AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled 1 "An act relating to the finances of the State government; 2 providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for 3 ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint 4 Underwriting Association, for entertainment business 5 financial management firms, for private dam financial 6 7 assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, 8 bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the 9 collection and recovery of fees and other money or property 10 11 due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, 12 the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds 13 and securities belonging to or in the possession of the 14 Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the 15 Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the 16 courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the 17 Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and 18 all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting 19 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 20 21 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes 22 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of 23 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of 24 25 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every 26 department, board, commission, and officer of the State 27 government, every political subdivision of the State, and 28 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, 29 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or 30 31 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws 32 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or 33 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the 34 Commonwealth," in emergency COVID-19 response, providing for 35

16	Section 136-C. Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority
17	Water and Wastewater Utility Payments Program.
18	From money appropriated to the Pennsylvania Infrastructure
19	Investment Authority for COVID Relief - PennVEST Water and
20	<u>Wastewater Utility Payments Program, \$25,000,000 shall be</u>

2	period of April 1, 2020, to July 31, 2020. The amount of
3	arrearages shall be signed and verified by a representative
4	of the water and wastewater provider and shall be subject to
5	audit upon request by the Pennsylvania Infrastructure
6	Investment Authority.
7	(2) Distribute CARES funding to each water or wastewater
8	provider on a pro rata basis from the calculation determined
9	<u>under paragraph (1) within 15 days.</u>
10	(3) Require each water and wastewater provider to submit
11	within 30 days a plan to the Pennsylvania Infrastructure
12	Investment Authority detailing the distribution of funds to
13	residential customers. Upon approval of the plan, the water
14	or wastewater provider may distribute the grant funding
15	according to the plan and, in the event of remaining grant
16	funds, use funds for small business customers.
17	(4) Require each water or wastewater provider to report
18	within three months of receipt of the money to the
19	Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority how the
20	money was allocated, how many customers were assisted, how
21	much assistance was received, the remaining arrearages from
22	paragraph (1) and new arrearages since the assistance was
23	provided.

27	Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

1	Low-Income Energy Assistance Residential Utility Payment
2	Program, \$100,000,000 shall be distributed through the Low-
3	Income Energy Assistance Program to provide utility security for
4	residential utility customers. In making the distribution under
5	this section, the Department of Human Services shall:
6	(1) Extend the enrollment period for applications until
7	all funds allocated under this section are expended.
8	(2) Amend crisis grant requirements to accept past-due
9	utility bills as evidence of a crisis.
10	(3) Allow a public utility to establish flexible
11	verification procedures.
12	(4) Permit applicants to calculate their income based on
13	recent changes to income or unemployment.
14	(5) Establish a temporary program of crisis grant
15	assistance equal to \$600 utilizing paragraphs (1), (2), (3)
16	and (4) for households with dwelling units occupied by
17	persons with an annual income at or below 200% of the Federal
18	poverty guidelines.
19	(6) Include the distribution under this section in the
20	LIHEAP annual report.
21	Section 3. Article I-C of the act is amended by adding a
22	subarticle to read:

24	PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION
25	Section 190.5-C. Small Business Utility Assistance Program.
26	From money appropriated to the commission for COVID Relief -
27	Small Business Utility Assistance Program, \$25,000,000 shall be
28	distributed to public utilities to provide small business
29	assistance grants to qualifying small business for the payment
30	of utility expenses. To qualify for a small business assistance

1	grant, the small business must meet the definition of a "small
2	business customer" under 52 Pa. Code Ch. 54 (relating to
3	<u>electricity generation customer choice) or 62 (relating to</u>
4	natural gas supply customer choice). In making the distribution
5	under this section, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission
6	shall administer the temporary grant program by:
7	(1) Requiring each public utility to submit within 15
8	days, the number of and total arrearages for qualifying small
9	business customers in their service territory for the period
10	<u>of April 1, 2020, to July 31, 2020.</u>
11	(2) Distributing the money to each public utility on a
12	pro rata basis from the calculation determined under
13	paragraph (1) within 15 days.
14	(3) Requiring each public utility to submit within 30
15	days a plan to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission
16	detailing the distribution of funds to qualifying small
17	businesses. Upon approval of the plan, the public utility may
18	distribute the grant funding according to the plan.
19	(4) Requiring each public utility to report within three
20	months of receipt of the money to the Pennsylvania Public
21	Utility Commission how the money was allocated, how many
22	businesses were assisted, how much assistance was received,
23	the remaining arrearages from paragraph (1) and new
24	arrearages since the assistance was provided.
25	(5) Compiling the reports and posting the compilation on
26	the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's publicly
27	accessible Internet website.
28	Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
