AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled 1 "An act relating to the finances of the State government; 2 providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for 3 ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint 4 Underwriting Association, for entertainment business 5 financial management firms, for private dam financial 6 assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for 7 the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, 8 9 bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and other money or property 10 due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 11 including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, 12 the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds 13 and securities belonging to or in the possession of the 14 Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the 15 Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the 16 courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the 17 Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and 18 19 all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 20 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, 21 22 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes 23 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of 24 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of 25 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every 26 department, board, commission, and officer of the State 27 government, every political subdivision of the State, and 28 29 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, 30 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws 31 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or 32 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 33

1 2 3 4 5	every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the Commonwealth," in emergency COVID-19 response, providing for reimbursement payment for certification as emergency medical services personnel and establishing the Emergency Medical Services Certification Program.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Article I-C of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343,
9	No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding a
10	section to read:
11	Section 151-C. Emergency Medical Services Certification
12	Program.
13	(a) Use of fundsFrom money appropriated to the department
14	for COVID Relief - Emergency Medical Services Certification
15	Program, \$3,000,000 shall be allocated to the bureau and shall
16	be used to make payments under this section.
17	(b) Establishment of programThe Emergency Medical
18	Services Certification Program is established in the bureau as a
19	<u>Statewide program.</u>
20	(c) Purpose of programThe program shall receive
21	applications and award reimbursement payments to applicants who
22	successfully attain any of the following certifications after
23	the effective date of this section:
24	(1) Emergency medical responder.
25	(2) Emergency medical technician.
26	(3) Advanced emergency medical technician.
27	(4) Paramedic.
28	(d) ApplicationThe bureau shall develop an application
29	for an applicant to apply for a reimbursement payment within 30
30	days of the applicant successfully completing a certification
31	listed in subsection (c). The application shall be made
32	available and posted on the department's publicly accessible

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1	Internet website and shall be in a form that can be completed	
2	electronically or through the United States mail.	
3	(e) GuidelinesThe bureau shall establish guidelines that	
4	are consistent with the provisions of this section within 30	
5	days of the effective date of this section. The guidelines shall	
6	<u>be:</u>	
7	(1) Transmitted as a notice to the Legislative Reference	
8	Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.	
9	(2) Posted on the bureau's publicly accessible Internet	
10	website.	
11	(f) Program requirementsAn applicant may be eligible for	
12	a reimbursement payment under this section provided that the	
13	applicant submits the following to the department:	
14	(1) Within 30 days of completion, proof of successful	
15	emergency medical services certification.	
16	(2) A copy of the invoice, receipt or proof of payment	
17	to an emergency medical services education institution	
18	located in this Commonwealth.	
19	(3) The application form developed under subsection (d).	
20	(g) Reimbursement limitThe bureau may award a	
21	reimbursement payment to an applicant not to exceed the	
22	applicant's cost of certification.	
23	(h) AwardThe bureau shall award reimbursement payments	
24	under this section no later than two months after the receipt of	
25	a completed application. The bureau shall ensure that	
26	reimbursement payments are made available to all geographic	
27	areas of this Commonwealth.	
28	(i) ExpirationThis section shall expire after the money	
29	allocated to the bureau under subsection (a) has been exhausted.	
30	The department shall transmit notice of the date that the money	
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1	is exhausted to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication
2	<u>in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
3	(j) IneligibilityAn applicant who has already received a
4	reimbursement payment for certification under this section shall
5	be ineligible to participate in the program again.
6	(k) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
7	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
8	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
9	"Applicant." A Commonwealth resident who has submitted an
10	application for a reimbursement payment under the program.
11	"Bureau." The Bureau of Emergency Medical Services within
12	the department.
13	"Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
14	"Program." The Emergency Medical Services Certification
15	Program established under this section.
16	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
