AN ACT

- Amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, providing for extensive amendments to the very 2 small meat processor Federal inspection reimbursement grant 3 4 program. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Chapter 101 heading and sections 10101, 10102, 10103, 10104, 10105 and 10106 of Title 3 of the Pennsylvania 8 Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 10 CHAPTER 101 11 VERY SMALL MEAT AND POULTRY PROCESSOR [FEDERAL INSPECTION] 12 REIMBURSEMENT GRANT PROGRAM 1.3 § 10101. Short title of chapter. 14 This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the Very 15 Small Meat and Poultry Processor [Federal Inspection] 16 Reimbursement Grant Program.
- 18 It is the intent of the General Assembly [that very small

- 4 reimbursement grants to cover the costs associated with [meeting
- 5 Federal inspection and certification guidelines during the
- 6 planning and start-up periods for these operations.]:
- 7 (1) A grant of inspection from the USDA Food Safety and
- 8 Inspection Service.
- 9 (2) Opening a new very small meat and poultry processing
- 10 operation.
- 11 (3) Expanding the capacity of a current very small meat
- and poultry processing operation.
- 13 (4) A combination of paragraphs (1), (2) and (3).
- 14 § 10103. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 "Applicant." A person applying for a reimbursement grant
- 19 under section 10104 (relating to grant program).
- 20 "Grant cycle." The period of time from when the department
- 21 solicits applications for grants under section 10104 to when-
- 22 applicants spend grant funds awarded. This period shall be no
- 23 <u>more than two fiscal years.</u> FINAL REIMBURSEMENT.
- "Grant of inspection." An inspection by the USDA FOOD SAFETY <--

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- 25 AND INSPECTION SERVICE certifying that products at a very small
- 26 meat and poultry processing operation are produced in accordance
- 27 <u>with Federal law.</u>
- 28 "Person." An individual, partnership, association, firm,
- 29 corporation or any other legal entity.
- 30 "USDA." The United States Department of Agriculture.

- 1 ["Very small meat processor." A person subject to Federal
- 2 meat inspection that meets the United States Department of
- 3 Agriculture's definition of a "very small processor," having
- 4 fewer than 10 employees or annual sales of less than
- 5 \$2,500,000.]
- 6 "Very small meat and poultry processing operation." A person
- 7 operating under a grant of inspection that meets the definition
- 8 of "very small establishment" as described in 9 CFR 381.65(g)(1)
- 9 (i) (relating to operations and procedures, generally).
- 10 § 10104. Grant program.
- 11 (a) Availability. -- Grants under this chapter shall only be
- 12 offered [in a fiscal year in which and] to the extent that
- 13 funding is made available to the department. The following shall
- 14 apply:
- 15 (1) In the event funding is exhausted or otherwise
- unavailable, the department shall be under no obligation to
- 17 provide grants under this chapter.
- 18 (2) Grant money may be prorated or offered as a
- 19 percentage of actual costs, as determined by the department
- and set forth in an order by the secretary, to spread
- 21 available money to a larger number of eligible applicants.
- The secretary shall transmit notice of an order issued under
- this chapter to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
- 24 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 25 (b) Reimbursement grants. -- A grant under this chapter shall
- 26 be a reimbursement grant. The following shall apply:
- 27 (1) The amount of reimbursement shall be based on actual
- eligible costs submitted by an approved applicant [during a
- fiscal year in which grants are offered] within the grant_
- 30 <u>cycle</u>.

1	(2) Grant reimbursement money shall only be available
2	for the eligible costs [of obtaining a Federal certification
3	to allow the sale of meat by a very small meat processor.
4	(c) EligibilityA very small meat processor may apply to
5	receive reimbursement for the cost of meeting Federal inspection
6	guidelines during the planning and start-up periods for the
7	operations. The applicant must be in compliance with all
8	applicable Federal licensure, recordkeeping and slaughter
9	requirements.] associated with:
10	(i) Meeting the requirements to obtain a grant of
11	inspection.
12	(ii) Opening a new very small meat and poultry
13	processing operation.
14	(iii) Expanding the capacity of a current very small
15	meat and poultry processing operation.
16	(iv) A combination of subparagraphs (i), (ii) and
17	<u>(iii).</u>
18	(c.1) Eligibility An applicant may apply to receive
19	reimbursement for eligible costs under section 10105 (relating
20	to eligible costs) if the applicant is a very small meat and
21	<pre>poultry processing operation and is either:</pre>
22	(1) currently operating under USDA Federal inspection A <
23	GRANT OF INSPECTION; or
24	(2) upon completion of the approved project, the
25	applicant will obtain a grant of inspection.
26	(c.2) Attestation
27	(1) An applicant shall attest to the eligibility
28	requirements under subsection (c.1).
29	(2) The attestation shall be made under penalty of law
30	and subject to 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 49 (relating to falsification

- 2 (3) If a statement or material fact on the application
- 3 is found to be false, grant money received by the applicant
- 4 <u>shall be returned to the department within 30 days of</u>
- 5 <u>notification of the finding.</u>
- 6 (d) Application procedure. -- An applicant who desires to
- 7 receive a [very small meat processor Federal inspection]
- 8 reimbursement grant under this section shall submit a grant
- 9 application on a form provided by the department. The
- 10 application shall contain the following information
- 11 demonstrating and attesting to:
- 12 (1) The applicant's name, the organization name, a
- business address and a telephone number.
- 14 (2) A list of corporate officers.
- 15 (3) The applicant's eligibility[, setting forth
- information evidencing and attesting that the applicant meets
- the definition of a "very small meat processor."] under
- 18 subsection (c.1).
- 19 (4) A detailed plan [outlining], including the process
- being undertaken to [apply for and obtain Federal
- certification as a meat processor.
- (5) The estimated meet the requirements necessary to
- obtain a grant of inspection from the USDA Food Safety and
- 24 <u>Inspection Service</u> as a very small meat and poultry
- 25 <u>processing operation. The plan shall outline the overall</u>
- 26 project and materials being requested, including a line item
- 27 <u>proposed budget, individual tasks required to complete the</u>
- 28 project, a detailed timeline for completion of project tasks
- 29 <u>and, if applicable, detailed descriptions of equipment or</u>
- 30 supplies required to complete the project, training,

- 1 consulting, technical support and other services utilized.
- 2 (5) A detailed list of costs, including training and
- 3 <u>equipment</u> costs_L for which reimbursement is sought.
- 4 (6) An attestation signed by the applicant <u>and subject</u>
- 5 to 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 49 stating the applicant is in [good
- 6 standing with all Federal licensure, recordkeeping and
- 7 slaughter requirements, including the Federal Hazard Analysis
- 8 Critical Control Point standards.] compliance, or will be in
- 9 <u>compliance after the approved project, with the Federal Meat</u>
- Inspection Act (Public Law 59-382, 21 U.S.C. § 601 et seq.)
- or the Poultry Products Inspection Act (Public Law 85-172, 21
- 12 <u>U.S.C. § 451 et seq.</u>) to maintain a grant of inspection.
- (e) Evaluation of application. -- The department shall
- 14 <u>evaluate an application on the basis of:</u>
- 15 (1) The ability of the applicant to complete the stated
- 16 project within the stated timeline.
- 17 (2) The ability of the applicant to provide a detailed
- description of the project and project costs as required by
- 19 subsection (d).
- 20 (3) The potential of the project to provide slaughter or
- 21 <u>meat or poultry processing capacity and services to this</u>
- 22 Commonwealth's livestock and poultry producers.
- 23 (4) The potential of the project to provide availability
- of Pennsylvania-produced meat or poultry products to
- consumers.
- 26 § 10105. Eligible costs.
- 27 The following costs, incurred during the term of the grant
- 28 cycle in which the grant is awarded, shall be eligible for
- 29 reimbursement:
- 30 [(1) Invoiced costs directly incurred for the initial

- compliance inspection.]
- 2 (1.1) Consulting or other technical support services
- 3 that directly support the development and maintenance of
- 4 programs required to operate under USDA Federal Inspection A <--
- 5 GRANT OF INSPECTION.
- 6 (2) [A one-time reimbursement for the cost, not
- 7 including man hours, directly incurred in producing the
- 8 required Federal Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point
- 9 plan.] <u>Professional employee training and educational</u>
- 10 <u>services and programs that support the development and</u>
- 11 <u>maintenance of programs to operate under USDA Federal</u> <--

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- 12 <u>Inspection A GRANT OF INSPECTION.</u> If a professional
- consultant is utilized [to develop the Federal Hazard
- Analysis Critical Control Point plan], reasonable costs may
- be reimbursed, as determined by the department.
- 16 (3) Up to [50%] 85% of the actual costs of [a first-
- time] the purchase of meat or poultry slaughter or processing
- equipment [necessary for compliance with the Federal Hazard
- Analysis Critical Control Point plan.] or supplies. This
- 20 paragraph does not include reimbursement of the cost of
- 21 planning, erection, repair or modification of a structure or
- 22 building or repair or installation of roofing or other
- 23 physical structure improvement.
- 24 <u>(4) The purchase of equipment or supplies directly</u>
- 25 related to employee safety.
- 26 § 10106. Final reimbursement.
- 27 (a) Required submission.--Reimbursement shall be based on
- 28 the approved applicant's <u>timely</u> completion of the project and
- 29 submission of the final costs [of obtaining the required Federal
- 30 certification for which grant money was sought] related to

Τ	expenses and materials in the applicant's approved grant project
2	WITHIN THE GRANT CYCLE. The submission shall include:
3	[(1) The date of the inspection.
4	(2) The name of the Federal inspector or veterinarian in
5	charge of the inspection.
6	(3) A document signed by the Federal inspector or
7	veterinarian in charge evidencing that the approved
8	applicant's establishment passed the inspection.]
9	(4) Documentation of actual [costs for which
10	reimbursement is sought and payment of the costs.]
11	expenditures for eligible costs approved in the grant
12	application and invoices evidencing payment of the costs. The
13	documentation may include invoices for hours of training or
14	consultation.
15	(5) Documentation of the completion of the approved
16	project. The documentation may include pictures and dates of
17	training and equipment installation.
18	(6) Documentation demonstrating the very small meat and
19	poultry processing operation is operating under a grant of
20	inspection.
21	(7) A written report related to:
22	(i) The completed project.
23	(ii) The expansion of meat or poultry processing
24	capability.
25	(iii) Expanded services to this Commonwealth's
26	livestock and poultry producers.
27	(iv) An increase to the availability of this
28	Commonwealth's meat or poultry products to consumers.
29	(b) Distribution of final reimbursementDistribution of
30	grant money to the approved applicant will occur upon the

- 2 (1) Submission and receipt of the information required 3 under subsection (a).
- 4 (2) Final review and approval for completeness of the required submission and the eligible costs.
- 6 (3) A completed grant agreement between the department 7 and an approved applicant.
- 8 (c) Assignment of grant money. -- Grant money may only be
- 9 distributed to the owner of the eligible establishment. The
- 10 department may not assign grant money to a lessee, operator or
- 11 person other than the owner of the eligible very small meat
- 12 [processing establishment] and poultry processing operation.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
