AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937) P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of 2 unemployment compensation to be administered by the 3 Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly 4 created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions) 5 selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to 6 keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay 7 contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons; 8 9 providing procedure and administrative details for the 10 determination, payment and collection of such contributions 11 and the payment of such compensation; providing for 12 cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies; 13 creating certain special funds in the custody of the State 14 Treasurer; and prescribing penalties, " in emergency 15 provisions related to COVID-19, further providing for relief 16 from charges. 17 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 19 hereby enacts as follows: 20 Section 1. Section 1603(d)(1) of the act of December 5, 1936 21 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment 22 Compensation Law, added March 27, 2020 (P.L.25, No.9), is 23 amended to read: 24 Section 1603. - 26 (d) Benefit repayment for reimbursable employers. -- For any

- 1 employer who makes payments in lieu of contribution under this
- 2 act, the following shall apply to payments for benefits for
- 3 weeks of unemployment occurring during a disaster emergency
- 4 declared by the Governor related to COVID-19:
- 5 (1) An employer who has elected to pay the solvency fee
- 6 under section 213 shall receive automatic relief from charges
- 7 in accordance with subsections (b) and (c). The department
- 8 shall provide an employer with the option of paying the
- 9 solvency fee retroactively for the current calendar year. An
- 10 <u>employer electing to pay the solvency fee retroactively for</u>
- the current calendar year shall pay the solvency fee within
- 12 <u>30 days.</u>

- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
