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AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for 2 3 stalking; and, in wiretapping and electronic surveillance, 4 providing for prohibited use of mobile tracking devices. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 7 Section 1. Section 2709.1(a), (b), (e) and (f) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 9 § 2709.1. Stalking. 10 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits the crime of stalking when the person [either]: 11 12 engages in a course of conduct or repeatedly commits 13 acts toward another person, including following the person 14 without proper authority, under circumstances which 15 demonstrate either an intent to place such other person in reasonable fear of bodily injury or to cause substantial 16 17 emotional distress to such other person; [or] 18 engages in a course of conduct or repeatedly (2)

communicates to another person under circumstances which

demonstrate or communicate either an intent to place such

2 other person in reasonable fear of bodily injury or to cause

3 substantial emotional distress to such other person[.]; or

- 4 (3) uses a tracking device without proper authority to
- 5 <u>track another person as prohibited under section 5762(a)</u>
- 6 (relating to prohibited use of mobile tracking devices).
- 7 (b) Venue.--
- 8 (1) An offense committed under this section may be
- 9 deemed to have been committed at either the place at which
- 10 the communication or communications were made or at the place
- 11 where the communication or communications were received.
- 12 (2) Acts indicating a course of conduct which occur in
- more than one jurisdiction may be used by any other
- 14 jurisdiction in which an act occurred as evidence of a
- 15 continuing pattern of conduct or a course of conduct.
- 16 (3) An offense committed under subsection (a) (3) may be
- 17 <u>prosecuted in the jurisdiction where the person was tracked</u>
- or in the jurisdiction where the tracking was monitored.

- 20 (e) Application of section. --
- 21 (1) This section shall not apply to conduct by a party
- 22 to a labor dispute as defined in the act of June 2, 1937
- 23 (P.L.1198, No.308), known as the Labor Anti-Injunction Act,
- or to any constitutionally protected activity.
- 25 (2) The provisions of subsection (a) (3) shall not apply
- to conduct authorized under section 5761 (relating to mobile
- tracking devices) or section 5762(b).
- 28 (f) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 29 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 30 subsection:

- 1 "Communicates." To convey a message without intent of
- 2 legitimate communication or address by oral, nonverbal, written
- 3 or electronic means, including telephone, electronic mail,
- 4 Internet, facsimile, telex, wireless communication or similar
- 5 transmission.
- 6 "Course of conduct." A pattern of actions composed of more
- 7 than one act over a period of time, however short, evidencing a
- 8 continuity of conduct. The term includes lewd, lascivious,
- 9 threatening or obscene words, language, drawings, caricatures or
- 10 actions, either in person or anonymously. Acts indicating a
- 11 course of conduct which occur in more than one jurisdiction may
- 12 be used by any other jurisdiction in which an act occurred as
- 13 evidence of a continuing pattern of conduct or a course of
- 14 conduct.
- "Emotional distress." A temporary or permanent state of
- 16 mental anguish.
- "Family or household member." Spouses or persons who have
- 18 been spouses, persons living as spouses or who lived as spouses,
- 19 parents and children, other persons related by consanguinity or
- 20 affinity, current or former sexual or intimate partners or
- 21 persons who share biological parenthood.
- 22 <u>"Tracking device." An electronic or mechanical device that</u>
- 23 permits only the tracking of the movement of a person or object.
- 24 Section 2. Title 18 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 25 § 5762. Prohibited use of mobile tracking devices.
- 26 (a) Prohibition.--Except as authorized under section 5761
- 27 <u>(relating to mobile tracking devices) or subsection (b), a</u>
- 28 person may not:
- (1) intentionally install or place or cause to be
- installed or placed a mobile tracking device by intentionally

Τ	<u>deceptive means; and</u>
2	(2) use the mobile tracking device to track the location
3	of another person without the lawful consent of the person.
4	(b) Exceptions The provisions of subsection (a) shall not
5	apply to the installation, placement or use of an electronic
6	tracking device by any of the following:
7	(1) A law enforcement officer, judicial officer,
8	probation officer, parole officer or employee of the
9	Department of Corrections if the person is conducting
10	official duties in accordance with Federal and State law.
11	(2) The parent or legal guardian of a minor if the
12	parent or legal guardian is tracking any of the following:
13	(i) The minor.
14	(ii) A person authorized by the parent or legal
15	guardian as a caretaker of the minor during any time when
16	the minor is under the person's sole care.
17	(3) A legally authorized representative of an
18	incapacitated or incompetent adult.
19	(4) The owner of a fleet vehicle who is tracking the
20	fleet vehicle.
21	(5) An electronic communications provider if all of the
22	<pre>following apply:</pre>
23	(i) The installation, placement or use of the
24	electronic tracking device is disclosed in the electronic
25	communications provider's terms of use, privacy policy or
26	similar document, which is made available to the
27	<pre>customer.</pre>
28	(ii) The electronic communications provider does not
29	commit willful and wanton misconduct in transmitting,
30	storing or caching electronic communications or messages

- of others.
- 2 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this subsection, the following
- 3 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 4 subsection:
- 5 <u>"Electronic communications provider." Telecommunications</u>
- 6 carriers, commercial mobile service providers and providers of
- 7 <u>information services</u>, including Internet service providers and
- 8 <u>hosting service providers.</u>
- 9 <u>"Fleet vehicle." A motor vehicle that is:</u>
- 10 (1) owned by a single entity and operated by employees
- or agents of the entity for business or government purposes;
- 12 <u>or</u>
- 13 (2) held for lease, rent or sale by a motor vehicle
- dealer for the general public.
- 15 <u>"Tracking device." An electronic or mechanical device that</u>
- 16 permits a person to remotely determine or track the position and
- 17 movement of another person.
- 18 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
