AN ACT

- 1 Providing for health insurance coverage requirements for stage 2 four, advanced metastatic cancer.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Fair Access
- 7 to Cancer Treatment Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Enrollee." A policyholder, subscriber, covered person or
- 13 other individual who is entitled to receive health care services
- 14 under a health insurance plan POLICY.
- 15 "Health insurance carrier." An entity that offers or issues
- 16 a health insurance plan POLICY and is subject to any of the

- 2 (1) The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as
- 3 The Insurance Company Law of 1921, INCLUDING SECTION 630 AND <--
- 4 ARTICLE XXIV OF THE INSURANCE COMPANY LAW OF 1921.
- 5 (2) The act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364),
- 6 known as the Health Maintenance Organization Act.
- 7 (3) 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to hospital plan
- 8 corporations) or 63 (relating to professional health services
- 9 plan corporations).
- 10 "Health insurance plan POLICY." A policy, contract, <--
- 11 certificate or agreement offered or issued, ISSUED OR RENEWED by <--
- 12 a health insurance carrier to provide for the costs of COVERAGE <--
- 13 FOR health care services. The term does not include the
- 14 following types of policies:
- 15 (1) Accident only.
- 16 (2) Limited benefit.
- 17 (3) Credit.
- 18 (4) Vision.
- 19 (5) Dental.
- 20 (6) Specified disease.
- 21 (7) Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed
- 22 Services (CHAMPUS) supplement.
- 23 (8) Long-term care or disability income.
- 24 (9) Workers' compensation.
- 25 (10) Automobile medical payment.
- 26 (11) Fixed indemnity.
- 27 (12) HOSPITAL INDEMNITY.
- 28 (13) MEDICARE SUPPLEMENT.
- "Stage four, advanced metastatic cancer." Cancer that has
- 30 spread from the primary or original site of the cancer to nearby

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- 1 tissues, lymph nodes or other areas or parts of the body.
- 2 Section 3. Utilization management for stage four, advanced
- 3 metastatic cancer drugs.
- 4 A health insurance carrier or health insurance plan POLICY <--
- 5 that, directly or indirectly, covers the treatment of stage
- 6 four, advanced metastatic cancer shall MAY not require an <--
- 7 enrollee to first fail to successfully respond to a different
- 8 drug, or prove a history of failure in use of a different drug,
- 9 before providing coverage for a COVERED drug TO WHICH BOTH OF <--
- 10 THE FOLLOWING APPLY:
- 11 (1) THE DRUG IS approved by the United States Food and <--
- 12 Drug Administration; and
- 13 (2) the use of which is consistent THE DRUG IS <--
- 14 CONSISTENT WITH ITS FDA-APPROVED INDICATION AND with the best
- 15 CLINICAL practices for the treatment of stage four, advanced <--
- 16 metastatic cancer.
- 17 Section 4. Applicability.
- 18 This act shall apply to insurance plans issued, delivered or <--
- 19 renewed on or after the effective date of this section. AS
- 20 FOLLOWS:
- 21 (1) FOR A HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY FOR WHICH EITHER RATES
- 22 OR FORMS ARE REQUIRED TO BE FILED WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT
- 23 OR THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT, THIS ACT SHALL APPLY TO ANY
- 24 POLICY FOR WHICH A RATE OR FORM IS FIRST FILED ON OR AFTER
- 25 180 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT.
- 26 (2) FOR A HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY FOR WHICH NEITHER
- 27 RATES NOR FORMS ARE REQUIRED TO BE FILED WITH THE FEDERAL
- 28 GOVERNMENT OR THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT, THIS ACT SHALL APPLY
- 29 TO ANY POLICY ISSUED OR RENEWED ON OR AFTER 180 DAYS AFTER
- 30 THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT.

- 1 Section 5. Effective date.
- 2 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
