AN ACT

- Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in commencement of
 proceedings, providing for execution of warrants.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 8903. Execution of warrants.
- 9 <u>(a) Standards.--The following standards shall apply to each</u>
- 10 law enforcement officer and law enforcement agency for the
- 11 <u>execution of any warrant issued in this Commonwealth under</u>
- 12 Chapters 2 and 5 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal
- 13 <u>Procedure:</u>
- 14 (1) A law enforcement officer shall physically knock and
- announce himself or herself before forcibly entering a home
- and shall wait a minimum of 15 seconds to allow the occupants
- of the home to respond and open the door.
- 18 (2) A law enforcement officer shall wear a body camera,

Τ	<u>keep the law enforcement officer's body camera on and record</u>
2	video on the law enforcement officer's body camera:
3	(i) when the law enforcement officer conducts a
4	search;
5	(ii) for a minimum of five minutes before and after
6	the execution of the warrant; and
7	(iii) during any period that involves a subsequent
8	arrest or search of a person or property.
9	(3) A law enforcement officer shall be in uniform or
_0	otherwise be wearing clothing that makes the law enforcement
.1	officer clearly and immediately identifiable as a law
.2	enforcement officer.
13	(b) Training The Attorney General, in collaboration with
4	the Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police, shall have the
.5	<pre>following duties:</pre>
6	(1) Establish a course of training for law enforcement
_7	officers on the constitutional, legal and technical aspects
8 ـ	of executing warrants for the arrest of persons and search of
_9	property.
20	(2) Promulgate regulations as necessary to implement the
21	training program under paragraph (1).
22	(3) Establish minimum standards for the certification
23	and periodic recertification of law enforcement officers as
24	eligible to conduct the execution of warrants. The minimum
25	standards under this paragraph shall be included in the
26	annual recertification and continuing education of law
27	enforcement officers in accordance with 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21
28	Subch. D (relating to municipal police education and
29	training).
30	(c) Sanctions Notwithstanding any other provision of law,

- 1 <u>decision</u>, <u>order</u>, <u>agreement or practice</u>, <u>a law enforcement</u>
- 2 officer who fails to comply with the requirements under
- 3 <u>subsection</u> (a) shall be suspended from duty and the law
- 4 <u>enforcement officer's certification issued under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch.</u>
- 5 21 Subch. D shall be suspended or revoked as follows:
- 6 (1) For a first violation, the law enforcement officer's
- 7 <u>certification shall be suspended for a period of six months.</u>
- 8 (2) For a second violation, the law enforcement
- 9 <u>officer's certification shall be suspended for a period of</u>
- 10 <u>one year.</u>
- 11 (3) For a third or subsequent violation, the law
- 12 <u>enforcement officer's certification shall be revoked.</u>
- 13 <u>(d) Arbitration.--A suspension or revocation under</u>
- 14 <u>subsection (c) shall not be subject to arbitration or</u>
- 15 reinstatement under the act of June 24, 1968 (P.L.237, No.111),
- 16 referred to as the Policemen and Firemen Collective Bargaining
- 17 Act, or any other law of this Commonwealth.
- 18 (e) Cause of action. -- Any person aggrieved for a violation
- 19 of the requirements under subsection (a) may bring an action in
- 20 an appropriate court of common pleas against a law enforcement
- 21 officer or law enforcement agency on the grounds that the law
- 22 enforcement officer or law enforcement agency intentionally
- 23 <u>failed to comply with requirements under subsection (a). If the</u>
- 24 court concludes that the law enforcement officer or law
- 25 <u>enforcement agency intentionally failed to comply with</u>
- 26 requirements under subsection (a), the court may order damages
- 27 to the person or injunctive relief.
- 28 (f) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 29 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 30 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 <u>"Body camera." An electronic, mechanical or other device</u>
- 2 that has been approved by the Pennsylvania State Police under 18
- 3 Pa.C.S. § 5706(b)(4) (relating to exceptions to prohibitions in
- 4 possession, sale, distribution, manufacture or advertisement of
- 5 electronic, mechanical or other devices) to intercept the
- 6 communication in the course of law enforcement duties.
- 7 "Law enforcement agency." An agency that employs a law
- 8 <u>enforcement officer.</u>
- 9 "Law enforcement officer." A member of the Pennsylvania
- 10 State Police or an individual employed as a police officer who
- 11 holds a current certificate under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D.
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
