AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," providing for personal protective equipment for 21 22 frontline workers. 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows: 25 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 26 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding an

2	PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT FOR FRONTLINE WORKERS
3	Section 101-A. Definitions.
4	The following words and phrases when used in this article
5	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
6	<pre>context clearly indicates otherwise:</pre>
7	"COVID-19 pandemic." The novel coronavirus as identified in
8	the proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
9	March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and
10	any renewal of the disaster emergency.
11	"Frontline worker." An employee who is unable to perform the
12	employee's job duties remotely and continues to perform the
13	employee's job duties during the COVID-19 pandemic while being
14	employed by any of the following:
15	(1) A hospital or health care system.
16	(2) A retail grocery store.
17	(3) A long-term health care facility.
18	(4) A police department.
19	(5) A fire department.
20	(6) A volunteer fire department.
21	(7) An emergency medical services company.
22	(8) A volunteer emergency medical services company.
23	(9) A sanitation company.
24	"Health care system." An organized system of health care in
25	which multiple health care providers participate and the health
26	care providers satisfy all of the following:
27	(1) The health care providers provide health care
28	services in a manner so that the public is aware that the
29	health care providers participate in a joint arrangement.
20	(2) The health care providers participate in any of the

1	following joint activities:
2	(i) A utilization review that involves the review of
3	health care decisions of participating covered entities
4	by other participating covered entities or a third party
5	on behalf of the participating covered entities.
6	(ii) Quality assessment and improvement activities
7	that include the assessment of the treatment provided by
8	participating covered entities by other participating
9	covered entities or a third party on behalf of the
10	participating covered entities.
11	(iii) Payment activities if all of the following
12	apply:
13	(A) The financial risk for delivering health
14	care is partially or wholly shared by participating
15	covered entities through the joint arrangement.
16	(B) Protected health care information created or
17	received by the participating covered entities is
18	reviewed by other participating covered entities or a
19	third party on behalf of the participating covered
20	<pre>entities.</pre>
21	"Personal protective equipment." Equipment worn to minimize
22	exposure to hazards that cause serious injuries and illnesses.
23	"Sanitation company." An entity engaged in the collection,
24	processing, transfer, transportation or disposal of solid waste
25	or recyclables.
26	Section 102-A. Frontline workers.
27	Money appropriated by the Federal Government or the General
28	Assembly for expenses incurred as a result of the COVID-19
29	pandemic which is to be used to purchase or provide personal
30	protective equipment or supplies to frontline workers shall

- 1 <u>include the individuals defined in section 101-A.</u>
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
