AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," providing for Kinesthetic Learning Platform Pilot Program. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 9 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 10 11 article to read: 12 ARTICLE XV-K 13 KINESTHETIC LEARNING PLATFORM PILOT PROGRAM Section 1501-K. Definitions. 14 15 The following words and phrases when used in this article 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 17 context clearly indicates otherwise: "Department." The Department of Education of the 18 19 Commonwealth. "Head Start." A program funded under the Federal Head Start 20

- 1 Act (Public Law 97-35, 42 U.S.C. § 9831 et seq.) and carried out
- 2 by a Head Start agency or delegate agency that provides ongoing
- 3 <u>comprehensive child development services.</u>
- 4 <u>"Integrated kinesthetic learning platform." Educational</u>
- 5 programming that incorporates developmentally appropriate
- 6 physical activity into existing academic settings.
- 7 <u>"Program." The Kinesthetic Learning Platform Pilot Program</u>
- 8 established under section 1502-K(a).
- 9 <u>"School." A public or nonpublic prekindergarten,</u>
- 10 <u>kindergarten or elementary school in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 11 <u>Section 1502-K. Kinesthetic Learning Platform Pilot Program.</u>
- 12 (a) Establishment. -- The Kinesthetic Learning Platform Pilot
- 13 Program is established for the purpose of setting up and
- 14 <u>administering a pilot program to provide integrated kinesthetic</u>
- 15 <u>learning platforms to schools for students in prekindergarten</u>
- 16 through second grade.
- 17 (b) Duties of department. -- The department shall select an
- 18 integrated kinesthetic learning platform that meets the
- 19 following minimum qualifications:
- 20 (1) Uses physical activity to improve academic
- 21 performance and teach according to objective academic
- 22 standards in English language arts and mathematics for
- 23 prekindergarten through second grade.
- 24 (2) Provides educators with simple and automated
- 25 correlation between national and State standards, including
- Pennsylvania academic standards in English language arts and
- 27 mathematics for kindergarten through second grade learners
- and Head Start standards for prekindergarten learners.
- 29 (3) Cost to a school does not exceed \$1,500 per academic
- 30 year.

- 1 (4) Functions as a flexible supplemental resource to
- 2 standards-based content, serving as a method of introduction,
- 3 review and assessment.
- 4 (5) Provides opportunities for differentiated learning
- 5 <u>by students of all learning styles and preferences.</u>
- 6 (6) Allows educators, administrators and parents or
- 7 guardians to track the use of the platform.
- 8 (7) Allows for at-home use by students under proper
- 9 <u>adult supervision.</u>
- 10 (8) Provides supplemental written materials that
- 11 <u>educators can assign to students to supplement lessons.</u>
- 12 (9) Is available on-demand and offers dynamic content
- 13 <u>rather than static lessons.</u>
- 14 (c) Application. -- Schools seeking to administer the program
- 15 shall complete an application to be established by the
- 16 <u>department</u>.
- 17 (d) Allocation.--
- 18 (1) No less than \$250,000 from money appropriated to the
- 19 department shall be allocated annually for the program.
- 20 (2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply during a fiscal year
- 21 in which there is an appropriation to the department for the
- sole purpose of the program.
- 23 Section 1503-K. Reporting.
- 24 (a) Report to department. -- A school selected to administer
- 25 the application shall submit a report to the department no later
- 26 than 60 days after the end of an academic year. The report shall
- 27 include:
- 28 (1) A list of all expenses incurred by the program.
- 29 (2) The number of students who participated in the
- 30 program.

- 1 (3) A survey of the educators administering the program.
- 2 (4) Any other information requested by the department.
- 3 (b) Report to General Assembly. -- The department shall
- 4 compile a Statewide report based on the information submitted
- 5 <u>under subsection (a) and submit a report no later than December</u>
- 6 31 of each year to the chairperson and minority chairperson of
- 7 the Appropriations Committee of the Senate, the chairperson and
- 8 minority chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the
- 9 House of Representatives, the chairperson and minority
- 10 chairperson of the Education Committee of the Senate and the
- 11 chairperson and minority chairperson of the Education Committee
- 12 <u>of the House of Representatives.</u>
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
