AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), entitled "An act relating to tax reform and State taxation by codifying 2 and enumerating certain subjects of taxation and imposing 3 taxes thereon; providing procedures for the payment, collection, administration and enforcement thereof; providing for tax credits in certain cases; conferring powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue, certain 7 employers, fiduciaries, individuals, persons, corporations 8 and other entities; prescribing crimes, offenses and 9 penalties," in historic preservation incentive tax credit, 10 further providing for definitions. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The definition of "qualified taxpayer" in section 14 15 1702-H of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the 16 Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended to read: Section 1702-H. Definitions. 17 18 The following words and phrases when used in this article 19 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 20 context clearly indicates otherwise: * * * 21
- 22 "Qualified taxpayer." Any natural person, corporation,

- 1 business trust, limited liability company, partnership, limited
- 2 liability partnership, association or any other form of legal
- 3 business entity that:
- 4 (1) Is subject to a tax imposed under Article III, IV,
- 5 VI, VII, VIII, IX, XI or XV, excluding any tax withheld by an
- 6 employer under Article III.
- 7 (2) Owns a qualified historic structure.
- 8 The term includes any entity that is exempt from Federal income_
- 9 <u>taxation under 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3) (relating to exemption from</u>
- 10 tax on corporations, certain trusts, etc.) and owns a qualified
- 11 <u>historic structure.</u>

- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
