AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled 1 "An act relating to the finances of the State government; 2 providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for 3 ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint 4 Underwriting Association, for entertainment business 5 financial management firms, for private dam financial 6 assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for 7 the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, 8 9 bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and other money or property 10 due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 11 including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, 12 the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds 13 and securities belonging to or in the possession of the 14 Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the 15 Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the 16 courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the 17 Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and 18 19 all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 20 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, 21 22 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes 23 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of 24 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of 25 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every 26 department, board, commission, and officer of the State 27 government, every political subdivision of the State, and 28 29 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, 30 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws 31 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or 32 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 33

1 2 3 4	every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the Commonwealth," in emergency COVID-19 response, providing for Food Service, Hospitality and Tourism Economic Emergency Grant Program and for appropriations from the account.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known
8	as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding a section to read:

11	(a) Establishment of programThe county shall establish
12	the program as a countywide competitive grant program and may
13	contract with a third-party entity to administer the grant
14	program under this section.
15	(b) Use of fundsThe money appropriated to counties for
16	COVID Relief - Food Service, Hospitality and Tourism Economic
17	Emergency Block Grant Program shall be used to make grants under
18	this section.
19	(c) Purpose of programThe program shall receive
20	applications and award grants to eligible businesses in
21	accordance with this section.

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1	(f) GuidelinesThe county shall establish guidelines that
2	are consistent with the provisions of this section within 30
3	days of the effective date of this section. The guidelines shall
4	be posted on the county's publicly accessible Internet website.
5	(g) EligibilityTo be considered for a grant the applicant
6	must certify in good faith all of the following as of the date
7	of the application, that the business:
8	(1) Is open or has a plan to reopen in the next 60 days,
9	and does not intend to permanently cease operations within
10	one year of the date of the application.
11	(2) Operates no more than three locations under an
12	identical name within this Commonwealth.
13	(3) Employs no more than 150 full-time equivalent
14	employees per business location.
15	(4) Suffered an adverse economic impact due to COVID-19,
16	which makes this grant request necessary to support the
17	ongoing operations of the business.
18	(5) Will use the grant in accordance with subsection
19	<u>(i).</u>
20	(6) Is one of the following entities:
21	<u>(i) A restaurant.</u>
22	<u>(ii) A bar.</u>
23	(iii) A hotel.
24	(iv) A tourism-focused business.
25	(h) Award of grantsThe award of grants shall be in
26	accordance with the following:
27	(1) The county may award a grant to an eligible business
28	<u>not to exceed \$10,000 but no less than \$5,000.</u>
29	(2) The county shall award grants and make grant
30	payments under this section no later than December 30, 2020.

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1	(3) Priority in the awarding of grants shall be given to
2	eligible applicants that:
3	(i) have not received a loan or grant issued under
4	the authority of the Commonwealth or the Commonwealth's
5	political subdivisions or by the Federal Government under
6	the CARES Act;
7	(ii) were subject to closure by the proclamation of
8	disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6,
9	2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and
10	any renewal of the state of disaster emergency; or
11	(iii) can demonstrate one of the following:
12	(A) A loss of revenue of 50% or more for the
13	period beginning after March 31, 2020, and ending
14	before September 1, 2020, in comparison to the period
15	beginning after March 31, 2019, and ending before
16	<u>September 1, 2019.</u>
17	(B) If the business was not in operation in
18	calendar year 2019, a loss of revenue of 50% or more
19	for the period beginning after March 31, 2020, and
20	ending before September 1, 2020, in comparison to the
21	period beginning after January 31, 2020, and ending
22	before April 1, 2020.
23	(i) Grant restrictionsThe following restrictions shall
24	apply:
25	(1) Grants awarded to an eligible business shall only be
26	used for:
27	(i) Payroll costs.
28	(ii) Payment of interest on mortgage obligation,
29	which may not include any prepayment of or payment of
30	principal on a covered mortgage obligation.

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1	(iii) Payment on a rent obligation.
2	(iv) Payment for utilities.
3	(v) Costs incurred for training and retrofitting the
4	business facilities to operate safely during the COVID-19
5	pandemic.
6	(2) An eligible business that receives a grant and fails
7	to comply with paragraph (1) shall repay the amount of the
8	grant to the county.
9	(3) An eligible business who is awarded a grant under
10	this section is not eligible for any additional grants under
11	the Food Service, Hospitality and Tourism Economic Emergency
12	<u>Block Grant Program.</u>
13	(4) A grant may not be awarded to a business that
14	received funding through the COVID Relief - Statewide Small
15	<u>Business Assistance Program.</u>
16	(j) ExpirationThis section shall expire after the money
17	transferred to the county under subsection (a) has been
18	exhausted or December 31, 2020, whichever occurs first.
19	(k) ReportingThe following shall apply:
20	(1) A county providing grants under this section shall
21	compile a report which shall include the following:
22	(i) A list of all grants awarded under the program.
23	(ii) The name and address of each grant recipient.
24	(iii) The amount of the grant awarded.
25	(iv) The name of the third-party contractor, if any,
26	that processed the grant.
27	(2) The report required under paragraph (1) shall be
28	submitted to the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
29	Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairperson
30	and minority chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of
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1	the House of Representatives by January 31, 2021. The report
2	shall also be posted and maintained on the county's publicly
3	accessible Internet website.
4	(3) A third-party contractor processing grants on behalf
5	of a county under this section shall provide documentation to
6	the Department of the Auditor General, upon request, for
7	purposes of an audit review.
8	(1) ReviewThis section may not be subject to the
9	following:
10	(1) Article II of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.769,
11	No.240), known as the Commonwealth Documents Law.
12	(2) Sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the act of October
13	15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth
14	<u>Attorneys Act.</u>
15	(3) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as
16	the Regulatory Review Act.
17	(m) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
18	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
19	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
20	"Bar." An establishment that primarily serves alcohol for
21	on-site consumption. The term includes a tavern or night club.
22	"COVID-19." The novel coronavirus identified in the
23	proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued by the Governor on
24	March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and
25	any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.
26	"Department." The Department of Community and Economic
27	Development of the Commonwealth.
28	"Eligible business." An entity meeting the requirements of
29	subsections (g) and (i)(3) and (4).
30	"Full-time equivalent employee." The quotient obtained by

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1	dividing the total number of hours for which employees were
2	compensated for employment over the preceding 12-month period by
3	<u>2,080.</u>
4	"Grant." Money awarded under the Food Service, Hospitality
5	and Tourism Economic Emergency Block Grant Program established
6	under this act.
7	"Hotel." A place of business within this Commonwealth having
8	a NAICS designation from the United States Census Bureau within
9	the Accommodation subsector (721) and where accommodation is
10	provided for the public, with or without charge.
11	"NAICS." A classification within the North American Industry
12	Classification System developed for use by Federal statistical
13	agencies for the collection, analysis and publication of
14	statistical data related to the United States economy.
15	"Program." The Food Service, Hospitality and Tourism
16	Economic Emergency Block Grant Program established under this
17	section.
18	"Restaurant." A place within this Commonwealth that receives
19	a NAICS designation from the United States Census Bureau within
20	the Food Services and Drinking Places subsector (722) and where
21	food or drink is served to or provided for the public, with or
22	without charge. The term does not include dining cars operated
23	by a railroad company in interstate commerce.
24	"Tourism-focused business." A for-profit or non-profit
25	business, government or private organization, including a
26	convention center or amusements, as determined by the county.
27	Section 2. Article 1-C of the act is amended by adding a
28	subarticle to read:

30	APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE ACCOUNT
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1	Section	190.2-C.	Definitions.

2	The following words and phrases when used in this subarticle
3	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
4	context clearly indicates otherwise:
5	"Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,
6	2020, and ending June 30, 2021.
7	"Department." The Department of Community and Economic
8	Development of the Commonwealth.
9	Section 190.3-C. Construction with the General Appropriation
10	<u>Act of 2020.</u>
11	All appropriations contained in this subarticle from the
12	General Fund shall be in addition to any appropriation under the
13	act of May 29, 2020 (P.L. , No.1A), known as the General
14	Appropriation Act of 2020, and the act of May 29, 2020 (P.L. ,
15	No.2A), known as the COVID-19 Emergency Supplement to the
16	General Appropriation Act of 2019.
17	Section 190.4-C. Appropriations from the account.
18	(a) Federal appropriationTo the department for the
19	current fiscal year, \$500,000,000 of Federal amounts is
20	appropriated from the COVID-19 Response Restricted Account for
21	COVID Relief - Food Service, Hospitality and Tourism Economic
22	Emergency Block Grant Program. Each county shall receive an
23	amount equal to the population proportion as determined under
24	paragraph (2). The following shall apply:
25	(1) The department shall distribute the funding to
26	counties under this subsection within 10 days of the
27	effective day of this section.
28	(2) For the purposes of this subsection, the population
29	proportion shall be determined as follows:
30	(i) the population estimate of the county; divided

2	(ii) the sum of the population estimates of all
3	<u>counties.</u>
4	(3) For the purposes of this subsection, the population
5	of the county shall be equal to the published estimate by the
6	United States Census Bureau population estimates for calendar
7	<u>year 2019.</u>
8	(b) (Reserved).
9	Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
