2) A condition that would pose an immediate or delayed
- 20 threat to life, cause irreversible adverse health effects or
- 21 interfere with an individual's ability to escape unaided from
- 22 <u>a hazardous environment.</u>
- 23 "Municipal firefighter." An individual who:
- 24 (1) is hired by a municipal fire company; and
- 25 (2) receives pay, salary, compensation or other
- 26 consideration of value for participating in the fire service
- and activities of the municipal fire company.
- 28 "Municipality." A county, city, borough, incorporated town
- 29 <u>or township.</u>
- 30 "Program." The Municipal and Volunteer Firefighter Training

- 1 and Education Incentive Program established under section
- 2 7398(a) (relating to Municipal and Volunteer Firefighter
- 3 Training and Education Incentive Program).
- 4 "Qualified expenses." As follows:
- 5 (1) Expenses that are actually and necessarily incurred
- for attending and successfully completing training and
- 7 <u>education prescribed under section 7383.1.</u>
- 8 <u>(2) The term includes expenses for:</u>
- 9 <u>(i) Tuition and fees.</u>
- 10 (ii) Required textbooks and learning materials.
- 11 (iii) Required curriculum or instructional materials
- 12 <u>required to administer curriculum.</u>
- 13 <u>(iv) Required computer hardware and computer</u>
- 14 <u>software associated with instruction.</u>
- 15 <u>(v) Transportation related to participation in</u>
- 16 <u>required training and education activities and other</u>
- 17 valid educational expenses approved by the board.
- 18 "Volunteer fire company." A nonprofit chartered corporation,
- 19 association or organization located in this Commonwealth which
- 20 provides fire protection or rescue services and which may offer
- 21 other voluntary emergency services within this Commonwealth.
- 22 "Volunteer firefighter." An individual who:
- 23 (1) is a member of a fire company organized and existing
- 24 under the laws of this Commonwealth; and
- 25 (2) is unpaid and does not receive pay, salary,
- 26 compensation or other consideration of value for
- 27 <u>participating in the fire service and activities of the fire</u>
- 28 company.
- 29 § 7393. Guidelines.
- 30 (a) Authorization. -- The board, in consultation with the

- 1 commissioner, shall coordinate, assist and establish guidelines,
- 2 <u>as needed</u>, to provide access to the training and education
- 3 certification management system established under section 7383.1
- 4 (relating to curriculum, training and education certification
- 5 management system) and facilitate the prompt implementation of
- 6 <u>this subchapter</u>.
- 7 (b) Contents. -- The guidelines developed under this section
- 8 for a fire company to incorporate when establishing its
- 9 firefighting services team shall provide, at a minimum, the
- 10 <u>following:</u>
- 11 (1) That each firefighter hired, or enrolled in the case
- of a volunteer firefighter, by a fire company shall have the
- 13 <u>required certification, training and education necessary for</u>
- 14 <u>the position.</u>
- 15 (2) Each position of activity or services that a
- firefighter may hold with a fire company and the
- 17 certification, training and education level required for the
- 18 position.
- 19 (3) That unless otherwise provided in this subchapter, a
- fire company is prohibited from hiring, or enrolling in the
- 21 case of a volunteer firefighter, for any position for
- firefighting activities or services, a firefighter who does
- 23 not hold at least a firefighter level 1 certification or
- 24 equivalent required training as applicable.
- 25 § 7394. Firefighter training and education.
- 26 (a) Completion and certification. -- A firefighter hired, or
- 27 <u>enrolled in the case of a volunteer firefighter, by a fire</u>
- 28 company on or after the effective date of this subsection shall
- 29 <u>successfully complete the training and education program</u>
- 30 established under section 7383.1 (relating to curriculum,

- 1 training and education certification management system) as a
- 2 requirement of employment or enrollment with the fire company.
- 3 The following apply:
- 4 (1) The fire company shall require, at a minimum, that
- 5 <u>the firefighter provide a certification of completion of the</u>
- 6 <u>program of firefighter level 1 under section 7383.1 issued</u>
- 7 for the demonstration of knowledge and skills to function as
- 8 <u>an integral member of a firefighting team under direct</u>
- 9 <u>supervision in hazardous conditions, prior to hiring or</u>
- 10 enrolling the individual as a member of the fire company.
- 11 (2) If the firefighter seeks a position in the fire
- 12 <u>company that is not subject to certification, such as in the</u>
- case of a position with a municipal fire company or
- 14 <u>department that does not require a firefighter level 1</u>
- certification or other certification but instead requires the
- successful completion of other training or course work, the
- fire company shall require proof of successful completion of
- 18 the training or course work.
- 19 (b) Time period. -- Unless a firefighter is granted additional
- 20 time to complete the required training, a firefighter hired, or
- 21 enrolled in the case of a volunteer firefighter, on or after the
- 22 effective date of this subsection, shall be given one year to
- 23 become certified or otherwise meet the training requirements
- 24 before a municipal firefighter becomes ineligible to receive
- 25 pay, salary, compensation or other consideration of value from a
- 26 fire company or a volunteer firefighter becomes ineligible to be
- 27 enrolled with a fire company.
- 28 (c) Permissible and prohibited activities. --
- 29 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), a fire company
- 30 shall not be prohibited by this subchapter from:

Τ	(1) Hiring a noncertified individual for a position
2	that is not defined within the training and education
3	certification management system unless otherwise required
4	<pre>by law.</pre>
5	(ii) Establishing apprenticeship and internship
6	positions, programs or other similar opportunities for
7	training and education leading to certification while on
8	the job, whether developed by the fire company, the
9	commissioner, the Department of Education or an
10	independent entity specializing in firefighter
11	<pre>certification.</pre>
12	(2) Except for training purposes, an uncertified
13	individual is expressly prohibited from entering an IDLH
14	atmosphere and actively fighting any type of fire in the IDLH
15	atmosphere, regardless of whether the IDLH atmosphere is
16	contained within a structure or exists outside a structure.
17	§ 7395. Database.
18	(a) Development of form The board, in consultation with
19	the commissioner, shall develop a standardized form for each
20	fire company to use to provide the certification, training and
21	education level of each firefighter at the fire company.
22	(b) Contents of form The information collected under the
23	form under subsection (a) shall include, at a minimum, the
24	<pre>following:</pre>
25	(1) The name of each firefighter at the fire company.
26	(2) The level of certification, training and education
27	successfully completed by each firefighter at the fire
28	company.
29	(3) The institution or training facility where the
30	certification, training and education of each firefighter at

- 1 <u>the fire company occurred.</u>
- 2 (c) Submittal of form. -- Each fire company shall submit a
- 3 completed form under this section to the board with the
- 4 <u>following information regarding firefighters at the fire</u>
- 5 company:
- 6 (1) Firefighters employed, or enrolled in the case of
- 7 <u>volunteer firefighters at the fire company, before the</u>
- 8 <u>effective date of this paragraph. The fire company shall</u>
- 9 <u>submit this information within 30 days of the effective date</u>
- of this paragraph.
- 11 (2) Each firefighter hired, or enrolled in the case of a
- 12 <u>volunteer firefighter, on or after the effective date of this</u>
- 13 paragraph. The fire company shall submit this information
- within 30 days of the hiring or enrollment of the
- 15 firefighter.
- 16 (d) Update of information. -- Each fire company shall update
- 17 the information provided under this section, in a form and
- 18 manner determined by the board, within 10 days of a change
- 19 regarding certification, training and education of a firefighter
- 20 at the fire company.
- 21 (e) Retention of information. -- The board shall retain the
- 22 information provided under this section in an electronic
- 23 searchable database.
- 24 § 7396. Participation in fire company.
- 25 (a) Prohibitions.--Except as provided in subsections (b) and
- 26 (c) and unless permitted by this subchapter or as provided in
- 27 guidelines established by the board, the following apply:
- 28 (1) An individual who does not fulfill the requirements
- of this subchapter may not serve as a firefighter.
- 30 (2) A fire company may not pay, provide a salary,

- 1 <u>compensation or other consideration of value or, in the case</u>
- of a volunteer firefighter, enroll as a member for
- 3 participation in fire service or activities a firefighter who
- 4 <u>fails to meet the requirements of this subchapter.</u>
- 5 (b) Exception if certification not required. -- A fire company
- 6 may hire, pay, provide a salary, compensation or other
- 7 consideration of value or, in the case of a volunteer
- 8 <u>firefighter</u>, enroll as a member in the fire company a
- 9 <u>firefighter for a position that does not require certification</u>
- 10 <u>under section 7383.1</u> (relating to curriculum, training and
- 11 education certification management system).
- 12 (c) Exception for junior firefighter.--This subchapter shall
- 13 not restrict a fire company from permitting participation in
- 14 firefighter activities by a junior firefighter who is 18 years
- 15 of age or older.
- 16 § 7397. Penalties.
- 17 (a) Municipal fire company. -- An official of a municipality
- 18 with a fire company who orders, authorizes or pays a salary to
- 19 an individual in violation of the provisions of this subchapter
- 20 commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be
- 21 sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 or be imprisoned
- 22 for a term of not more than 30 days.
- 23 (b) Volunteer fire company. -- An individual acting or under a
- 24 duty to act for a volunteer fire company who orders, authorizes
- 25 or enrolls an individual as a member of the volunteer fire
- 26 company in violation of the provisions of this subchapter
- 27 commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be
- 28 sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 or be imprisoned
- 29 for a term of not more than 30 days.
- 30 (c) Individual acting or under duty to act.--For purposes of

## 1 this section:

- 2 (1) An individual is legally accountable for conduct
- 3 performed, or caused to be performed, by the individual under
- 4 this subchapter in the name of a volunteer fire company or on
- 5 <u>its behalf to the same extent as if the conduct were</u>
- 6 performed, or caused to be performed, in the individual's own
- 7 name or on the individual's own behalf.
- 8 (2) If a duty to act is imposed under this subchapter
- 9 <u>upon a volunteer fire company, an agent of the volunteer fire</u>
- 10 company having primary responsibility for the discharge of
- 11 <u>the duty is legally accountable for a reckless omission to</u>
- 12 perform the required act to the same extent as if the duty
- were imposed by law directly upon the agent.
- 14 (3) If an individual is convicted of an offense by
- reason of the individual's legal accountability for the
- 16 conduct of a volunteer fire company under this section, the
- individual is subject to the sentence authorized by law when
- 18 a natural person is convicted of an offense of the grade and
- 19 the degree involved.
- 20 § 7398. Municipal and Volunteer Firefighter Training and
- 21 Education Incentive Program.
- 22 (a) Establishment and purposes. -- The Municipal and Volunteer
- 23 Firefighter Training and Education Incentive Program is
- 24 established to:
- 25 (1) Provide assistance in the form of grants for
- 26 certification, training and education.
- 27 (2) Promote excellency in firefighter services.
- 28 (3) Incentivize improvement of firefighters through
- 29 <u>training and education.</u>
- 30 (4) Support the recruitment of firefighters.

- 1 (5) Provide assistance for certified firefighters to
- become fire service instructors.
- 3 (b) Administration. -- The board shall administer the program.
- 4 (c) Eligibility for firefighters generally. -- A resident of
- 5 this Commonwealth who is a municipal firefighter or volunteer
- 6 firefighter is eligible to receive a grant under the program, in
- 7 <u>accordance with this subchapter</u>, if in the year that the
- 8 <u>firefighter applies for a grant under the program, the</u>
- 9 <u>firefighter:</u>
- 10 (1) was hired or enrolled as a member of a fire company;
- 11 <u>or</u>
- 12 (2) successfully completes training and education under
- 13 <u>section 7383.1 (relating to curriculum, training and</u>
- 14 <u>education certification management system).</u>
- 15 (d) Eliqibility for fire service instructors. -- A certified
- 16 firefighter is eligible to receive a grant under the program, in
- 17 accordance with this subchapter, if, in the year the certified
- 18 firefighter applies for a grant under the program, the certified
- 19 firefighter successfully completes training to become a fire
- 20 service instructor.
- 21 (e) Powers and duties of board.--The board shall:
- 22 (1) Implement and administer the program.
- 23 (2) Identify expenses that are qualified expenses under
- the program or, in the case of a certified firefighter,
- 25 <u>expenses that are reimbursable for training to become a fire</u>
- 26 service instructor.
- 27 (3) Identify acceptable forms of proof of purchase
- 28 required for each qualified expense under the program or, in
- 29 <u>the case of a certified firefighter, expenses that are</u>
- reimbursable for training to become a fire service

Τ	instructor.
2	(4) Develop an application and an application process
3	for the program, which shall include the following:
4	(i) The name and contact information of the
5	<u>firefighter.</u>
6	(ii) The name of the fire company at which the
7	firefighter is hired or enrolled.
8	(iii) The qualified expenses or other expenses for
9	which a grant is sought.
10	(iv) The entity providing the certification,
11	training or education.
12	(v) Proof of eligibility for a grant under the
13	program.
14	(5) Establish an evaluation process and guidelines for
15	the program.
16	(6) To the extent that program money is available, award
17	grants to:
18	(i) Each firefighter meeting the requirements of
19	subsection (c)(1), to be awarded on a pro rata basis. The
20	board shall set a deadline for the submittal of
21	applications under the program as a means to determine
22	the pro rata amount of the grant that an applicant could
23	be awarded.
24	(ii) Each firefighter meeting the requirements of
25	subsection (c)(2) in an amount equal to the applicant's
26	qualified expenses remaining after subtraction of the
27	amount of any Federal grant, State grant or other
28	scholarship or grant that the individual receives, but in
29	no case shall the grant awarded under the program exceed
30	\$1,000 per educational course or training course

1	successfully completed by the firefighter.
2	(iii) Each certified firefighter meeting the
3	requirements of subsection (d), to be awarded on a pro
4	rata basis. The board shall set a deadline for the
5	submittal of applications under the program as a means to
6	determine the pro rata amount of the grant that an
7	applicant could be awarded.
8	(7) Post the processes for the program and a listing of
9	the expenses identified as qualified training and education
10	expenses on the publicly accessible Internet website of the
11	board.
12	(8) Perform all other functions necessary to carry out
13	the program.
14	(f) Other limitations
15	(1) A firefighter is limited to a one-time award of a
16	grant under subsection (c)(1). An applicant receiving a grant
17	under subsection (c)(1) may not be awarded a second grant
18	under subsection (c) at any subsequent time.
19	(2) A firefighter receiving a grant under subsection (c)
20	may also receive a one-time award of a grant under subsection
21	<u>(d).</u>
22	(3) A grant awarded under the program shall not be for
23	an amount in excess of 10% of money available in the fund.
24	§ 7399. Municipal and Volunteer Firefighter Training and
25	Education Incentive Fund.
26	(a) Establishment and purpose The Municipal and Volunteer
27	Firefighter Training and Education Incentive Fund is established
28	as a nonlapsing fund in the State Treasury for the purpose of
29	providing grants under the program.
30	(b) Initial appropriation For the 2023-2024 fiscal year,

- 1 the General Assembly shall appropriate for deposit into the fund
- 2 \$5,000,000 for the purpose of implementing, administering and
- 3 providing grants under the program.
- 4 (c) Fund sources. -- The board may solicit and accept
- 5 alternative funding for the program, including Federal money,
- 6 State appropriations, grants, donations, gifts and other
- 7 payments from any source. Money for the program shall be
- 8 deposited into the fund.
- 9 <u>(d) Appropriations.--</u>
- 10 (1) All money deposited into the fund and interest and
- other earnings on the money in the fund are appropriated to
- 12 <u>the board on a continuing basis to award grants under the</u>
- program.
- 14 (2) Any appropriation by the General Assembly to the
- fund shall be in addition to any appropriation made to the
- 16 board.
- 17 (e) Operation. -- Any money remaining in the fund at the end
- 18 of each fiscal year, including interest and other earnings,
- 19 shall not revert to the General Fund but shall remain in the
- 20 fund.
- 21 (f) Administrative expenses. -- The board may use up to 3% of
- 22 available money in the fund for administrative expenses
- 23 associated with the program.
- 24 (g) Allocation. -- Beginning in fiscal year 2023-2024 and each
- 25 fiscal year thereafter, the sum appropriated annually by the
- 26 General Assembly, along with any Federal or State money received
- 27 for the program, shall be allocated as follows:
- 28 (1) Forty percent of the sum shall be allocated for
- 29 grants for the purpose specified under section 7398(c)(1)
- 30 (relating to Municipal and Volunteer Firefighter Training and

- 1 Education Incentive Program). If money allocated under this
- 2 paragraph remains after the close of the application period
- 3 <u>and award of grants under section 7398(c)(1), any remaining</u>
- 4 <u>money shall be available to increase the percentage of money</u>
- 5 <u>allocated for grants for the purpose specified under section</u>
- 6 <u>7398(c)(2).</u>
- 7 (2) Sixty percent of the sum shall be allocated for
- 8 grants for the purpose specified under section 7398(c)(2).
- 9 § 7399.1. Reports.
- 10 (a) Requirement. -- On or before the date that is one year
- 11 after the effective date of this paragraph, and each year
- 12 thereafter, the board shall issue a report on the program.
- (b) Contents. -- Each report under subsection (a) shall
- 14 <u>contain the following:</u>
- 15 (1) The number of firefighters applying for grants under
- the program.
- 17 (2) The number of grants approved and denied, in whole
- or in part, under the program.
- 19 (3) The nature of the grants awarded under the program,
- in terms of certification, training or education or regarding
- 21 training to become a fire service instructor.
- 22 (4) The amount of each grant awarded under the program.
- 23 (5) The name of each firefighter awarded a grant under
- 24 the program, along with the fire company at which the
- 25 firefighter was hired or enrolled.
- 26 (6) The money remaining in the fund.
- 27 (7) Any recommendations on improving the program.
- 28 (c) Submittal.--Each report under this section shall be
- 29 submitted to the following:
- 30 (1) The Governor.

- 1 <u>(2) The commissioner.</u>
- 2 (3) The Secretary of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 3 (4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 4 <u>Health and Human Services Committee of the Senate.</u>
- 5 (5) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 6 <u>Health Committee of the House of Representatives.</u>
- 7 § 7399.2. Construction.
- 8 This subchapter shall not be construed to exempt a municipal
- 9 <u>firefighter from the provisions of the existing civil service</u>
- 10 <u>laws or laws relating to tenure.</u>
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
