AN ACT

Amending the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), entitled "A supplement to the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), 2 entitled 'An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct 3 of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 9 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 19 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 commissions shall be determined, 'implementing the addition of section 4.1 to Article IV of the Constitution of 21 22 23 Pennsylvania; establishing the Office of Attorney General elected by the citizens and setting forth powers and duties 24 of the Attorney General; creating an Office of General 25 Counsel and providing for legal services for Commonwealth 26 27 agencies; transferring, reorganizing or reconstituting certain boards, commissions and agencies; placing certain 28 29 duties upon the courts and district attorneys; repealing 30 certain acts and parts of acts and making appropriations," in Office of Attorney General, further providing for legal 31 advice and civil matters and for criminal prosecutions. 32

- 1 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 2 hereby enacts as follows:
- 3 Section 1. Section 204(c) of the act of October 15, 1980
- 4 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act, is
- 5 amended to read:
- 6 Section 204. Legal advice and civil matters.
- 7 * * *
- 8 (c) Civil litigation; collection of debts.--The Attorney
- 9 General shall represent the Commonwealth and all Commonwealth
- 10 agencies and upon request, the Departments of Auditor General
- 11 and State Treasury and the Public Utility Commission in any
- 12 action brought by or against the Commonwealth or its agencies,
- 13 and may intervene in any other action, including those involving
- 14 charitable bequests and trusts or the constitutionality of any
- 15 statute. The Attorney General may investigate conduct that may
- 16 constitute a violation of the act of October 27, 1955 (P.L.744,
- 17 No.222), known as the "Pennsylvania Human Relations Act," when
- 18 the Attorney General determines that the matter is of Statewide
- 19 importance. In conducting an investigation of conduct that may
- 20 constitute a violation of the "Pennsylvania Human Relations
- 21 Act," the Attorney General may subpoena witness testimony,
- 22 <u>documents and other evidence relevant to the investigation and</u>
- 23 may invoke the aid of a court of competent jurisdiction to issue
- 24 an order requiring a subpoenaed person to comply. If the
- 25 Attorney General determines that a violation of the
- 26 "Pennsylvania Human Relations Act" occurred or is occurring, the
- 27 Attorney General may file an action in a court of jurisdiction
- 28 and shall represent the Commonwealth and its citizens in such
- 29 <u>action where a violation of the "Pennsylvania Human Relations</u>
- 30 Act" and any other civil rights law of the United States or the

- 1 <u>Commonwealth is involved.</u> The Attorney General shall represent
- 2 the Commonwealth and its citizens in any action brought for
- 3 violation of the antitrust laws of the United States and the
- 4 Commonwealth. The Attorney General shall collect, by suit or
- 5 otherwise, all debts, taxes and accounts due the Commonwealth
- 6 which shall be referred to and placed with the Attorney General
- 7 for collection by any Commonwealth agency; the Attorney General
- 8 shall keep a proper docket or dockets, duly indexed, of all such
- 9 claims, showing whether they are in litigation and their nature
- 10 and condition. The Attorney General may, upon determining that
- 11 it is more efficient or otherwise is in the best interest of the
- 12 Commonwealth, authorize the General Counsel or the counsel for
- 13 an independent agency to initiate, conduct or defend any
- 14 particular litigation or category of litigation in his stead.
- 15 The Attorney General shall approve all settlements over such
- 16 maximum amounts as he shall determine arising out of claims
- 17 brought against the Commonwealth pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 5110.

- 19 Section 2. Section 205(b) of the act is amended, subsection
- 20 (a) is amended by adding a paragraph and the section is amended
- 21 by adding a subsection to read:
- 22 Section 205. Criminal prosecutions.
- 23 (a) Prosecutions. -- The Attorney General shall have the power
- 24 to prosecute in any county criminal court the following cases:
- 25 * * *
- 26 (9) Criminal charges involving ethnic intimidation as
- 27 provided for in 18 Pa.C.S. § 2710 (relating to ethnic
- 28 intimidation) and criminal charges under 18 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 29 to crimes and offenses) for an offense involving conduct that
- 30 may constitute a violation of the act of October 27, 1955

- 1 (P.L.744, No.222), known as the "Pennsylvania Human Relations
- 2 Act."
- 3 (b) Concurrent jurisdiction to prosecute. -- The Attorney
- 4 General shall have the concurrent prosecutorial jurisdiction
- 5 with the district attorney for cases arising under subsection
- 6 (a)(1), (2) [and], (6) and (9) and may refer to the district
- 7 attorney with his consent any violation or alleged violation of
- 8 the criminal laws of the Commonwealth which may come to his
- 9 notice.
- 10 (b.1) Assistance in ethnic intimidation cases. -- Upon the
- 11 request of a district attorney who lacks the resources to
- 12 conduct an adequate investigation or the prosecution of a
- 13 criminal case or matter involving ethnic intimidation as
- 14 provided for in 18 Pa.C.S. § 2710, the Attorney General, in lieu
- 15 of assuming jurisdiction over the investigation or prosecution
- 16 under subsection (a) (3), may provide technical, forensic,
- 17 prosecutorial or any other form of assistance to the district
- 18 attorney in the investigation or the prosecution of the criminal
- 19 case or matter.

- 21 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
