AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for and reorganizing the 2 conduct of the executive and administrative work of the 3 Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers 5 thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal 6 7 Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain 8 administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining 9 10 the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative 11 departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the 12 salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain 13 other executive and administrative officers; providing for 14 the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of 15 all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain 16 departments, boards, and commissions; providing for judicial 17 administration; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 commissions shall be determined," in powers and duties of the 21 Governor and other constitutional officers, of the Executive 22 23 Board and of the Pennsylvania State Police, providing for the State trooper services contractual program. 24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 26 hereby enacts as follows:
- 27 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
- 28 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
- 29 section to read:

- 1 <u>Section 714. State Trooper Services Contractual Program.--</u>
- 2 (a) A municipality or adjacent municipalities may enter into an
- 3 agreement with the Pennsylvania State Police for State trooper
- 4 <u>service. The municipality or municipalities must agree to pay</u>
- 5 for the State trooper service.
- 6 (b) In order to implement this section, the Commissioner of
- 7 Pennsylvania State Police may enter into agreements with
- 8 boroughs and townships for the furnishing of police protection
- 9 by one or more State troopers on a contractual basis at agreed
- 10 upon hours and locations. The contract price for the services
- 11 shall include only the labor and benefit costs of providing
- 12 police protection, however may not be less than sixty-five
- 13 <u>dollars (\$65) per hour per trooper. Money paid for the police</u>
- 14 services shall be credited to a restricted account and used for
- 15 the express purpose of financing the services for which the
- 16 <u>contract price was paid. For every two thousand hours annually</u>
- 17 contracted one full-time trooper would not be counted in
- 18 determining the total number of officers and enlisted members in
- 19 the Pennsylvania State Police.
- 20 (c) The Pennsylvania State Police shall promulgate rules and
- 21 regulations as may be necessary to implement this program and
- 22 the contractual agreements authorized by this section. The rules
- 23 and regulations shall:
- 24 (1) Require that as a prerequisite to contracting for the
- 25 services of a State trooper, a municipality or municipalities
- 26 shall adopt a resolution or ordinance authorizing the
- 27 <u>contractual arrangement with the Pennsylvania State Police for</u>
- 28 the payment by the municipality or municipalities of the costs
- 29 set pursuant to this section incurred in connection with the
- 30 provision of these services.

- 1 (2) Require State troopers to remain under the direct
- 2 control of the Pennsylvania State Police with supervision to be
- 3 provided by the commanding officer of the field installation
- 4 <u>having jurisdiction over the municipality or municipalities</u>
- 5 contracting for the State trooper services.
- 6 (3) Require that all organizational orders, regulations and
- 7 <u>directives by the Pennsylvania State Police apply with full</u>
- 8 <u>force to the assigned State troopers.</u>
- 9 <u>(4) Require that the commander of the field installation</u>
- 10 <u>shall not remove a State trooper assigned pursuant to this</u>
- 11 contractual program from his area of jurisdiction during
- 12 <u>assigned hours except in cases of emergency. If a State trooper</u>
- 13 <u>is removed</u>, the governing body of the contracting municipality
- 14 or municipalities shall be notified.
- 15 (5) Require State troopers to enforce 75 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 16 to vehicles), criminal laws of this Commonwealth and local
- 17 ordinances relating to public safety pursuant to the agreement
- 18 with the municipality or municipalities.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
