## AN ACT

23	Section 405. Duties of Employers and Persons Offering
24	<u>Certain Employment(a)</u> Each employer shall post in a
25	conspicuous place, or places, in his establishment, or

establishments, any printed statement or notice required by the
rules and regulations of the department.

3 (b) A person who offers to an individual any employment as 4 enumerated in section 4(1)(4) of this act shall, unless the

5 person elects to include the employment under section 4(j)(6) of

6 this act, notify the individual that the employment is exempt

7 under this act and that the individual will be ineligible for

8 <u>unemployment compensation benefits.</u>

9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
