All commissions shall be connected electronically to the SURE system and shall 15 16 maintain their registration records in the system. applicant's digitized or electronic signature. The registration application shall contain the following information; however, the information may be provided on a separate form for voter registration made under section 1323 or 1325:

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7 (iii) Notice that the applicant must be a citizen of 8 the United States for at least one month prior to the 9 next election and a resident of this Commonwealth and the 10 election district for at least 30 days and must be at 11 least 18 years of age by the day of the next ensuing 12 election, unless the individual is at least 16 years of 13 age and preregisters to vote, and has not been confined 14 in a penal institution for a conviction of a felony within the last five years. The notice required in this 15 16 subparagraph shall be in print identical to the 17 declaration under subsection (b).

19 (b) Registration declaration.--

(1) The official voter registration application shall
 contain a registration declaration. On the declaration, the
 applicant shall state all of the following:

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(ii) On the day of the next ensuing election, the
applicant shall be at least 18 years of age[.], unless
the applicant is preregistering to vote in the next
election in which the individual reaches 18 years of age.

30 (a) Department of Health.--A commission shall cancel the 20190SB0214PN0162 - 5 - 1 registration of a registered elector or the preregistration of a preregistrant reported dead by the Department of Health. The 2 Department of Health shall, within 60 days of receiving notice 3 of the death of an individual [18] <u>16</u> years of age or older, 4 send the name and address of residence of that individual to a 5 commission in a manner and on a form prescribed by the 6 department. The commission shall promptly update information 7 contained in its registration records. 8
