- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in theft and related offenses, further 2 providing for the offense of organized retail theft; 3 establishing the Office of Deputy Attorney General for 4 Organized Retail Crime Theft; and making an appropriation. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 3929.3(b) and (c) of Title 18 of the 8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section 10 is amended by adding a subsection to read: 11 § 3929.3. Organized retail theft. * * * 12 13 (b) Grading. --If the retail value of the stolen merchandise in the

4	(b.1) Office of Deputy Attorney General for Organized Retail
5	Crime Theft
6	(1) The Office of Deputy Attorney General for Organized
7	Retail Crime Theft is established and shall include five
8	prosecuting attorneys to have geographically concurrent
9	jurisdiction in this Commonwealth. The following shall be the
_0	geographic districts of the prosecuting attorneys:
1	(i) District 1 shall include Bucks, Chester,
_2	Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties.
_3	(ii) District 2 shall include Berks, Bradford,
4	Carbon, Columbia, Lackawanna, Lehigh, Luzerne, Lycoming,
. 5	Monroe, Montour, Northampton, Northumberland, Pike,
6	Schuylkill, Snyder, Sullivan, Susquehanna, Tioga, Union,

- 6 (c) Definitions.--The following words and phrases when used
- 7 in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 8 subsection:
- 9 "Merchandise." Any goods, chattels, foodstuffs or wares of
- 10 any type and description, regardless of the value thereof.
- "Merchant." An owner or operator of a retail mercantile
- 12 establishment or an agent, employee, lessee, consignee, officer,
- 13 director, franchise or independent contractor of such owner or
- 14 operator.
- "Organized retail theft enterprise." A corporation,
- 16 partnership or any other type of association, whether or not
- 17 legally formed, operated for the purpose of engaging in
- 18 violations of the provisions of section 3925 (relating to
- 19 receiving stolen property) or 3929 (relating to retail theft)
- 20 with intent to resell or re-enter the merchandise into commerce.
- 21 "Retail value." A merchant's stated or advertised price of
- 22 merchandise. If merchandise is not traceable to a specific
- 23 merchant, the stated or advertised price of the merchandise by
- 24 merchants in the same geographical region.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
