AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the Work Experience for High School Students with
- Disabilities Act; imposing duties on the Office of Vocational
- Rehabilitation; and providing for appropriations.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Work
- 8 Experience for High School Students with Disabilities Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Competitive integrated employment." Work in the competitive
- 14 labor market that is performed on a full-time or part-time basis
- 15 in an integrated setting for which an individual is compensated
- 16 at or above the minimum wage, but not less than the customary
- 17 wage and level of benefits paid by the employer for the same or

- 1 similar work performed by individuals who do not have
- 2 disabilities.
- 3 "Integrated setting." With respect to an employment outcome,
- 4 a setting typically found in the community in which an applicant
- 5 or eligible individual interacts with individuals without
- 6 disabilities, other than an individual who is providing services
- 7 to the applicant or eligible individual, to the same extent that
- 8 individuals without a disability in a comparable position
- 9 interact with other persons.
- 10 "Office of Vocational Rehabilitation." The Office of
- 11 Vocational Rehabilitation established under section 7 of the act
- 12 of December 20, 1988 (P.L.1306, No.167), known as the Vocational
- 13 Rehabilitation Act.
- 14 Section 3. Powers and duties of the Office of Vocational
- 15 Rehabilitation.
- 16 The Office of Vocational Rehabilitation shall develop
- 17 connections between local education agencies and public and
- 18 private employers to promote the successful transition of high
- 19 school students with disabilities into competitive integrated
- 20 employment after graduation. In collaboration with officials of
- 21 local education agencies and other public agencies, such as an
- 22 agency taking part in a county mental health or intellectual
- 23 disabilities program, the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation
- 24 shall to the greatest extent possible:
- 25 (1) Provide information for the development of
- individual education plans for high school students with
- 27 disabilities. The office shall, when possible, attend
- individual education plan meetings in person or by
- 29 alternative means, such as video conferences and conference
- 30 calls, when invited by local education agencies.

- 1 (2) Arrange for, monitor and support the placement of
- 2 high school students with disabilities in lawful internships,
- 3 on-the-job training and full-time or part-time work at
- 4 competitive wages in integrated settings with public or
- 5 private sector employers.
- 6 (3) Provide professional guidance relative to job
- 7 coaching services:
- 8 (i) To individuals who are eligible for services at
- 9 the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation.
- 10 (ii) When those services are included in an
- individualized plan for employment by the Office of
- 12 Vocational Rehabilitation.
- 13 Section 4. Construction.
- 14 Nothing in this act shall be construed to reduce the
- 15 obligation under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act
- 16 (Public Law 91-230, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq.) of a local
- 17 education agency or any other agency to provide or pay for any
- 18 transition services that are also considered special education
- 19 or related services and that are necessary for ensuring a free,
- 20 appropriate public education to children with disabilities.
- 21 Section 5. Appropriations.
- 22 For fiscal year 2015-2016, sufficient State funds shall be
- 23 appropriated to ensure that the Federal funds available to the
- 24 Commonwealth through the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation
- 25 under the provisions of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Public
- 26 Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. § 701 et seq.) are matched by the Federal
- 27 Government. In subsequent fiscal years, sufficient State funds
- 28 shall be appropriated to ensure that the funds available to the
- 29 Commonwealth under the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 are matched by
- 30 the Federal Government. The difference between the funding for

- 1 fiscal year 2015-2016 and the amounts appropriated during fiscal
- 2 year 2014-2015 to the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation and
- 3 the Federal funds matched by the State funds shall be earmarked
- 4 and utilized by the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation
- 5 exclusively to carry out the purposes of this act. This section
- 6 shall not apply to a future one-time increase in the State
- 7 appropriation and the matching Federal funds.
- 8 Section 6. Effective date.
- 9 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
