## AN ACT

- Amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
  Statutes, in weights and measures, providing for fuel and
  diesel fuel tax transparency.

  The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
  hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 3 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes
- 7 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 4187.9. Fuel and diesel fuel tax transparency.
- 9 (a) Labeling.--Each retailer of automotive fuel and diesel
- 10 <u>fuel in this Commonwealth shall label</u>, in a clear and
- 11 conspicuous manner on an automotive fuel dispenser used to sell
- 12 or offer or expose for sale automotive fuel or diesel fuel, the
- 13 following taxes levied to a consumer of automotive fuels or
- 14 <u>diesel fuel:</u>
- 15 <u>(1) Federal liquid fuels tax.</u>
- 16 <u>(2) State liquid fuels tax.</u>
- 17 <u>(3) Federal diesel fuel tax.</u>
- 18 <u>(4) State diesel fuel tax.</u>
- 19 <u>(5) Aggregate Federal liquid fuels tax and State liquid</u>

- 1 <u>fuels tax.</u>
- 2 (6) Aggregate Federal diesel fuel tax and State diesel
- 3 fuels tax.
- 4 (b) Label maintenance. -- The department shall affix and
- 5 maintain a label under subsection (a) in a consistent location
- 6 on a fueling dispenser under this section. The owner or operator
- 7 of a retailer of automotive fuel or diesel fuel in this
- 8 Commonwealth may not be liable for affixing or maintaining a
- 9 <u>fuels tax label under this section.</u>
- 10 (c) Label cost. -- The department may not charge a retailer
- 11 any cost for an initial label or replacement label under
- 12 <u>subsection</u> (a) if the label becomes illegible or otherwise
- 13 <u>unable to be affixed to the fuel dispenser.</u>
- 14 <u>(d) Label design.--The secretary shall promulgate</u>
- 15 regulations necessary for the implementation of this section and
- 16 transmit notice to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
- 17 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. The secretary shall:
- 18 (1) Within 60 days of the effective date of this
- 19 section, design a label that displays, in legible font, the
- 20 current rate of taxes levied to a consumer of automotive fuel
- or diesel fuel under subsection (a).
- 22 (2) Update the label under paragraph (1) with any
- changes to the rate of taxes under subsection (a) within 60
- 24 <u>days of the effective date of the tax rate change and affix</u>
- 25 the label to a fuel dispenser.
- 26 (e) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 27 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 28 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 29 "Diesel fuel." As defined under 75 Pa.C.S. § 9002 (relating
- 30 to definitions).

- 1 <u>"Federal diesel fuel tax." The rate of tax levied under 26</u>
- 2 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 4081(a)(2)(A)(iii) (relating to imposition of tax) on
- 3 diesel fuel as defined in 26 U.S.C. § 4083 (relating to
- 4 <u>definitions</u>; special rule; administrative authority).
- 5 <u>"Federal liquid fuels tax." The rate of tax levied under 26</u>
- 6 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 4081(a)(2)(A)(i) on gasoline as defined in 26 U.S.C. §
- 7 4083.
- 8 "State diesel fuel tax." The aggregate rate of tax levied on
- 9 diesel fuel under 75 Pa.C.S. Chs. 90 (relating to liquid fuels
- 10 and fuels tax) and 95 (relating to taxes for highway maintenance
- 11 and construction).
- 12 <u>"State liquid fuels tax." The aggregate rate of tax levied</u>
- 13 on liquid fuels, as defined under 75 Pa.C.S. § 9002 (relating to
- 14 <u>definitions</u>), <u>under 75 Pa.C.S. Chs. 90 and 95.</u>
- 15 Section 2. All regulations and parts of regulations are
- 16 abrogated to the extent of any inconsistency with the provisions
- 17 of this act.
- 18 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
