AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 12 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 17 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 18 19 commissions shall be determined, " in administrative 20 organization, further providing for gubernatorial 21 appointments, for terms of office and for deputies. 22 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows: 25 Section 1. Section 207.1(e) and (f) of the act of April 9, 26 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of
- 27 1929, added November 8, 1976 (P.L.1109, No.227), are amended to

- 2 Section 207.1. Gubernatorial Appointments.--* * *
- 3 (e) Notwithstanding the provisions of existing law providing
- 4 for the extension of a term of office until a successor is
- 5 appointed and qualified, for purposes of appointment under
- 6 Article IV, section 8 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, for
- 7 those offices requiring Senate confirmation by this section a
- 8 vacancy requiring appointment or reappointment by the Governor
- 9 shall exist upon [the expiration of the number of years or time
- 10 period specified for said office.] the commencement of the
- 11 Governor's first term of office or immediately upon the
- 12 resignation of the current department head.
- 13 (f) A person, other than one serving until a successor is
- 14 appointed and qualified, nominated by the Governor to a position
- 15 for which Senate confirmation is required by this section shall
- 16 not serve in such position, in any capacity, including as an
- 17 <u>acting department head</u>, nor receive any compensation for serving
- 18 in such position until he has been confirmed by action of the
- 19 Senate or by its inaction as provided by the Constitution of the
- 20 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and his appointment or commission
- 21 thereafter issued by the Governor: Provided, however, That
- 22 nothing contained in this section shall be construed to repeal
- 23 or modify section 213 of this act: And provided further, That
- 24 nothing in this act shall affect the right of an incumbent,
- 25 whose term of office has expired, to continue in his office
- 26 until his successor is appointed and qualified.

- 28 Section 2. Section 208 of the act, amended or repealed in
- 29 part April 28, 1943 (P.L.94, No.52) and October 15, 1980
- 30 (P.L.950, No.164), is amended to read:

- 1 Section 208. Terms of Office. -- The terms of office of the
- 2 persons appointed by the Governor under the preceding section
- 3 shall be as follows:
- 4 (a) [The Secretary of the Commonwealth and the Attorney
- 5 General shall serve during the pleasure of the Governor.] Those
- 6 persons appointed under section 207.1(d)(1) shall serve at the
- 7 pleasure of the Governor during the Governor's initial or
- 8 <u>successive term of office.</u>
- 9 [(b) The term of the Superintendent of Public Instruction
- 10 shall be four years.]
- 11 (c) Except as in this act otherwise provided, the heads of
- 12 other administrative departments, [the Commissioner of the
- 13 Pennsylvania State Police,] the members of independent
- 14 administrative boards and commissions, of departmental
- 15 administrative boards and commissions, and of advisory boards
- 16 and commissions, and departmental administrative officers, shall
- 17 hold office for terms of four years, from the third Tuesday of
- 18 January next following the election of a Governor, and until
- 19 their successors shall have been appointed and qualified[:
- 20 Provided, That the term of the Commissioner of the Pennsylvania
- 21 State Police appointed prior to the third Tuesday of January,
- 22 one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, shall expire upon
- 23 that date, or as soon thereafter as his successor shall have
- 24 been appointed and qualified].
- 25 Section 3. Section 213 of the act, amended June 25, 1947
- 26 (P.L.935, No.390) and November 8, 1976 (P.L.1109, No.227), is
- 27 amended to read:
- 28 Section 213. Deputies. -- The Governor shall appoint and fix
- 29 the compensation of such number of deputy heads of
- 30 administrative departments, except those of the Department of

- 1 Auditor General and Treasury Department, as the Executive Board
- 2 shall approve, who shall, in the absence of the head of such
- 3 department, have the right to exercise all the powers and
- 4 perform all the duties by law vested in and imposed upon the
- 5 head of such department, except the power to appoint bureau or
- 6 division chiefs, or other assistants or employes, and who may,
- 7 at any time, exercise such of the powers and perform such of the
- 8 duties of the head of his department as may be prescribed by the
- 9 head of his department: Provided, however, That any such deputy
- 10 shall not have the right to exercise any power or perform any
- 11 duty which the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 12 requires the head of his department personally to exercise or
- 13 perform.
- 14 Whenever there shall be a vacancy in the office of the head
- 15 of any department, such deputy as the Governor shall designate
- 16 in writing shall exercise the powers and perform the duties of
- 17 the head of the department until the vacancy is filled[.] by a
- 18 person other than a deputy designated under this section. No
- 19 deputy or person may serve as head of the department in any
- 20 capacity for longer than thirty (30) days without the Governor
- 21 <u>nominating a person under section 207.1(d)(1) and in accordance</u>
- 22 <u>with the provisions of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of</u>
- 23 <u>Pennsylvania.</u>
- 24 With the approval of the Governor in writing, the head of any
- 25 department may authorize a named deputy to serve in his stead on
- 26 any board or commission, except the Board of Pardons of which
- 27 such department head is a member ex-officio. One of the Deputy
- 28 Adjutants General shall possess the same qualifications in all
- 29 respects as are required by law for the Adjutant General of the
- 30 Department of Military Affairs.

1 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
