AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," establishing the Nellie Bly 5 Scholarship Program and the Nellie Bly Scholarship Program 6 Restricted Account. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 11 12 article to read: 13 ARTICLE XX-L 14 NELLIE BLY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM Section 2001-L. Definitions. 15 16 The following words and phrases when used in this article 17 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 18 context clearly indicates otherwise: 19 "Academic year." One complete school year, usually nine months in length, commencing on or after August 1 of the 20

- 1 calendar year.
- 2 "College completion award." Funding provided by the
- 3 department to a community college participating in the program
- 4 for wraparound services to scholarship recipients, including the
- 5 <u>hiring of college navigators, mental health supports, tutoring</u>
- 6 and other services deemed necessary by the community college to
- 7 <u>support scholarship recipients' completion of their course of</u>
- 8 study.
- 9 "Community college." A public college or technical institute
- 10 established and operated in accordance with the provisions of
- 11 this act by a local sponsor that provides:
- 12 <u>(1) a two-year, postsecondary, college-parallel,</u>
- 13 <u>terminal-general</u>, terminal-technical, out-of-school youth or
- 14 <u>adult education program or any combination of these programs;</u>
- 15 or
- 16 (2) area career and technical education services and
- 17 credit, nonremedial college courses to secondary senior high
- 18 school students.
- 19 "Cost of attendance." The direct and indirect costs relating
- 20 to attendance at an institution, including tuition and fees,
- 21 cost of room and board or living expenses, cost of books,
- 22 supplies, transportation, loan fees and miscellaneous expenses,
- 23 including a reasonable amount for the documented cost of a
- 24 personal computer, allowance for child care or other dependent
- 25 care, costs related to a disability and reasonable costs for
- 26 eligible study-abroad programs.
- 27 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 28 Commonwealth.
- 29 "Eligible student." An individual who meets the eligibility
- 30 criteria stated in section 2006-L.

- 1 <u>"FAFSA." The Free Application for Federal Student Aid.</u>
- 2 <u>"Financial aid."</u> Funding to help pay for postsecondary
- 3 education, including grants, work study, loans and scholarships.
- 4 "Full-time enrollment." Enrollment of twelve or more
- 5 <u>undergraduate credits in an academic semester or the equivalent.</u>
- 6 <u>"Funding award." An award of program funds from the Nellie</u>
- 7 Bly Scholarship Program Restricted Account made by the
- 8 <u>department to PHEAA to fund scholarship awards.</u>
- 9 <u>"Institutional aid." Financial aid offered to an eligible</u>
- 10 student directly by an institution which shall include merit
- 11 aid, gift aid and athletic awards.
- 12 <u>"Participating institution." A community college established</u>
- 13 <u>under Article XIX-A or a State-owned university in the</u>
- 14 <u>Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.</u>
- 15 <u>"Pell Grant." The Federal Pell Grant or any successor</u>
- 16 program to it.
- 17 "PHEAA." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 18 Agency.
- 19 "Private scholarship." Financial aid awards funded by
- 20 entities other than the Federal or State government, including
- 21 awards by companies, service groups, foundations, organizations
- 22 and individuals.
- 23 "Program." The Nellie Bly Scholarship Program established
- 24 under section 2002-L.
- 25 "Program administration agreement." An agreement by and
- 26 between the department and PHEAA that specifies the duties and
- 27 <u>responsibilities of PHEAA as administrator of the program and</u>
- 28 such other terms and conditions deemed necessary by the
- 29 <u>department for the administration of the program.</u>
- 30 "Program participation agreement." An agreement by and

- 1 between the department and an institution that specifies the
- 2 duties of the institution as a participant in the program and
- 3 <u>such other terms and conditions deemed necessary by the</u>
- 4 <u>department for program participation</u>.
- 5 <u>"Promissory note." A legal agreement between a scholarship</u>
- 6 recipient and the department detailing the recipient's rights
- 7 and responsibilities and terms and conditions for repayment.
- 8 "Restricted account." The Nellie Bly Scholarship Program
- 9 Restricted Account established under section 2002-L.
- 10 "Scholarship agreement." The written agreement between the
- 11 <u>department and a scholarship recipient under which a scholarship</u>
- 12 <u>award is made.</u>
- 13 "Scholarship award." An award of program money made by the
- 14 <u>department to an eligible student toward the cost of attendance.</u>
- 15 <u>"Scholarship recipient."</u> An eligible student who is awarded
- 16 <u>a scholarship award.</u>
- 17 Section 2002-L. Nellie Bly Scholarship Program.
- 18 (a) Establishment. -- The Nellie Bly Scholarship Program is_
- 19 established in the department.
- 20 (b) Nellie Bly Scholarship Program Restricted Account. --
- 21 (1) The Nellie Bly Scholarship Program Restricted
- Account is established in the State Treasury. The money in
- 23 the restricted account is appropriated on a continuing basis
- 24 to the department for the purposes specified in this article.
- 25 (2) The restricted account shall consist of money
- transferred, appropriated or otherwise made available to the
- 27 restricted account.
- 28 (3) Money in the restricted account shall be allocated
- 29 as follows:
- 30 (i) The department may use up to 4% of the money in

1	the restricted account to administer the program, in
2	cooperation with PHEAA, and to administer the college
3	<pre>completion awards.</pre>
4	(ii) The department may use up to 3% of the money in
5	the restricted account for college completion awards.
6	(iii) The remaining money in the restricted account
7	shall be allocated as a funding award to PHEAA to make
8	scholarship awards to eligible students.
9	(c) Condition on use of restricted account The allocations
10	specified in subsection (b) shall be expended only to the extent
11	money is available in the restricted account.
12	Section 2003-L. Powers and duties of department.
13	(a) Program administration
14	(1) The department shall enter into a program
15	administration agreement with PHEAA.
16	(2) The department shall develop the form of scholarship
17	agreement and promissory note to be used when awarding a
18	scholarship award.
19	(b) Audits, reviews and data collection The department may
20	conduct such audits, reviews and data collection of the
21	scholarship awards of PHEAA and the participating institutions
22	as the department determines to be necessary or appropriate.
23	(c) Regulations The department shall promulgate
24	regulations as necessary to implement, administer and enforce
25	this article.
26	(d) Temporary regulations
27	(1) In order to facilitate the prompt implementation of
28	this article, the department shall promulgate temporary
29	regulations that shall expire not later than three years
30	following the effective date of this section. The temporary

- 1 <u>regulations shall not be subject to:</u>
- 2 <u>(i) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act</u>
- 3 of July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the
- 4 <u>Commonwealth Documents Law.</u>
- 5 <u>(ii) Section 204(b) of the act of October 15, 1980</u>
- 6 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys
- 7 <u>Act.</u>
- 8 <u>(iii) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181),</u>
- 9 <u>known as the Regulatory Review Act.</u>
- 10 (2) The department shall transmit the temporary
- 11 <u>regulations under paragraph (1) to the Legislative Reference</u>
- 12 <u>Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
- (e) Guidelines.--The department shall develop written
- 14 quidelines, in consultation with the participating institutions
- 15 and PHEAA, for the implementation of this article.
- (f) Annual report to General Assembly. -- The department shall
- 17 prepare and submit a report to the Governor and the General
- 18 Assembly no later than September 30 of each year the funding is
- 19 provided under the program. The report shall include the number
- 20 of scholarship recipients, programs of study pursued and
- 21 graduation rates and award type, disaggregated by institution
- 22 and student group, and activities and outcomes conducted in
- 23 <u>accordance with the college completion grants.</u>
- 24 Section 2004-L. Powers and duties of PHEAA.
- 25 (a) Administration of program. -- PHEAA shall administer the
- 26 program in accordance with the program administration agreement.
- 27 (b) Specific powers and duties. -- The powers and duties of
- 28 PHEAA under the program include the following:
- 29 (1) To enter into a program administration agreement
- 30 with the department.

- 1 (2) To prepare reports and compile program data as
- 2 requested by the department in a form and manner as
- 3 prescribed by the department.
- 4 (3) To perform other duties and responsibilities needed
- 5 for the administration of the program as determined by the
- 6 <u>department</u>.
- 7 <u>Section 2005-L. Duties of participating institutions.</u>
- 8 (a) Agreement with department. -- An institution shall enter
- 9 into a program participation agreement with the department.
- 10 (b) Specific powers and duties. -- The powers and duties of a
- 11 participating institution under the program shall include the
- 12 <u>following:</u>
- 13 <u>(1) To prepare reports and compile program data as</u>
- 14 <u>requested by the department in a form and manner as</u>
- 15 <u>prescribed by the department. The Pennsylvania State System</u>
- of Higher Education may prepare the reports and compile the
- data on behalf of its institutions.
- 18 (2) To perform other program participation duties and
- 19 responsibilities as determined by the department.
- 20 Section 2006-L. Eligible scholarship recipients.
- 21 (a) Initial eligibility requirements. -- To receive an initial
- 22 scholarship award, an individual must meet all of the following
- 23 eligibility requirements:
- (1) Graduate from high school or earn a high school
- 25 equivalency credential or the equivalent.
- 26 (2) Receive acceptance and matriculate as a degree-
- 27 <u>seeking student at a participating institution.</u>
- 28 (3) Be working toward a first undergraduate associate's
- degree or a first baccalaureate degree.
- 30 (4) Maintain full-time enrollment per semester in an

- 1 undergraduate degree program at a participating institution.
- 2 (5) Complete the FAFSA or alternative financial aid form
- 3 approved by the department.
- 4 (6) Have a household income equal to or less than 400%
- 5 <u>of the Federal poverty level for a family of four as stated</u>
- in the poverty guidelines issued annually by the United
- 7 <u>States Department of Health and Human Services each year.</u>
- 8 (7) Maintain standards of academic progress as
- 9 <u>determined by regulations of the department.</u>
- 10 (b) Renewal eligibility requirements. -- To receive a renewal
- 11 of an initial scholarship award, an individual shall meet all
- 12 <u>the following requirements:</u>
- 13 (1) Complete the FAFSA or alternative financial aid form
- approved by the department annually.
- 15 (2) Have a household income equal to or less than 400%
- of the Federal poverty level for a family of four as
- specified in the poverty guidelines issued annually by the
- 18 United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- 19 (3) Maintain full-time enrollment per semester in an
- 20 undergraduate associate's degree or baccalaureate degree
- 21 program at a participating institution.
- 22 (4) Maintain standards of academic progress as
- 23 determined by the department in regulations.
- 24 (5) Create an account on the CareerLink system prior to
- 25 graduation to connect with employment opportunities in
- 26 Pennsylvania.
- 27 (c) Documentation required. -- An eligible student must enter
- 28 <u>into a scholarship agreement and promissory note with the</u>
- 29 <u>department for each year the student receives a scholarship</u>
- 30 award. Each year the eligible student receives a scholarship

- 1 award, the eligible student must reaffirm the intention to
- 2 reside in this Commonwealth upon graduation.
- 3 (d) Priority.--Eligible students pursuing programs of study
- 4 <u>in health care</u>, education and public service shall be given
- 5 priority when initial and renewal scholarship awards are made.
- 6 (e) Default. -- A scholarship recipient shall repay the full
- 7 amount of the scholarship award received without interest if the
- 8 recipient fails to reside in this Commonwealth for a period of
- 9 4.5 months for each semester, or the equivalent the scholarship
- 10 recipient received a scholarship award. This requirement shall
- 11 commence upon completion of an undergraduate degree program or
- 12 upon termination of enrollment at a participating institution,
- 13 whichever occurs first. If a scholarship recipient transfers
- 14 from one participating institution to another participating
- 15 institution, the transfer shall not be considered as a
- 16 termination of enrollment.
- 17 (f) Deferral of residency requirement. -- Notwithstanding
- 18 subsection (e), the department may defer the Commonwealth
- 19 <u>residency requirement for an eligible student under the</u>
- 20 following circumstances:
- 21 (1) Full-time enrollment in a baccalaureate degree
- 22 program or a graduate degree program within six months of
- 23 <u>receipt of an undergraduate degree from a participating</u>
- institution. The recipient shall provide PHEAA with
- documentation of the student's continual status as a graduate
- 26 student on a half-time basis.
- 27 (2) Other extenuating circumstances as determined by the
- 28 Secretary of Education.
- 29 (g) Notice of change to department. -- A scholarship recipient
- 30 shall inform the department of a change in the recipient's

- 1 permanent address within 30 days of the effective date of the
- 2 change.
- 3 (h) Forgiveness of repayment. -- Repayment shall not be
- 4 <u>required under the following circumstances:</u>
- 5 (1) The scholarship recipient enlists in the Armed
- 6 <u>Forces or National Guard.</u>
- 7 (2) The scholarship recipient is deceased or is
- 8 <u>permanently and totally disabled.</u>
- 9 (3) Other extenuating circumstances as determined by the
- 10 <u>Secretary of Education.</u>
- 11 Section 2007-L. Refund of scholarship award by institution.
- 12 <u>A scholarship award to an eligible student who disenrolls</u>
- 13 <u>during the participating institution's full refund drop period</u>
- 14 shall be refunded by the institution to PHEAA no later than the
- 15 beginning of the academic year following the academic year in
- 16 which the eligible student was enrolled.
- 17 Section 2008-L. Need-based eligibility tiers for scholarship
- 18 awards.
- 19 (a) Order of financial aid.--A participating institution
- 20 shall apply the financial aid received by an eligible student in
- 21 the following order:
- 22 (1) Pell Grant.
- 23 (2) Pennsylvania State Grant.
- 24 (3) Institutional aid.
- 25 <u>(4) Private scholarship.</u>
- 26 (5) Scholarship award under this article.
- 27 <u>(6) Federal work study.</u>
- 28 (7) Federal student loans.
- 29 <u>(b) Amount of scholarship award.--The amount of a</u>
- 30 scholarship award shall be determined annually by the department

- 1 <u>based upon availability of program money. An eliqible student</u>
- 2 <u>attending:</u>
- 3 (1) a community college may receive up to \$2,000 per
- 4 <u>year; and</u>
- 5 (2) a State-owned university may receive up to \$4,000
- 6 per year.
- 7 (c) Application of scholarship award. -- After application of
- 8 the financial aid specified in subsection (a) (1), (2), (3) and
- 9 (4), the scholarship award shall first be applied against direct
- 10 charges at the participating institution which include tuition,
- 11 fees, room and board owed by an eligible student to the
- 12 <u>institution</u>. Any remaining scholarship award may be used by the
- 13 <u>scholarship recipient for other costs of attendance.</u>
- 14 (d) Limitation. -- A scholarship award may not exceed the cost
- 15 of attendance after all other financial aid has been applied to
- 16 a student's account.
- 17 Section 2009-L. College completion award.
- 18 The department shall establish and administer a competitive
- 19 completion award program for community colleges to provide
- 20 scholarship recipients with wraparound services to support
- 21 degree completion. Community colleges shall submit proposals in
- 22 the manner and format prescribed by the department. The
- 23 <u>department may expand the entities eligible for college</u>
- 24 completion awards by promulgating regulations.
- 25 <u>Section 2010-L. Disqualification from program participation.</u>
- An individual who knowingly or intentionally procures,
- 27 <u>obtains or aids another to procure or obtain a scholarship award</u>
- 28 under this article through fraudulent means shall be
- 29 <u>disqualified from participation in the program and shall be</u>
- 30 liable to the department for an amount equal to three times the

- 1 <u>amount awarded.</u>
- 2 <u>Section 2011-L. Taxability.</u>
- 3 A scholarship award received by an eliqible student shall not
- 4 <u>be considered taxable income for purposes of Article III of the</u>
- 5 act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code
- 6 <u>of 1971.</u>
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
