AN ACT

1 2 3	Establishing the Pennsylvania Opportunity Program and the Pennsylvania Opportunity Program Fund; imposing duties on the Treasury Department; and imposing penalties.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
8	Opportunity Program Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Department." The Treasury Department of the Commonwealth.
14	"Eligible individual." An individual who:
15	(1) Resides in this Commonwealth.
16	(2) Is at least 18 years of age.
17	(3) Has a household income of \$80,000 or less.
18	(4) Is eligible to receive an opportunity payment.

1 "Household income." All income received by an individual and 2 the individual's spouse during the prior calendar year. "Income." As follows: 3 (1) All income from whatever source derived, including: 4 5 Salaries, wages, bonuses and incentive payments, (i) 6 whether based on profits or otherwise, commissions, fees, 7 tips, income from self-employment, alimony, support 8 money, cash public assistance and relief. The gross amount of any pensions or annuities 9 (ii) 10 and 50% of railroad retirement benefits. 11 (iii) Fifty percent of all benefits received under 12 the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 301 et 13 seq.), except Medicare benefits. 14 (iv) All interest received from the Federal 15 Government, any state government or any instrumentality 16 or political subdivision thereof. 17 (v) Realized capital gains and rentals. 18 (vi) Workers' compensation. 19 The gross amount of loss-of-time insurance (vii) 20 benefits, life insurance benefits and proceeds, except 21 the first \$5,000 of the total of death benefit payments. 22 (viii) Gifts of cash or property, other than 23 transfers by gift between members of a household, in 24 excess of a total value of \$300. 25 The term does not include surplus food or other (2) 26 relief in kind supplied by a governmental agency or nonprofit organization, property tax or rent rebate, inflation 27 28 dividend, Federal veterans' disability payments or State 29 veterans' benefits. "Opportunity payment." A one-time payment made in accordance 30

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1 with section 4 to an eligible individual.

2 Section 3. Pennsylvania Opportunity Program.

3 The Pennsylvania Opportunity Program is established within 4 the department to provide opportunity payments to eligible 5 individuals in accordance with this act.

6 Section 4. Opportunity payments.

7 (a) Eligible expenses.--The department shall provide a one8 time opportunity payment to an eligible individual for costs
9 incurred by the eligible individual that are related to the
10 COVID-19 pandemic, including:

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(1) Child care or after-school care.

12 (2) Education or workforce training to support career13 development.

14 (3) Rental assistance, mortgage assistance or housing15 repairs.

16 (4) Transportation, including car payments, gasoline and17 transit fares.

18 (5) Utility assistance, including broadband.

19 (6) Health care, including health insurance premiums,20 medical bills and copayments.

(7) Other expenses related to the COVID-19 pandemic as
determined by the department and included in guidelines
developed under section 7.

(b) Deemed eligible.--Costs incurred for any expense under
subsection (a) shall be deemed an expense related to the COVID19 pandemic if incurred for the period beginning March 6, 2020,
and ending one year after receipt of an opportunity payment.

28 (c) Limitations.--

(1) Only one eligible individual per household may
 receive an opportunity payment. The following apply:

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1 For purposes of this paragraph, a household (i) 2 includes an individual, the spouse of the individual and 3 any dependent of the individual.

The limitation under this paragraph does not 4 (ii) 5 apply to unrelated individuals living together.

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An eligible individual may receive an opportunity (2)7 payment not exceeding \$2,000 as follows:

8 (i) If the eligible individual's household income is 9 \$50,000 or less, the amount of the opportunity payment 10 shall be \$2,000.

(ii) If the eligible individual's household income 11 12 is more than \$50,000 and \$80,000 or less, the amount of 13 the opportunity payment shall be \$1,500.

14 Exemption. -- An opportunity payment shall be exempt from (d) taxation for State and local purposes and may not be considered 15 as income when determining eligibility for needs-based 16

assistance, unless prohibited under Federal law. 17

18 Section 5. Application.

19 Development of forms. -- The department shall develop a (a) 20 form for individuals to apply to the department for an 21 opportunity payment. The form shall be posted on the publicly 22 accessible Internet website of the department.

23 (b) Contents of application. -- A completed application under 24 this section must include:

25 The name, address, telephone number and other (1)26 contact information of the applicant.

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The composition of the applicant's household. (2) (3) Proof of eligibility for an opportunity payment,

29 including proof of household income.

An attestation that an opportunity payment shall be 30 (4) 20220SB1349PN1954 - 4 -

used for eligible expenses specified under section 4(a). The attestation shall include an acknowledgment that the department may audit individuals. The department may require any additional documentation to confirm that payments were used to cover eligible expenses.

6 (c) Process.--

7 (1) The department shall develop an application process,
8 including deadlines, for applicants to apply for an
9 opportunity payment.

10 (2) The department shall begin to accept applications
11 from eligible applicants no later than 60 days after the
12 effective date of this subsection.

13 (3) The department shall make opportunity payments to
14 individuals no later than 120 days after the effective date
15 of this subsection.

16 Section 6. Consultation.

17 The department may consult with the Department of Revenue or 18 other Commonwealth agencies to determine income eligibility 19 under this act.

20 Section 7. Guidelines.

(a) Development.--Within 30 days of the effective date of this section, in consultation with the Department of Revenue and the Department of Community and Economic Development, the department shall develop guidelines necessary to implement this act, including guidelines regarding:

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(1) The application process.

27 (2) Eligibility requirements.

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(3) Eligible expenses.

(b) Publication.--The guidelines shall be posted on thedepartment's publicly accessible Internet website at least 30

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1 days before applications are accepted by the department.

2 Section 8. Pennsylvania Opportunity Program Fund.

(a) Establishment.--The Pennsylvania Opportunity Program
Fund is established as a separate fund within the State
Treasury. The money in the fund is appropriated on a continuing
basis to the department for the purpose of making opportunity
payments and paying administrative costs as provided in
subsection (c).

9 (b) Interfund transfer.--In addition to any other money 10 appropriated, transferred or otherwise available to the 11 department for the purpose of making opportunity payments, the 12 sum of \$500,000,000 is transferred from the General Fund to the 13 Pennsylvania Opportunity Program Fund.

14 (c) Administrative costs.--The department may use up to 15 \$500,000 of the money transferred under subsection (b) for 16 administrative costs to implement the Pennsylvania Opportunity 17 Program.

(d) Insufficient money.--If the amount under subsection (b) is not sufficient to make opportunity payments to all eligible individuals, the department shall make payments in a manner determined by the department.

22 Section 9. Audits and fraudulent claims.

(a) Audits.--The department may consult with the Auditor
General on any audit necessary to ensure that the individual is
an eligible individual and that the payment was utilized for
eligible expenses.

(b) Civil penalty.--If an application under this act was filed with fraudulent intent, the application shall be disallowed in full.

30 (c) Criminal penalty.--An applicant, or any person who 20220SB1349PN1954 - 6 -

1	knowingly assisted in the preparation of a fraudulent
2	application, commits a misdemeanor of the third degree and, upon
3	conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding
4	\$2,000 or to imprisonment not exceeding one year, or both.
5	Section 10. Effective date.

6 This act shall take effect immediately.
