17	the following day and can restore service consistent with
18	section 1407 (relating to reconnection of service).

Repeals are as follows: 4 (1) The General Assembly finds and declares that the 5 6 repeal under paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of 66 Pa.C.S. § 1419. 7 Section 5 of the act of November 30, 2004 (P.L.1578, 8 (2)9 No.201), entitled "An act amending Title 66 (Public 10 Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further defining 'common carrier by motor vehicle'; providing for 11 consumer protection and information and for the protection of 12 responsible customer of public utilities; abrogating 13 14 regulations; and preempting local regulation," is repealed. 15 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
