1 2	Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to dogs, regulating
2 3	the keeping of dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs and
4	kennels; providing for the protection of dogs and the
5	detention and destruction of dogs in certain cases;
6	regulating the sale and transportation of dogs; declaring
7	dogs to be personal property and the subject of theft;
8	providing for the abandonment of animals; providing for the
9	assessment of damages done to animals; providing for payment
10	of damages by the Commonwealth in certain cases and the
11	liability of the owner or keeper of dogs for such damages;
12	imposing powers and duties on certain State and local
13 14	officers and employees; providing penalties; and creating a Dog Law Restricted Account," in sterilization of dogs and

18	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
19	hereby enacts as follows:
20	Section 1. Section 902-A of the act of December 7, 1982
21	(P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law, added December 11, 1996
22	(P.L.943, No.151), is amended to read:
23	Section 902-A. Spaying or neutering as condition for release of
24	certain animals.
25	No dog or cat may be adopted by a new owner from a releasing

agency unless the animal has been sterilized by a licensed 1 2 doctor of veterinary medicine [or unless the new owner signs an 3 agreement to have the animal sterilized by or under the supervision of a licensed doctor of veterinary medicine and 4 deposits funds with the releasing agency to ensure that the 5 adopted animal will be sterilized. The amount of the deposit 6 required shall be determined by each releasing agency. In no 7 8 event shall the required deposit be less than \$30 for a dog or \$20 for a cat] of the releasing agency. 9

Section 2. Sections 903-A, 904-A, 905-A, 906-A, 907-A, 908-10 A, 909-A, 910-A and 911-A of the act are repealed: 11 [Section 903-A. Refund of deposit upon proof of sterilization. 12 13 The funds deposited with the releasing agency shall be 14 refunded to the new owner upon the presentation of a written 15 statement signed by a licensed doctor of veterinary medicine 16 that the subject animal has been sterilized. However, no refunds shall be made unless the animal was sterilized within 60 days of 17 18 acquisition in the case of a mature animal or, in the case of an 19 immature animal, within 30 days of the date the animal attained 20 the age of six months.

21 Section 904-A. Rules and sterilization agreement.

22 Releasing agencies may establish any additional rules to 23 implement this article, provided that such rules are not in 24 conflict with the provisions or purpose of this article to 25 require the sterilization of all dogs and cats adopted from releasing agencies. The sterilization agreement to be used by 26 27 releasing agencies shall be in substantially the following form: 28 STERILIZATION AGREEMENT 29 This agreement is made and entered into this day of 30 , 19 , by and between:

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1 (Releasing Agency) (New Owner) 2 Name Name 3 Address Address 4 City Telephone City Telephone 5 In consideration of the adoption of this animal and in further consideration of mutual obligations herein, the 6 7 releasing agency authorizes the adoption of the following animal 8 to the new owner: 9 (describe animal)

10 1. The releasing agency agrees to release the above-listed 11 animal into the care of the new owner and refund the new owner's 12 sterilization deposit provided that:

13 (1) The animal is sterilized by a licensed doctor of14 veterinary medicine by (give date).

15 (2) A written statement signed by the licensed doctor of 16 veterinary medicine performing the sterilization that the animal 17 has been sterilized by the stated date is given to the releasing 18 agency.

The new owner accepts the above-listed animal and agrees:
 (1) To have the animal sterilized by a licensed doctor of
 veterinary medicine by (give date).

(2) To provide written evidence to the releasing agency from
the licensed doctor of veterinary medicine performing the
sterilization that the animal has been sterilized by the above
date listed. This agreement shall be binding upon the assigns,
heirs, executors and administrators of the respective parties.
The parties hereto have hereunto set their hands the day and
year first above written.

Extension of time to sterilize. 16 Upon presentation of a written report from a licensed doctor 17 of veterinary medicine stating that the life or health of an 18 adopted animal may be jeopardized by sterilization, the 19 releasing agency shall grant a 30-day extension of the period 20 within which sterilization would otherwise be required. Further 21 extensions shall be granted upon additional veterinary reports 22 stating their necessity. 23 Section 906-A. Exemption from sterilization; refund of 24 deposited funds. 25 Upon presentation of a written report from a licensed doctor 26 of veterinary medicine stating that the adopted animal has 27 already been sterilized or can never be sterilized due to old age or a health condition that would likely result in the death 28 29 of the animal, the sterilization deposit shall be refunded. 30 Section 907-A. 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1 Upon request, the releasing agency shall refund deposited 2 funds to the new owner upon reasonable proof being presented to 3 the releasing agency by the new owner that the adopted animal 4 died before the expiration of the period during which the 5 sterilization was required to be completed.

6 Section 908-A. Forfeiture of deposited funds and adopted dog or 7 cat.

8 Failure of a new owner to comply with provisions of this 9 article shall result in the forfeiture of the deposited funds to 10 the releasing agency. The releasing agency may reclaim the dog 11 or cat from the new owner.

12 Section 909-A. Disposition of forfeited funds; record of 13 accounts.

Funds which have been forfeited by new owners shall be placed 14 15 in an interest-bearing account belonging to the releasing 16 agency. The releasing agency may allocate the unused funds from such account to programs which directly promote, subsidize or 17 otherwise reduce the cost of sterilization of animals of the 18 19 releasing agency. Funds may also be used to provide for the 20 health and welfare of animals being cared for by the releasing agency. The releasing agency shall maintain an accurate 21 accounting of these forfeited funds. 22

23 Section 910-A. Construction of article.

The provisions of this article shall not be construed to require the sterilization of dogs and cats which are being held in releasing agencies which might be claimed by their rightful owners. Further, this article shall not be construed to interfere with municipal ordinances or the policies and programs of releasing agencies that meet or exceed the sterilization requirements set forth in this article.

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1 Section 911-A. Penalty.

Failure to comply with the provisions of this article relating to the sterilization of animals constitutes a summary offense.]

5 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
