1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13	Amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), entitled "An act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and supervision of insurance carried by such companies, associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and repealing existing laws," in casualty insurance, providing for coverage for anti-obesity treatments; and abrogating a regulation.
14	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
15	hereby enacts as follows:
16	Section 1. The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known
17	as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, is amended by adding a
18	section to read:
19	<u>Section 635.9. Coverage for Anti-Obesity Treatments(a)</u>
20	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all of the following
21	shall be considered compensable items or services under the
22	Commonwealth's medical assistance program:
23	(1) Bariatric surgery and related treatments for obesity and

1	morbid obesity when the prescribing physician has issued a	
2	written order stating that treatment is in accordance with the	
3	patient qualifications and treatment standards provided by the	
4	American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery or the	
5	American College of Surgeons, subject to the following:	
6	(i) Related treatment may include, but not be limited to,	
7	preoperative psychological screening and counseling, behavior	
8	modification, weight loss, exercise regimens, nutritional	
9	counseling and postoperative follow-up, overview and counseling	
10	of dietary, exercise and lifestyle changes.	
11	(ii) The insured shall be at least eighteen (18) years of	
12	age.	
13	(2) An anti-obesity drug when it is included:	
14	(i) in the definition of "covered outpatient drug" under 42	
15	U.S.C. § 1396r-8(k) (relating to payment for covered outpatient	
16	drugs) and subject to 42 U.S.C. § 1396r-8(a)(1); and	
17	(ii) on the Pennsylvania Medical Assistance Statewide	
18	Preferred Drug List authorized under section 459.1 of the act of	
19	June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the "Human Services	
20	Code."	
21	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a health	
22	insurer that issues or renews a health insurance policy	
23	providing benefits for medical or hospital expenses to insureds	
24	residing in this Commonwealth shall provide to the insured under	
25	the health insurance policy coverage for all of the following:	
26	(1) Bariatric surgery and related treatments for obesity and	
27	morbid obesity when the prescribing physician has issued a	
28	written order stating that treatment is in accordance with the	
29	patient qualifications and treatment standards provided by the	
30	American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery or the	
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1	American College of Surgeons, subject to the following:	
2	(i) Related treatment may include, but not be limited to,	
3	preoperative psychological screening and counseling, behavior	
4	modification, weight loss, exercise regimens, nutritional	
5	counseling and postoperative follow-up, overview and counseling	
6	of dietary, exercise and lifestyle changes.	
7	(ii) The insured shall be at least eighteen (18) years of	
8	age.	
9	(iii) An entity subject to this subsection shall provide the	
10	benefits required under this subsection to the same extent as	
11	for other medically necessary surgical procedures and treatments	
12	under the insured's contract or policy with the entity.	
13	(2) An anti-obesity drug approved by the Food and Drug	
14	Administration of the United States Department of Health and	
15	Human Services.	
16	(c) As used in this section:	
17	(1) "Health insurance policy" means the following:	
18	(i) A group or individual health or sickness or accident	
19	insurance policy, subscriber contract or certificate issued by	
20	an entity subject to any one of the following:	
21	(A) Section 630 and Article XXIV of this act.	
22	(B) The act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364), known	
23	as the "Health Maintenance Organization Act."	
24	(C) 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to hospital plan	
25	corporations) or 63 (relating to professional health services	
26	plan corporations).	
27	(ii) The term does not include accident only, fixed	
28	indemnity, hospitality indemnity, limited benefit, credit,	
29	dental, vision, specified disease, Medicare supplement, Civilian	
30	Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Services (CHAMPUS)	
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1	supplement, long-term care or disability income, workers'
2	compensation or automobile medical payment insurance.
3	(2) "Health insurer" means an entity licensed by the
4	Pennsylvania Insurance Department with accident and health
5	authority to issue a policy, subscriber contract, certificate or
6	plan that provides medical or health care coverage that is
7	offered or governed under any of the following:
8	<u>(i) This act.</u>
9	(ii) The "Health Maintenance Organization Act."
10	<u>(iii) 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 or 63.</u>
11	(3) "Insured" means a person on whose behalf an insurer is
12	obligated to pay covered health care expense benefits or provide
13	health care services under a health insurance policy. The term
14	<u>includes:</u>
15	(i) A policyholder, subscriber, certificate holder, member,
16	dependent or other individual who is eligible to receive health
17	care services through a health insurance policy.
18	(ii) All individuals named in a health insurance policy
19	issued by a health insurer.
20	Section 2. The addition of section 635.9 of the act shall
21	apply to health insurance policies offered, issued or renewed on
22	or after the effective date of this section.
23	Section 3. The provisions of 55 Pa. Code § 1121.54(1) are
24	abrogated insofar as they are inconsistent with the addition of
25	section 635.9(a)(2) of the act.
26	Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
