AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 17 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in powers and duties of the Department of Labor 21 and Industry, its departmental administrative and advisory 22 boards and departmental administrative officers, further 23 24 providing for Elevator Safety Board. 25 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 26 hereby enacts as follows: 27 Section 1. Section 2214.1(f) of the act of April 9, 1929 28 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is

- 1 Section 2214.1. Elevator Safety Board.--* * *
- 2 (f) +(1) The board shall recommend regulations to the

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- 3 Secretary of Labor and Industry relating to construction,
- 4 maintenance and inspection of elevators and safe operation of
- 5 elevators. The board may consult with engineering authorities
- 6 and other appropriate organizations regarding the application of
- 7 elevator industry codes and standards.
- 8 (2) The Secretary of Labor and Industry shall review any
- 9 recommendations for regulations submitted by the board and, if
- 10 the secretary approves the recommendations, shall promulgate
- 11 regulations consistent with the recommendations.
- 12 (3) The board may grant exceptions and variances from the
- 13 requirements of applicable codes and standards or regulations if
- 14 the changes would not jeopardize the safety and welfare of the
- 15 general public or individuals employed in the elevator industry.
- 16 The Department of Labor and Industry shall accept applications
- 17 for all exceptions and variances and shall make recommendations
- 18 on the applications to the board.
- 19 (4) The board may hold hearings and hear appeals on matters
- 20 relating to this section in accordance with regulations and
- 21 procedures established by the board in consultation with the
- 22 Department of Labor and Industry.
- 23 (5) (i) Commencing January JULY 1, 2025, the applicable <-
- 24 elevator code for the Commonwealth shall be the ASME A17.1-2016.
- 25 <u>Subsequently, the Elevator Safety Board shall adopt a more</u>
- 26 <u>recent version of ASME A17.1 every three (3) years.</u>
- 27 <u>(ii) Prior to January 1, 2025, the Elevator Safety Board may</u>
- 28 adopt ASME A17.1 2016 or an update subsequent to ASME A17.1 2016
- 29 <u>as the applicable elevator code for the Commonwealth.</u>
- 30 (iii) (II) For the purposes of this paragraph, the term

- 1 "ASME" shall mean the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
