AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of December 17, 1968 (P.L.1224, No.387), entitled "An act prohibiting unfair methods of competition and unfair or deceptive acts or practices in the conduct of any trade or commerce, giving the Attorney General and District Attorneys certain powers and duties and providing penalties," further providing for dog purchaser protection.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 9.3(a)(2), (b), (c), (d) and (i) of the
10	act of December 17, 1968 (P.L.1224, No.387), known as the Unfair
11	Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law, are amended and the
12	section is amended by adding subsections to read:
13	Section 9.3. Dog Purchaser Protection(a) * * *
14	(2) (i) [A] Except as provided under subsection (b.2)(3) of
15	this section, a health certificate issued by a veterinarian
16	shall certify the dog sold by the seller to be apparently free
17	of any contagious or infectious illness and apparently free from
18	any defect which is congenital or hereditary and diagnosable
19	with reasonable accuracy and does not appear to be clinically

ill from parasitic infestation at the time of the physical
 examination. The health certificate shall include the name,
 address and signature of the veterinarian and the date the dog
 was examined.

[A] Except as provided under subsection (b.2)(3) of 5 (ii) this section, a guarantee of good health issued by the seller, 6 7 and dated and signed by the seller and the purchaser on the date 8 of the sale, warranting that the dog being sold is apparently free of and does not exhibit any signs of any contagious or 9 10 infectious disease, is apparently free from and does not exhibit any signs of any defect which is congenital or hereditary; and 11 does not exhibit any signs of being clinically ill or exhibit 12 13 any signs of a parasitic infestation on the date of the sale. 14 The guarantee of good health shall clearly state in bold type: 15 THIS GUARANTEE DOES NOT WARRANT THAT THIS DOG HAS BEEN EXAMINED BY A VETERINARIAN. THE PURCHASER IS ENCOURAGED 16 17 TO HAVE THIS DOG EXAMINED BY A VETERINARIAN AS SOON AFTER 18 PURCHASE AS IS FEASIBLE.

19 The seller shall also verbally state these facts to the 20 purchaser.

(a.1) A releasing agency shall provide a new owner of a dog
 with a health record for the dog at the time of adoption. The
 health record supplied by the releasing agency shall include the

24 <u>following:</u>

25 <u>(1) The dog's breed. If the breed is unknown or mixed, the</u> 26 health record shall so indicate.

27 (2) The dog's approximate age, if known.

28 <u>(3) The dog's gender.</u>

29 (4) The dog's color and markings.

30 (5) A list of all vaccinations, if known, administered to

1	the dog, the date and type of vaccinations and the name of the	
2	person who administered them, if known, up to the date of	
3	adoption.	
4	(6) A record of any known disease, illness or condition with	
5	which the dog is or has been afflicted at the time of the	
6	adoption.	
7	(7) A record of any veterinary treatment or medication	
8	received by the dog while in possession of the releasing agency	
9	to treat any disease, illness or condition.	
10	(8) The date, dosage and type of any parasitical medicine,	
11	if known, that was administered to the dog.	
12	(9) The name, address and signature of an authorized person	
13	at the releasing agency, along with a statement affirming all of	
14	the information provided in this subsection is true to the best	
15	of the releasing agency's knowledge and belief.	
16	(b) If, within [ten] <u>fourteen</u> days after the date of	
17	purchase, a dog purchased from a seller is determined, through	
18	physical examination, diagnostic tests or necropsy by a	
19	veterinarian, to be clinically ill or [dies] <u>to have died</u> from	
20	any contagious or infectious illness or any parasitic illness	
21	which renders it unfit for purchase [or results in its death],	
22	the purchaser may exercise one of the following options:	
23	(1) Return the dog to the seller for a complete refund of	
24	the purchase price, not including the sales tax.	
25	(2) Return the dog to the seller for a replacement dog of	
26	equal value of the purchaser's choice, providing a replacement	
27	dog is available.	
28	(3) Retain the dog and be entitled to receive reimbursement	
29	from the seller for reasonable veterinary fees incurred in	
30	curing $[or]_{\boldsymbol{L}}$ attempting to cure <u>or treating</u> the affected dog,

subject to the limitation that the seller's liability for 1 2 reimbursement shall not exceed the purchase price, not including 3 sales tax, of the dog. This clause shall apply only if the purchaser's veterinarian determines the dog's illness can be 4 treated [and corrected] by procedures that are appropriate and 5 6 customary. The value of these services is considered reasonable 7 if comparable to the value of similar services rendered by other 8 licensed veterinarians in reasonable proximity to the treating veterinarian. Reimbursement shall not include the costs of the 9 10 initial veterinary examination fee and diagnostic or treatment fees not directly related to the veterinarian's certification 11 12 that the animal is unfit for purchase pursuant to this section. 13 [If, however, the purchaser's veterinarian determines the dog's 14 illness is incurable, only the options in clauses (1) and (2) of this subsection shall apply. 15 16 For the purposes of this subsection, veterinary findings of intestinal and external parasites shall not be grounds for 17 18 declaring the dog unfit for purchase unless the dog is 19 clinically ill or dies due to that condition. A dog shall not be 20 found unfit for purchase on account of injury sustained or 21 illness most likely contracted subsequent to the date of sale.] (b.1) (1) If, within [thirty] <u>ninety</u> days after the date of 22 23 purchase, a dog purchased from a seller is [certified] 24 determined, through physical examination, diagnostic tests or 25 necropsy by a veterinarian [that the dog has or] to have a 26 defect or to have died from a defect which is congenital or hereditary and which [adversely affects or affected the health 27 28 of the animal] <u>renders it unfit for purchase</u>, the purchaser may 29 exercise one of the options as provided in [clauses (1), (2) and (3) of this subsection.] subsection (b) of this section. 30

1 (2) Remedies available under [clauses (1), (2) and (3) of 2 this] subsection (b) of this section shall also apply to 3 replacement dogs. (b.2) (1) A dog shall not be found unfit for purchase for 4 the purposes of subsection (b) of this section because of 5 veterinary findings of intestinal or external parasites unless 6 7 the dog is clinically ill or dies due to the condition. 8 (2) A dog shall not be found unfit for purchase on account of injury sustained or illness most likely contracted subsequent 9 10 to the date of sale. 11 (3) A dog shall not be found unfit for purchase because of a 12 health problem which, in addition to a health certificate or 13 quarantee of good health required under subsection (a) of this 14 section, is separately disclosed by the seller in writing at the time of sale. Such disclosure shall be signed by both the seller 15 and the purchaser at the time of sale and shall be documented in 16 17 the health certificate or guarantee of good health. 18 (c) A veterinarian's certification of illness, congenital or 19 hereditary defects or death shall be necessary for a refund or 20 replacement or to receive reimbursement for veterinary costs if 21 the dog is retained by the purchaser and treated for illness or 22 congenital or hereditary defect as provided in this section. The 23 veterinarian's certification shall be supplied at the 24 purchaser's expense. The veterinarian's certification shall 25 state the following information: 26 The purchaser's name and address. (1)The date the dog was examined. 27 (2) (3) 28 The breed and age of the dog. 29 That the veterinarian examined the dog. subsection (b) of this section or a defect as described in
 subsection (b) of this section which renders it unfit for
 purchase or which resulted in its death.

4 (iii) The precise findings of the examination, diagnostic5 tests or necropsy.

6 (5) The treatment recommended, if any, and an estimate or 7 the actual cost of the treatment should the purchaser choose to 8 retain the dog and seek reimbursement for veterinary fees to 9 cure or attempt to cure the dog.

10 (6) The veterinarian's name, address, telephone number and 11 signature.

Within [two] <u>five</u> business days of a veterinary examination 12 13 which certifies illness, defect or death, the purchaser shall notify the seller of the name, address and telephone number of 14 15 the examining veterinarian. Failure to notify the seller or to 16 carry out the recommended treatment prescribed by the examining veterinarian who made the initial diagnosis until a remedy as 17 18 provided for in subsection (b) of this section is agreed upon 19 shall result in the purchaser's forfeiture of rights under this section. [Subsection (b) of this section shall not apply where a 20 seller who has provided a health certificate issued by a 21 veterinarian discloses in writing at the time of sale the health 22 23 problem for which the buyer later seeks to return the dog. Such 24 disclosures shall be signed by both the seller and purchaser. 25 Where the seller has provided a guarantee of good health, 26 subsection (b) of this section shall apply regardless of whether the seller disclosed the health problem at the time of sale.] 27 28 (d) The refund or reimbursement required by this section 29 shall be made by the seller not later than fourteen days following receipt of the veterinarian's certification that the 30

1 dog is unfit for purchase or has died from a condition defined 2 as unfit for purchase in this section. The certification shall 3 be presented to the seller not later than [five] <u>seven</u> days 4 following receipt thereof by the purchaser.

6 (i) As used in this section:

7 <u>"Adopt" or "adoption" means the transfer of ownership of a</u>

8 dog from a releasing agency to a new owner.

9 <u>"New owner" means a person who adopts a dog from a releasing</u> 10 <u>agency.</u>

11 <u>"Releasing agency" means a releasing agency as defined under</u> 12 <u>section 901-A of the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225),</u> 13 known as the "Dog Law."

"Seller" means a kennel, pet shop operator or other
individual who sells dogs to the public and who owns or operates
a kennel or pet shop which is required to be licensed by the
Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture or the United States
Department of Agriculture. The term shall not include nonprofit
kennels as defined under [the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784,
No.225), known as] the "Dog Law."

"Unfit for purchase" means any disease, deformity, injury, physical condition, illness or any defect which is congenital or hereditary and which [severely affects] <u>has a significant</u> <u>adverse effect on</u> the health of the animal or which was manifest, capable of diagnosis or likely to have been contracted on or before the sale and delivery of the animal to the consumer.

Weterinarian" means an individual licensed under the laws of this Commonwealth or any other state to practice veterinary medicine and surgery.
