AN ACT

Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in departmental powers and 2 3 duties as to supervision, providing for lead testing in children's institutions; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, providing for lead testing in child day care centers and family child care homes. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known 11 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding sections to 12 read: 13 Section 912. Lead Testing in Children's Institutions. -- (a) 14 A person seeking to operate, or to continue to operate, a 15 children's institution shall submit a lead certification from an individual or laboratory accredited by the Department of 16 Environmental Protection that includes the following: 17 18 (1) lead levels in water; and 19 (2) for a facility built prior to 1978, lead levels in

paint, dust and soil. A facility built prior to 1978 shall not

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- 1 be required to test for lead levels in paint if the facility has
- 2 completed a full remediation or abatement of all lead paint and
- 3 has a certification of such from the Department of Environmental
- 4 Protection or an individual or laboratory accredited by the
- 5 <u>Department of Environmental Protection</u>.
- 6 (b) The department shall not permit initial operation of a
- 7 children's institution if the lead certification required under
- 8 <u>subsection</u> (a) has either of the following:
- 9 <u>(1) Lead levels in water that are:</u>
- 10 (i) in excess of the level set by the Environmental
- 11 Protection Agency in the national primary drinking water
- 12 <u>regulations; or</u>
- 13 (ii) in excess of the lead levels found in the Safe Drinking
- 14 Water Program under the Department of Environmental Protection.
- 15 (2) For a facility built prior to 1978, lead levels in
- 16 paint, dust and soil that are in excess of the level set by the
- 17 Environmental Protection Agency through its hazard standards for
- 18 lead in paint, dust and soil.
- 19 (c) The department shall require corrective action for
- 20 continued operation of a children's institution if the lead
- 21 certification required under subsection (a) has either of the
- 22 <u>levels under subsection (b).</u>
- 23 (d) This section shall not affect the department's authority
- 24 to refuse to permit the operation of a children's institution or
- 25 <u>take any other action under any applicable statute</u> or
- 26 regulation.
- 27 <u>(e) The facility shall provide every parent or legal</u>
- 28 quardian who has a child enrolled in a children's institution
- 29 <u>notification of the results of the lead certification under this</u>
- 30 section. In addition, the results of the lead certification

- 1 <u>shall be posted on the department's publicly accessible Internet</u>
- 2 website and, if available, the publicly accessible Internet
- 3 website of the children's institution holding a license from the
- 4 <u>department</u>.
- 5 (f) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 6 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 7 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 8 "Children's institution" means an institution or facility
- 9 that provides care in lieu of parental care given for part of
- 10 the twenty-four hour day to children under sixteen years of age,
- 11 away from their own homes. The term does not include child day
- 12 <u>care furnished in places of worship during religious services.</u>
- 13 Section 1004. Lead Testing in Child Day Care Centers and
- 14 Family Child Care Homes. -- (a) A person desiring to obtain or
- 15 renew a license for maintaining, operating and conducting a
- 16 child day care center or family child care home shall submit a
- 17 lead certification from an individual or laboratory accredited
- 18 by the Department of Environmental Protection that includes the
- 19 following:
- 20 (1) lead levels in water; and
- 21 (2) for a facility built prior to 1978, lead levels in
- 22 paint, dust and soil. A facility built prior to 1978 shall not
- 23 be required to test for lead paint if the facility has completed
- 24 a full remediation or abatement of all lead paint and has a
- 25 certification of such from the Department of Environmental
- 26 Protection or an individual or laboratory accredited by the
- 27 Department of Environmental Protection.
- 28 (b) The department shall not issue an initial license for
- 29 maintaining, operating and conducting a child day care center or
- 30 family child care home if the lead certification required under

- 1 subsection (a) has either of the following:
- 2 (1) Lead levels in water that are:
- 3 (i) in excess of the level set by the Environmental
- 4 Protection Agency in the national primary drinking water
- 5 regulations; and
- 6 (ii) in excess of the lead levels found by the Safe Drinking
- 7 Water Program under the Department of Environmental Protection.
- 8 (2) For a facility built before 1978, lead levels in paint,
- 9 dust and soil that are in excess of the level set by the
- 10 Environmental Protection Agency through its hazard standards for
- 11 <u>lead in paint, dust and soil.</u>
- 12 <u>(c) The department shall issue a provisional license in</u>
- 13 accordance with section 1008 to a person desiring to secure an
- 14 <u>annual renewal of a license for maintaining, operating and</u>
- 15 conducting a child day care center or family child care home if
- 16 the lead certification required under subsection (a) has either
- 17 of the levels under subsection (b).
- 18 (d) The department shall require corrective action for
- 19 continued operation of a child day care center or family child
- 20 care home if the lead certification required under subsection
- 21 (a) has either of the levels under subsection (b).
- 22 (e) This section shall not affect the department's authority
- 23 to refuse to issue or revoke a license in accordance with
- 24 section 1026 or take any other action under applicable statute
- 25 <u>or regulation.</u>
- 26 (f) The facility shall provide every parent or legal
- 27 quardian who has a child enrolled in a child day care center or
- 28 family child care home notification of the results of the lead
- 29 certification under this section. In addition, the results of
- 30 the lead certification shall be posted on the department's

- 1 publicly accessible Internet website and, if available, the
- 2 publicly accessible Internet website of the child day care
- 3 center or family child care home holding a license from the
- 4 <u>department</u>.
- 5 Section 2. Within 30 days of the effective date of an act
- 6 establishing a Lead Superfund within the State Treasury, the
- 7 Department of Environmental Protection shall transmit notice to
- 8 the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the
- 9 Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 10 Section 3. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 11 (1) This section shall take effect immediately.
- 12 (2) The addition of sections 912(b) and (c) and 1004(b),
- 13 (c) and (d) of the act shall take effect upon publication of
- 14 the notice provided under section 2 of this act.
- 15 (3) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 90
- 16 days.
