AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Prohibiting solar radiation modification, cloud seeding and polluting atmospheric activity within this Commonwealth; imposing duties on the Pennsylvania State Police and sheriffs; and imposing penalties.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Short title.
8	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Clean Air
9	Preservation Act.
10	Section 2. Definitions.
11	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
12	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
13	context clearly indicates otherwise:
14	"Air National Guard." The Pennsylvania Air National Guard, a
15	reserve component of the United States Air Force.
16	"Artificial intelligence." The term refers to systems or
17	machines that mimic human intelligence to perform tasks and can
18	iteratively improve themselves based on the information it
19	collects and can manifest in a number of forms.

"Atmospheric activity." Any deliberate polluting activity
 conducted by any iteration of human, machine learning or
 artificial intelligence, or any combination thereof, that occurs
 in the atmosphere and may have harmful consequences upon health,
 the environment or agriculture.

Cloud seeding." A type of weather modification that
attempts to change the amount or type of precipitation by
dispersing chemicals such as silver iodide, potassium iodide and
dry ice into the air by means of aircraft or ground generators.
"Entity." Any of the following:

- 13 (3) Firm.

- 15 (5) Corporation, including a quasi-governmental
- 16 corporation.
- 17 (6) Nongovernmental organization.
- 18 (7) Partnership.

- 20 (9) Syndicate.
- 21 (10) Municipality or municipal agency.
- 22 (11) Program.
- 23 (12) Fire district.
- 24 (13) Club.
- 25 (14) Nonprofit agency.
- 26 (15) Commission.
- 27 (16) University or college located in this Commonwealth.
- 28 (17) Department or agency of this Commonwealth.
- 29 (18) The Federal Government or any interstate or
- 30 international governance or instrumentality thereof,
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including foreign, domestic and mercenary armed services or
 region within the United States.

3 "Geoengineering." The intentional alteration or manipulation 4 of the environment, involving the release of nuclear, 5 biological, chemical, trans-biological, electromagnetic or other 6 physical agents or pollutants that effect changes to Earth's 7 atmosphere or surface and is inclusive of weather modification, 8 aerosol injection into the stratosphere or cloud seeding.

9 "Hazard." A process, substance or physical agent by its 10 nature that is harmful to living organisms generally or to 11 property or another interest of value.

12 "Machine learning." The process in which a machine can learn 13 on its own without being explicitly programmed.

14 "Physical agent." An agent, other than a substance, 15 including, without limitation, RF/MW and other electromagnetic 16 radiation and fields, barometric pressure, temperature, gravity, 17 kinetic weaponry, mechanical vibration and sound.

18 "Pollutant." Any solid, liquid, gaseous or thermal irritant, 19 contaminant or substance, including smoke, vapor, soot, fumes, 20 aerosol plumes, acid, alkalis, chemicals, artificially produced 21 electric fields, magnetic field, electromagnetic field, 22 electromagnetic pulse, sound waves, sound pollution, light 23 pollution, microwaves and all artificially produced ionizing or 24 nonionizing radiation or waste.

25 "Pollution." The discharge, dispersal, deposition, release, 26 seepage, migration or escape of pollutants.

27 "Release." Any activity that results in the issuance of 28 contaminants such as the emitting, transmitting, discharging or 29 injecting of one or more nuclear, biological, trans-biological, 30 chemical or physical agents into the ambient atmosphere, whether

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1 once, intermittently or continuously.

2 "Sheriff." A Pennsylvania sheriff, the Constitutional3 officers responsible for county law enforcement.

4 "Stratosphere." The region of the upper atmosphere extending
5 upward from the edge of the troposphere to about 30 miles above
6 the Earth.

7 "Troposphere." The region of the lowest layer of the 8 atmosphere, six to twelve miles high in altitude, wherein 9 temperature steadily drops with increasing altitude and nearly 10 all cloud formations occur and weather conditions manifest. 11 "Waste." Includes materials to be recycled, reconditioned or

12 reclaimed.

13 "Weather engineering." The deliberate manipulation or 14 alteration of the environment for the purpose of changing the 15 weather or climate by artificial means, typically involving the 16 deliberate release of polluting emissions in the atmosphere via 17 cloud seeding, for small-scale, large-scale and global-scale 18 alteration of the environment.

Weather modification." Changing, controlling or interfering with or attempting to change, control or interfere with the natural development of cloud forms, precipitation, barometric pressure, temperature, conductivity or other electromagnetic or sonic characteristics of the atmosphere.

24 Section 4. Prohibited activity.

The Pennsylvania State Police or a sheriff shall immediately issue a cease-and-desist order when unlawful cloud seeding or polluting atmospheric activity is suspected by an entity. The cease-and-desist order under this section shall have the weight of a court order and any violation shall be punished in accordance with section 6.

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1 Section 5. Notice to cease Federal or foreign-approved 2

programs.

3 (a) General rule.--Government and armed forces projects must meet all the requirements of this act. If an activity deemed a 4 hazard by this act has been approved, explicitly or implicitly, 5 by the Federal Government, the Pennsylvania State Police or a 6 7 sheriff shall issue a notice to the appropriate Federal agency 8 that the activity cannot lawfully be carried out within or over 9 this Commonwealth.

Implementation. -- The Pennsylvania State Police or a 10 (b) sheriff is authorized to and shall implement this act, 11 12 determining whether violations have occurred and, if deemed 13 necessary, shall refer potentially prohibited activity to the 14 Air National Guard.

Section 6. Penalties and enforcement. 15

16 An entity that engages in an atmospheric activity or uses an 17 unmarked or unidentified aircraft or other vehicle or facility 18 to carry out a weather engineering or other polluting 19 atmospheric activity shall:

20 (1) Have committed a felony and shall pay a fine of not 21 less than \$500,000 or be imprisoned for not less than two 22 years, or both.

23 (2) Be guilty of a separate offense for each day during 24 which activity has been conducted, repeated or continued.

25 (3) Be deemed in violation and subject to any further penalties of the act of January 8, 1960 (1959 P.L.2119, 26 27 No.787), known as the Air Pollution Control Act.

Section 7. Effective date. 28

29 This act shall take effect immediately.

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
