AN ACT

Amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for initiative to finance production of 2 fresh food. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. - 2 § 12101. Scope of chapter.
- 3 This chapter relates to the Fresh Food Financing Initiative.
- 4 § 12102. Definitions.
- 5 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 6 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 7 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 <u>"Farmers' market." A building, structure or place owned,</u>
- 9 <u>leased or otherwise in possession by a person, municipal</u>
- 10 corporation or public or private organization, used or intended
- 11 to be used by two or more farmers or an association of farmers
- 12 for the purpose of selling agricultural commodities directly to
- 13 consumers and which is physically located within this
- 14 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 15 "Food access organization." A nonprofit organization with
- 16 expertise in improving access to food in underserved
- 17 communities.
- 18 "Grant." A grant awarded under section 12104(e) (relating to
- 19 administration of program).
- 20 "Grocery store." A for-profit or not-for-profit self-service
- 21 retail establishment that primarily sells meat, seafood, fruits,
- 22 vegetables, dairy products, dry groceries, household products
- 23 and sundries.
- 24 "Program." The Pennsylvania Fresh Food Financing Initiative
- 25 established under section 12103 (relating to establishment).
- 26 "Regional anchor supermarket." A company that owns multiple
- 27 grocery stores within a given region.
- 28 "Retail food establishment." As defined under section 5702
- 29 (relating to definitions).
- 30 "Underserved community." A census tract determined to be an

- 1 area with low grocery store access by either the United States
- 2 Department of Agriculture as identified in the Food Access
- 3 Research Atlas, or through a methodology that has been adopted
- 4 for use by another governmental entity, food access organization
- 5 <u>or the secretary.</u>
- 6 <u>"USDA-designated food desert." A census tract declared to be</u>
- 7 <u>a food desert by the United States Department of Agriculture's</u>
- 8 <u>Economic Research Service.</u>
- 9 <u>§ 12103. Establishment.</u>
- 10 The Pennsylvania Fresh Food Financing Initiative is
- 11 <u>established within the department.</u>
- 12 <u>§ 12104. Administration of program.</u>
- 13 (a) Administration. -- The program shall be administered by
- 14 the department. The department may collaborate with the
- 15 Department of Community and Economic Development to improve food
- 16 access in this Commonwealth.
- 17 (b) Program management.--The department shall develop and
- 18 establish program quidelines and eligibility criteria to meet
- 19 the needs of program applicants and the communities served.
- 20 (c) Program priority.--
- 21 (1) The program shall promote local agricultural
- 22 products by placing priority on projects producing,
- 23 <u>aggregating</u>, sourcing or selling Pennsylvania agricultural
- 24 commodities, including the department's Pennsylvania
- 25 Preferred® Program, that:
- 26 (i) are located in or serve a USDA-designated food
- 27 desert;
- 28 (ii) increase business opportunities for businesses
- 29 <u>recognized by the Department of General Services as</u>
- 30 verified as a small diverse business or a small veteran

- 1 business; or
- 2 (iii) are accompanied with matching private funds.
- 3 <u>(2) (Reserved).</u>
- 4 (d) Project class. -- The department shall make grants
- 5 <u>available in the following classes:</u>
- 6 (1) Regional anchor supermarkets.
- 7 <u>(2) Grocery stores.</u>
- 8 (3) Retail food establishments.
- 9 <u>(4) Farmers markets.</u>
- 10 (e) Grants.--Grants in an amount not to exceed 15% of the
- 11 <u>funding for any of the project classes established under</u>
- 12 <u>subsection</u> (d) shall be awarded to qualifying applicants
- 13 <u>selected to receive the awards for the purposes of capital</u>
- 14 projects.
- (f) Matching funds. -- A grant awarded to a regional anchor
- 16 <u>supermarket under the program must be matched by private funds</u>
- 17 in an amount equal to the grant.
- 18 (q) Administrative or operational costs. -- No more than 10%
- 19 of the funding under section 12106 (relating to grant money) may
- 20 be reserved for administrative and operational costs to manage
- 21 the program. Costs for personnel may be included as part of the
- 22 department's administrative or operational costs.
- 23 § 12105. Grant fund eligibility.
- 24 (a) Eligible applicants. -- An entity that meets the following
- 25 <u>criteria shall be eligible to apply for a grant under the</u>
- 26 program:
- 27 (1) The primary business, measured as being greater than
- or equal to 50% of the entity's previous year's annual
- 29 <u>revenue, is from the sale of staple and perishable food to</u>
- 30 consumers or direct to retail settings.

1	(2) The entity operates and provides service in this
2	<u>Commonwealth.</u>
3	(3) The entity serves customers that live in an
4	underserved community.
5	(4) The entity provides access to affordable, high-
6	quality fresh produce, meat and dairy products and other
7	grocery items for shoppers in an underserved community.
8	(b) Eligible uses An eligible use for grant money includes
9	any of the following:
_0	(1) Costs to expand access to Pennsylvania grown or
1	processed produce, dairy and meat products or provide stable
.2	market access for Pennsylvania farmers.
13	(2) Innovative food access technology that assists an
4	existing or new grocery store.
.5	(3) Innovative food access technology that assists the
6	food access efforts of a retail food establishment.
_7	(4) Innovative food access technology or delivery of
8 .	food to retail that assists the food access efforts of an
_9	eligible applicant.
20	(c) Application review and approval The department shall
21	devise, award and administer grants to eligible applicants.
22	(d) Standards and requirements
23	(1) The department shall establish grant program
24	standards and requirements for a grant program under this
25	chapter and shall transmit notice of the grant program
26	standards and requirements to the Legislative Reference
27	Bureau for publication in the next available issue of the
28	Pennsylvania Bulletin.
29	(2) Grant program standards and requirements shall:
30	(i) Establish eligibility standards for applicants.

Τ	(11) Describe the objectives of the grant program,
2	which shall be consistent with this chapter.
3	(iii) Establish caps, limits and restrictions with
4	respect to grant amounts.
5	(iv) Establish an application process and timetable.
6	(v) Present the criteria under which grant
7	applications shall be evaluated by the department.
8	(vi) Establish a timetable within which the
9	department shall award or disapprove a completed grant
10	application.
11	(vii) Establish procedures by which the department
12	shall verify expenditures of grant money by a grant
13	recipient.
14	(e) Disposition of grants
15	(1) The department may require a written agreement
16	describing the terms and conditions of the grant.
17	(2) The department may establish criteria under which
18	the secretary may demand the return of all or a portion of
19	the grant money.
20	(3) The secretary may approve a grant in less than a
21	requested amount. The secretary may also impose restrictions
22	or special conditions upon the issuance of a grant.
23	(4) The secretary shall ensure that the grant money
24	awarded under this chapter is geographically disbursed
25	throughout this Commonwealth.
26	§ 12106. Grant money.
27	The Fresh Food Financing Initiative Restricted Account is
28	established in the General Fund and shall be used exclusively
29	for the program in accordance with this chapter. Grants may only
30	be awarded to the extent money is appropriated by the General

- 1 Assembly. In addition to money appropriated to the department
- 2 for the program, the department may also accept other revenue,
- 3 <u>including Federal appropriations</u>, for deposit into the
- 4 <u>restricted account for the sole purpose of awarding grants and</u>
- 5 administering the program.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
