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AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," providing for Pennsylvania student journalism protection; and abrogating regulations. 5 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 10 11 article to read: 12 ARTICLE XV-N 13 PENNSYLVANIA STUDENT JOURNALISM PROTECTION Section 1501-N. Scope of article. 14 15 This article relates to the provision of free speech rights 16 for student journalists in school media. 17 Section 1502-N. Definitions. The following words and phrases when used in this article 18 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 19

- 1 "School entity." A school district, charter school, cyber
- 2 charter school, private school, nonpublic school, intermediate
- 3 unit or area career and technical school operating within this
- 4 Commonwealth.
- 5 <u>"School official." A superintendent, principal or the</u>
- 6 <u>designee of the superintendent or principal.</u>
- 7 <u>"School-sponsored media."</u> Any material that is prepared,
- 8 <u>substantially written</u>, <u>published or broadcast by a student</u>
- 9 journalist at a school entity.
- 10 "School-sponsored media program." A journalism program or
- 11 class offered by a school entity that produces school-sponsored
- 12 media.
- 13 <u>"Student editor." A student journalist appointed by the</u>
- 14 student-media advisor.
- 15 "Student journalist." A student who gathers, compiles,
- 16 writes, edits, photographs, records, illustrates or prepares
- 17 information for dissemination in school-sponsored media.
- 18 "Student-media advisor." An individual who meets all of the
- 19 following criteria:
- 20 (1) The individual is employed, appointed or designated
- 21 <u>by a school entity to supervise or provide instruction</u>
- 22 <u>relating to school-sponsored media.</u>
- 23 (2) The individual is not a student currently enrolled
- 24 <u>at the school entity.</u>
- 25 <u>Section 1503-N. Free speech rights for student journalists.</u>
- 26 (a) Policies.--Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, a
- 27 <u>school entity that has a school-sponsored media program on or</u>
- 28 after the effective date of this subsection shall adopt policies
- 29 or amend the school entity's existing policies for the purpose
- 30 of complying with this article. The policies shall include the

- 1 rights and responsibilities of student editors, student
- 2 journalists and student-media advisors in accordance with this
- 3 article and 22 Pa. Code § 12.9 (relating to freedom of
- 4 <u>expression</u>).
- 5 (b) Unauthorized expression. -- In accordance with the
- 6 regulations promulgated by 22 Pa. Code § 12.9, a form of student
- 7 <u>expression shall not be authorized or protected by a school</u>
- 8 entity's policies if the form of student expression is found to
- 9 be any of the following:
- 10 (1) Libelous, slanderous or obscene.
- 11 (2) An unwarranted invasion of privacy.
- 12 (3) Violating Federal or State law.
- 13 (4) Inciting students to commit an unlawful act or
- 14 <u>violate the school entity's policies.</u>
- 15 (5) Materially and substantially disrupting the orderly
- operation of the school entity.
- 17 Section 1504-N. Limitations on school officials and school
- 18 <u>entities.</u>
- 19 (a) Publications and broadcasts. -- A school official shall be
- 20 prohibited from any of the following:
- 21 (1) Participating in the approval of school-sponsored
- 22 media before the publication or broadcast of the school-
- 23 <u>sponsored media in accordance with this article. The approval</u>
- for a publication or broadcast of school-sponsored media
- 25 <u>shall be granted solely by a student editor under section</u>
- 1505-N(c).
- 27 (2) Serving as a member of the school-sponsored media
- 28 program.
- 29 (b) Media facilities.--A school entity may not limit access
- 30 of a student journalist to the school entity's student media

- 1 <u>facilities if the student journalist's use of the media</u>
- 2 facilities will not result in an unauthorized and unprotected
- 3 form of student expression as specified under section 1503-N(b).
- 4 <u>Section 1505-N. School-sponsored media program.</u>
- 5 (a) Content selection. -- Subject to the limitations of a
- 6 <u>school entity's policies</u>, a student editor shall approve, reject
- 7 <u>or exclude all content of school-sponsored media publications</u>
- 8 and broadcasts and oversee the operation of the school-sponsored
- 9 <u>media program.</u>
- 10 (b) Student-media advisors.--A student-media advisor shall
- 11 act solely as an educator and consultant for student journalists
- 12 during the school-sponsored media publication and broadcast
- 13 process.
- 14 (c) Approval process.--School-sponsored media shall be
- 15 submitted to the student editor for approval before the school-
- 16 sponsored media is published or broadcast. The student editor
- 17 shall determine if the school-sponsored media violates the
- 18 school entity's policies. If the student editor determines that
- 19 the school-sponsored media violates the school entity's
- 20 policies, the school-sponsored media may not be published or
- 21 broadcast. The student editor may exclude school-sponsored media
- 22 from publication or broadcast on the basis of limited available
- 23 space or time within the publication or broadcast.
- 24 (d) Rejection or exclusion. -- A student editor shall provide
- 25 a written explanation for the rejection or exclusion of school-
- 26 sponsored media prepared by a student journalist for a
- 27 publication or broadcast.
- 28 (e) Media law training.--Beginning with the 2023-2024 school
- 29 year and each school year thereafter, student journalists, in
- 30 conjunction with the student-media advisor, may conduct a lesson

- 1 in media law for student journalists before the student
- 2 journalists participate in the school-sponsored media program.
- 3 The lesson shall notify the student journalists of their rights
- 4 <u>as journalists under this article and demonstrate examples of</u>
- 5 <u>school-sponsored media that violate the school entity's</u>
- 6 policies. Nothing in this subsection may be construed to create
- 7 <u>additional expenses for a school entity to conduct the lesson.</u>
- 8 (f) Official statements.--School-sponsored media shall be
- 9 <u>considered a form of student expression. School-sponsored media</u>
- 10 may not be considered an official statement from the school
- 11 <u>entity</u>.
- 12 (g) Construction. -- Nothing in this section may be construed
- 13 to prevent a student editor from exercising action to cease the
- 14 publication or broadcast of school-sponsored media that is an
- 15 unauthorized and unprotected form of student expression as
- 16 specified under section 1503-N(b).
- 17 Section 1506-N. Protections for student-media advisors.
- 18 A student-media advisor may not, under any circumstances, be
- 19 <u>dismissed</u>, suspended, disciplined, reassigned or transferred by
- 20 a school official for any of the following actions:
- 21 (1) Taking reasonable and appropriate action to protect
- 22 a student journalist engaging in conduct established under
- 23 <u>the school entity's policies.</u>
- 24 (2) Refusing to infringe on the conduct by a student
- 25 journalist that is protected by the school entity's policies,
- the First Amendment of the Constitution of the United States
- 27 or section 7 of Article I of the Constitution of
- 28 Pennsylvania.
- 29 Section 2. All regulations and parts of regulations are
- 30 abrogated insofar as they are inconsistent with the addition of

- 1 Article XV-N of the act.
- 2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
