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2 (e.1) In addition to the other limitations imposed under

3 this section, the board may not promulgate ambient air quality

4 standards, emission or performance standards, control measures

5 or other requirements, and the department may not impose permit

6 or plan approval conditions, for methane that are more stringent

7 than those promulgated by the United States Environmental

8 Protection Agency for new sources. The board, by regulation, may

9 <u>incorporate by reference the control techniques guidelines</u>

10 developed by the United States Environmental Protection Agency

11 for existing sources of methane if the board determines that the

12 control techniques guidelines are reasonably necessary to

13 achieve and maintain compliance with the requirements of the

14 ozone transport region under the Clean Air Act.

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
