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AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 5 laws relating thereto," establishing the Ready to Succeed 6 Scholarship Program; and conferring powers and imposing 7 duties on the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency 8 and the Department of Education. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 12 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 13 section to read: 14 Section 2599.6. Ready to Succeed Scholarship Program. -- (a) 15 The Ready to Succeed Scholarship Program is established within 16 the agency. 17 (b) The agency may use funds appropriated for the purpose of

this section from the General Fund, and may accept donations and

contributions from all public and private sources, including the

- 1 Federal Government, to provide scholarships for defraying the
- 2 <u>necessary expense of residents of this Commonwealth who are</u>
- 3 students pursuing postsecondary education at an institution of
- 4 <u>higher education.</u>
- 5 (c) The agency, in consultation with the Department of
- 6 Education, shall administer and establish quidelines for the
- 7 program.
- 8 (d) The Department of Education shall consult with the
- 9 agency to identify and provide guidelines for student
- 10 eligibility and renewal criteria. Student eligibility, at a
- 11 minimum, shall require all of the following:
- 12 (1) Total annual household income which does not exceed one
- 13 hundred and ten thousand dollars (\$110,000). With each new award
- 14 year, the agency shall annually adjust the total annual
- 15 household income threshold under this paragraph to reflect any
- 16 <u>upward changes in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban</u>
- 17 Consumers (CPI-U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and
- 18 Maryland area.
- 19 (2) At least half-time enrollment in a State-grant-approved
- 20 program of study.
- 21 (3) Demonstration of outstanding academic achievement.
- 22 (4) Compliance with all requirements of the State grant
- 23 program administered by the agency, notwithstanding the
- 24 financial need requirements of the State grant program.
- 25 (e) Scholarship awards shall be established by the agency
- 26 based upon available resources.
- 27 (f) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 28 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 29 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 30 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance

- 1 Agency.
- 2 "Institution of higher education." A postsecondary
- 3 <u>institution that participates in the State grant program, and is</u>
- 4 <u>domiciled and headquartered with its principal physical location</u>
- 5 in this Commonwealth.
- 6 "Program." The Ready to Succeed Scholarship Program
- 7 established under this section.
- 8 <u>"State grant." A grant or scholarship awarded under the act</u>
- 9 of January 25, 1966 (1965 P.L.1546, No.541), referred to as the
- 10 <u>Higher Education Scholarship Law.</u>
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
