## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 26, 2001 (P.L.755, No.77), entitled "An 1 act establishing a special fund and account for money 2 received by the Commonwealth from the Master Settlement 3 Agreement with tobacco manufacturers; providing for home and 4 community-based care, for tobacco use prevention and 5 cessation efforts, for Commonwealth universal research 6 enhancement, for hospital uncompensated care, for health 7 investment insurance, for medical assistance for workers with 8 disabilities, for regional biotechnology research centers, 9 for the HealthLink Program, for community-based health care 10 assistance programs, for PACE reinstatement and PACENET 11 expansion, for medical education loan assistance and for 12 percentage allocation and appropriation of moneys," in 13 medical assistance for workers with disabilities, further providing for definitions and for medical assistance benefits 14 15 for workers with disabilities and workers with medically 16 17 improved disabilities.

18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

19 hereby enacts as follows:

20 Section 1. The definitions of "worker with a disability" and 21 "worker with a medically improved disability" in section 1502 of 22 the act of June 26, 2001 (P.L.755, No.77), known as the Tobacco 23 Settlement Act, are amended and the section is amended by adding 24 a definition to read: 1 Section 1502. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

6 "Worker with a disability." An individual who meets all of 7 the following:

8 (1) is at least 16 years of age [but less than 65 years
9 of age;] and meets age requirements as established under
10 applicable Federal law;

11 (2) is employed and receiving compensation;

12 (3) is eligible to receive Supplemental Security Income 13 except for earnings and resources that exceed the limit 14 established in section 1905 of the Social Security Act (49 15 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(g)(2)(B));

16 (4) has monthly income below 250% of the Federal poverty 17 income guidelines; and

18 (5) has countable resources equal to or less than19 \$10,000.

20 "Worker with a medically improved disability." An individual 21 who meets all of the following:

(1) is at least 16 years of age [but less than 65 years
of age;] and meets age requirements as established under

24 <u>applicable Federal law;</u>

(2) is employed at least 40 hours per month and is earning at least the applicable minimum wage under section 6 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (52 Stat. 1060, 29 U.S.C. § 206);

(3) was previously a worker with a disability and
participated in medical assistance;

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1	(4) has monthly income below 250% of the Federal poverty		
2	income guidelines; and		
3	(5) has countable resources equal to or less than		
4	\$10,000.		
5	"Worker with job success." An individual who meets all of		
6	the following:		
7	(1) is at least 16 years of age and meets age		
8	requirements as established under APPLICABLE Federal law; <		
9	(2) is earning at least the minimum wage under section 6		
10	of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (52 Stat. 1060, 29		
11	<u>U.S.C. § 206);</u>		
12	(3) has participated in a medical assistance for workers		
13	with disabilities category or a medical assistance for		
14	workers with medically improved disabilities category for the		
15	previous 12 consecutive months;		
16	(4) has monthly income that is more than 250% of the		
17	Federal poverty income guidelines and less than 600% of the		
18	Federal poverty income guidelines; and		
19	(5) may have countable assets in excess of \$10,000 that		
20	have been developed since the individual's initial		
21	eligibility under this subsection.		
22	Section 2. Section 1503 of the act is amended to read:		
23	Section 1503. Medical assistance benefits for workers with		
24	disabilities [and], workers with medically improved		
25	disabilities and workers with job success.		
26	(a) Program establishmentThere is established in the		
27	department a medical assistance purchase program for workers		
28	with disabilities $[and]_{L}$ workers with medically improved		
29	disabilities and workers with job success. Appropriations to the		
30	department from [the fund] <u>all sources of funds</u> for the program		
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1 shall be used by the department to provide medical assistance to
2 a worker with a disability $[or]_{L}$ a worker with a medically
3 improved disability or a worker with job success.
4 (b) Worker with a disability [or], worker with a medically
5 improved disability or worker with job success
6 responsibilities[A worker with a disability or a worker with
7 a medically improved disability seeking to purchase medical
8 assistance benefits shall:
9 (1) Pay to the department or its designee 5% of the
10 worker's monthly income in a manner to be determined by the
11 department.
12 (2) Notify the department or its designee of any change
13 in the worker's monthly income in a manner to be determined
14 by the department.
(3) Failure of a worker with a disability or a worker
16 with a medically improved disability to make payments in
17 accordance with paragraph (1) will result in the termination
18 of medical assistance coverage.]
19 <u>(1) A worker with a disability or a worker with a</u>
20 <u>medically improved disability seeking to purchase medical</u>
21 <u>assistance benefits shall pay to the department or its</u>
22 <u>designee 5% of the worker's monthly income in a manner to be</u>
23 <u>determined by the department. Failure of a worker with a</u>
24 <u>disability or a worker with a medically improved disability</u>
25 <u>to make payments in accordance with this paragraph shall</u>
26 result in the termination of medical assistance coverage.
27 (2) A worker with job success seeking to purchase
28 <u>medical assistance benefits shall pay to the department or</u>
29 <u>its designee 7.5% of the worker's monthly income in a manner</u>
30 to be determined by the department. Failure of a worker with
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1	job success to make payments in accordance with this			
2	paragraph shall result in the termination of medical			
3	assistance coverage.			
4	(3) A worker with a disability, a worker with a			
5	medically improved disability or a worker with job success			
6	shall notify the department or its designee of any change in			
7	the worker's monthly income in a manner to be determined by			
8	the department.			
9	(b.1) PaymentA worker with job success who participates			
10	in medical assistance for workers with disabilities with income			
11	at or above \$75,000 compounded by the cost-of-living increases			
12	granted by the Federal Government under the Social Security			
13	program annually since the year 2000 AND WHO IS seeking to <			
14	purchase medical assistance benefits shall pay to the department			
15	or its designee 100% of the Commonwealth's average cost of the			
16	medical assistance for workers with disabilities program.			
17	(b.2) Determination of eligibilityAssets developed by a			
18	medical assistance for workers with disabilities enrollee who			
19	was made eligible under the job success category will not be			
20	counted in the determination of eligibility for the medical			
21	assistance for workers with disabilities program if the enrollee			
22	loses eligibility in the job success category.			
23	(c) Provision of benefitsUpon receipt of a worker's			
24	payment under subsection (b)(1), the department or its designee			
25	shall provide to the worker medical assistance benefits at the			
26	categorically needy level as defined by the department.			
27	(d) Department responsibilitiesThe department shall:			
28	(1) Administer the medical assistance purchase program.			
29	(2) [Prepare] <u>Annually prepare</u> and submit by November			
30	30[, 2002, and annually thereafter] of each year a report to			
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1	the chair and minority chair of the [Public Health and	<
2	Welfare] <u>HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES</u> Committee of the Senate	<
3	and the chair and minority chair of the Health [and Human	<
4	Services] Committee of the House of Representatives on the	<
5	number of individuals purchasing medical benefits, the	
6	average amount paid for the benefits and any other	
7	information deemed necessary by the department. The annual	
8	report shall be made available for public inspection and	
9	posted on the department's publicly accessible [World Wide	
10	Web site] <u>Internet website</u> .	

11 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
