8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 328 of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania
10	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read:
11	§ 328. Accountability.

13	(f) Financial analysis
14	(1) Within 180 days of the effective date of this
15	subsection, the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
16	shall prepare a financial analysis of fees, fines, penalties,
17	royalties, Federal and State appropriations and other sources
18	of revenue received by the commission and of expenditures,
19	including annual operating costs investments land nurchases

1	and capital projects to carry out the financial analysis
2	under this subsection:
3	(i) The commission shall provide records, financial
4	statements and other documents reflecting the revenue and
5	expenditures subject to the financial analysis under this
6	subsection.
7	(ii) The commission shall respond to inquiries and
8	requests for information from the Legislative Budget and
9	Finance Committee in a timely manner.
10	(iii) The Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
11	shall include its most recent performance audit under
12	section 522(b) (relating to appropriation and audit of
13	moneys).
14	(2) The financial analysis shall be submitted to the
15	president pro tempore of the Senate, chair of the Game and
16	Fisheries committee of the Senate, speaker of the House of
17	Representatives and the chair of the Game and Fisheries
18	Committee of the House of Representatives. The financial
19	analysis shall be public information.

- 4 <u>commission shall be instituted by the commission.</u>

- 11 Section 3. Section 2314 of Title 34 is amended to read:
- 12 § 2314. Trespass on private property while hunting.
- [(a) General rule. -- Any person who while violating any
- 14 provision of this title or any regulations promulgated under
- 15 this title and who in addition is found to be trespassing as
- defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 3503 (relating to criminal trespass)
- 17 shall be in violation of this section.
- 18 (b) Penalty. -- A violation of this section:
- (1) A violation of this section is a summary offense of
- the fifth degree.
- 21 (2) A second or subsequent violation of this section
- within a seven-year period is a summary offense of the fifth
- degree and may result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt
- or take game or wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth
- for a period of one year.]
- 26 (a) General rule. -- A person, while engaged in hunting or
- 27 <u>furtaking, commits an offense if, knowing that the person is not</u>
- 28 licensed or privileged to do so, the person:
- 29 <u>(1) enters or remains on any land of another without</u>
- 30 authorization to do so, when the land is posted in a manner

- 1 prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the
- 2 person's attention or is fenced or enclosed in a manner
- 3 manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or
- 4 (2) enters or remains on any land of another without
- 5 authorization and defies an order not to enter or to leave
- 6 that has been personally communicated to the person by the
- 7 <u>owner of the land or other authorized person.</u>
- 8 (b) Penalty. -- An offense under this section shall be graded
- 9 as follows:
- 10 (1) A person who violates subsection (a) (1) commits a
- 11 <u>summary offense of the third degree.</u>
- 12 (2) A person who violates subsection (a) (2) commits a
- 13 <u>misdemeanor</u>.
- 14 (3) A person who commits a second or subsequent
- violation of this section within a seven-year period commits
- 16 <u>a misdemeanor, and the second or subsequent violation shall</u>
- 17 result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt or take game or
- 18 wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth for a period of
- 19 one year.
- 20 SECTION 4. TITLE 34 IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ: <--
- 21 § 2315. HUNTING ON SUNDAY WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION.
- 22 (A) GENERAL RULE. -- A PERSON REQUIRED TO SECURE A HUNTING
- 23 LICENSE TO HUNT COMMITS AN OFFENSE IF, WHILE ENGAGED IN HUNTING
- 24 ON SUNDAY, THE PERSON ENTERS PRIVATE LAND WITHOUT OBTAINING
- 25 WRITTEN PERMISSION OF THE LANDOWNER, AN AGENT OF THE LANDOWNER
- 26 OR LESSEE.
- 27 (B) PENALTY.--A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (A) COMMITS A
- 28 SUMMARY OFFENSE OF THE THIRD DEGREE.
- 29 Section 4 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
