1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of June 6, 1980 (P.L.197, No.57), entitled "An act regulating the licensure and practice of optometry, making repeals and providing penalties," further providing for definitions; repealing provisions related to AND FOR approval of drugs; providing for imaging test; and further providing for exemptions and exceptions AND FOR VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES; AND PROVIDING FOR INSURANCE BILLING CODES.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. The definitions of "examination and diagnosis,"
11	"optometrist" and "practice of optometry" in section 2 of the
12	act of June 6, 1980 (P.L.197, No.57), known as the Optometric
13	Practice and Licensure Act, are amended to read:
14	Section 2. Definitions.
15	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
16	have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
17	meanings given to them in this section:
18	* * *
19	"Examination and diagnosis." Any examination or diagnostic

20 means or method compatible with optometric education and

- 1 professional competence. The term shall encompass the use of
- 2 pharmaceutical agents approved by the Food and Drug
- 3 Administration and published in the Code of Federal Regulations
- 4 for diagnostic purposes [classified as], including, but not
- 5 <u>limited to, miotics, mydriatics, cycloplegics, topical</u>
- 6 anesthetics and dyes when applied topically to the eye, [which
- 7 pharmaceutical agents shall be approved by the Secretary of
- 8 Health as provided in section 4.3 and,] subject to the rules and
- 9 regulations of the board, provided however that with respect to
- 10 optometrists licensed before March 1, 1974, only such
- 11 optometrists who have satisfactorily completed a course in
- 12 pharmacology as it applies to optometry, with particular
- 13 emphasis on the topical application of diagnostic pharmaceutical
- 14 agents to the eye, approved by the board shall be permitted to
- 15 use diagnostic pharmaceutical agents topically in the practice
- 16 of optometry.
- 17 * * *
- 18 "Optometrist." Any person who, following formal and
- 19 recognized training in the art and science of optometry has
- 20 received a doctor of optometry degree from an accredited
- 21 institution and is qualified to seek or has acquired a license
- 22 to practice the profession of optometry. An optometrist shall be
- 23 identified either by "Doctor of Optometry," ["O.D.," or "Dr."
- 24 followed by "Optometrist] "O.D." or "Doctor."
- 25 "Practice of optometry."
- 26 (1) The use of any and all means or methods for the
- examination, diagnosis and treatment of <u>all</u> conditions of the
- human visual system, including all conditions of the anterior
- 29 segment of the human eye applicable to this act₇. [and shall <--
- include the examination for, and adapting and fitting of, any

1	and all kinds and types of lenses including contact lenses.]
2	THE TERM SHALL INCLUDE:
3	(I) THE EXAMINATION FOR, AND ADAPTING AND FITTING
4	OF, ANY AND ALL KINDS AND TYPES OF LENSES, INCLUDING
5	CONTACT LENSES.
6	(II) THE ADMINISTRATION AND PRESCRIPTION OF ALL
7	LEGEND AND NONLEGEND DRUGS APPROVED BY THE BOARD IN
8	SECTION 4.3 FOR THE TREATMENT OF DISEASES AND CONDITIONS
9	OF THE EYE AND ADNEXA, INCLUDING CODEINE AND HYDROCODONE
10	COMBINATIONS WHICH WERE RECLASSIFIED FROM SCHEDULE III TO
11	SCHEDULE II PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
12	SUBPARAGRAPH. THE PRESCRIPTION OF SCHEDULE II CONTROLLED
13	SUBSTANCES CONTAINING CODEINE AND HYDROCODONE
14	COMBINATIONS MAY NOT EXCEED A 72-HOUR SUPPLY.
15	(III) THE REMOVAL OF SUPERFICIAL FOREIGN BODIES.
16	(IV) THE DRAINING OF SUPERFICIAL CYSTS OF THE
17	EYELIDS.
18	(V) EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTORS FOR ANAPHYLAXIS.
19	(VI) THE ORDERING OF IMAGING TESTS APPROPRIATE FOR
20	DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT OF A DISEASE OR CONDITION OF THE
21	HUMAN VISUAL SYSTEM.
22	(VII) THE TREATMENT OF GLAUCOMA.
23	[(2) The administration and prescription of legend and
24	nonlegend drugs as approved by the Secretary of Health as
25	provided in section 4.3 for treatment of the eye, the
26	eyelids, the lacrimal system and the conjunctiva and the
27	removal of superficial foreign bodies from the ocular surface
28	and adnexa so long as treatment of diseases or conditions of
29	the visual system, other than glaucoma, as authorized under
30	this paragraph shall not continue beyond six weeks from the

Τ	initiation of treatment unless the prescribing optometrist
2	documents consultation with a licensed physician. As used in
3	this paragraph, the initiation of treatment may, but need
4	not, include the prescription or administration of
5	pharmaceutical agents for therapeutic purposes.
6	(3) The term shall not include:
7	(i) surgery, including, but not limited to, laser
8	surgery; the use of lasers for therapeutic purposes; and
9	the use of injections in the treatment of ocular disease;
10	(ii) the use of Schedule I and Schedule II
11	controlled substances;
12	(iii) treatment of systemic disease; and
13	(iv) the treatment of glaucoma, except that
14	optometrists may use all topical pharmaceutical agents in
15	the treatment of primary open angle glaucoma, exfoliation
16	glaucoma and pigmentary glaucoma.]
17	(4) The administration and prescription of all legend <
18	and nonlegend drugs approved by the Commonwealth for the
19	treatment of ocular conditions. The term shall include the
20	use of nonopioid analgesic and all legend and nonlegend drugs
21	approved by the Food and Drug Administration and published in
22	the Code of Federal Regulations necessary and applicable for
23	the treatment of diseases and conditions of the eye and the
24	adnexa, including the removal of foreign bodies, drainage of
25	superficial cysts of the eyelids, injection for anaphylaxis
26	and into the upper and lower eyelids and into preplaced
27	portals for the delivery of pharmaceuticals for purpose of
28	treating diseases and conditions of the anterior segment. As
29	used in this paragraph, the initiation of treatment shall
30	include the prescription or administration of pharmaceutical

Τ	agents by any means, methods or delivery systems.	
2	(5) (4) The term shall not include:	<
3	(i) Surgery with a scalpel or scissors, refractive	
4	or therapeutic surgery with a laser and surgery with a	
5	croyoprobe. An insurance procedure or billing code may	<
6	not be used to define or interpret a definition of	
7	surgery.	
8	(ii) Injection into the globe.	
9	(iii) The use of Schedule I and Schedule II	
10	controlled substances, except for the use of codeine and	
11	hydrocodone combinations which were reclassified from	
12	Schedule III to Schedule II prior to the effective date	
13	of this subparagraph and any drugs approved by the	
14	Commonwealth under this act BOARD IN SECTION 4.3 for the	<
15	treatment of ocular disease.

19	Section 2. Section 4.3 of the act is repealed AMENDED TO	<

21	+Section 4.3. Approval of drugs.	<
22	Drugs shall be approved as follows:	
23	(1) All drugs currently approved by the Secretary of	
24	Health and in use in the practice of optometry on the	
25	effective date of this section shall be deemed approved under	
26	this section.	
27	[(2) Within 90 days of the effective date of this	<
28	section, the board shall submit a list of drugs authorized	
29	under this act to the Secretary of Health, who, in	
30	consultation with the Physician General shall approve or	

- disapprove for good cause each drug. Upon failure of the
- 2 Secretary of Health to act within 90 days of receipt of the
- list of drugs, the drugs shall be deemed approved for use
- 4 under this act.
- 5 (3) The State Board of Optometry shall provide the
- 6 Secretary of Health with lists of additional drugs for use
- 7 under this act after such drugs are approved by the Food and
- Drug Administration, as published in the Code of Federal
- 9 Regulations. The Secretary of Health, in consultation with
- the Physician General, shall approve or disapprove for good
- cause any such drug within 90 days of the receipt of the
- 12 list. Upon failure of the Secretary of Health to act within
- 90 days, the drugs shall be deemed approved for use under
- this act.
- 15 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read: <--
- 16 <u>Section 4.4. Imaging test.</u>
- An optometrist may order an imaging test appropriate for
- 18 diagnosis and treatment of a disease or condition of the human
- 19 <u>visual system.</u>
- 20 (4) ON AND AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS PARAGRAPH, <--
- 21 THE BOARD MAY APPROVE DRUGS FOR USE IN THE PRACTICE OF
- 22 OPTOMETRY FOR THE TREATMENT OF DISEASES AND CONDITIONS OF THE
- 23 EYE AND THE ADNEXA AFTER THE DRUGS ARE APPROVED BY THE FOOD
- 24 AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION, AS PUBLISHED IN THE CODE OF FEDERAL
- 25 REGULATIONS.

- 29 (b) The board shall permit externs, who are [fourth year]
- 30 optometric students, to perform procedures and tests for the

- 2 supervision and control of an optometrist licensed in this
- 3 Commonwealth. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed
- 4 to entitle an extern to practice optometry.

- 8 SECTION 8. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

- 10 (A.1) IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR AN OPTOMETRIST TO ADVERTISE A
- 11 SERVICE PROHIBITED UNDER THIS ACT. A PERSON CONVICTED OF
- 12 VIOLATING THIS SUBSECTION COMMITS A SUMMARY OFFENSE AND SHALL,
- 13 FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, BE SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$500.
- 14 FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, THE BOARD MAY IMPOSE A
- 15 SUSPENSION OF THE PERSON'S LICENSE FOR UP TO 30 DAYS, IN
- 16 ADDITION TO THE FINE.

- 19 SECTION 10.1. INSURANCE BILLING CODES.
- 20 AN INSURANCE BILLING CODE MAY NOT BE USED TO DEFINE OR
- 21 INTERPRET A PROCEDURE PERFORMED BY AN OPTOMETRIST AS SURGERY.
- 22 Section 5 6. This act shall take effect in 60 days. <--
