AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 12 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 17 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 18 19 commissions shall be determined, " providing for the powers 20 and duties of the Department of Labor and Industry in job 21 creation; and making related repeals. 22 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows:
