Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

Statutes, in Pennsylvania Game Commission, further providing for organization of commission; in game or wildlife 3 protection, further providing for report to commission 4 officer and for surrender of carcass to commission officer; 5 in hunting and furtaking, repealing provisions relating to 6 hunting on Sunday prohibited, providing for hunting on Sunday and further providing for the offense of trespass on private 7 8 property while hunting and for hunting on Sunday without 9 written permission; and, in special licenses and permits, 10 11 providing for agriculture access permit list. 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 301(a) and (b) introductory paragraph of <--14 15 Title 34 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended 16 and the section is amended by adding a subsection to read: 17 SECTION 1. SECTION 301(A) OF TITLE 34 OF THE PENNSYLVANIA CONSOLIDATED STATUTES IS AMENDED AND THE SECTION IS AMENDED BY 18 19 ADDING SUBSECTIONS TO READ: 20 § 301. Organization of commission. 21 Composition. -- [The] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B.1), THE 22 independent administrative commission known as the Pennsylvania

Game Commission shall consist of fnine 10 competent citizens of <--

- 2 wildlife conservation and restoration and who shall be appointed
- 3 by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of a
- 4 majority of the elected members of the Senate.
- 5 (b) Qualifications. -- [The] One member of the commission <--
- 6 shall be known as the Agricultural Commissioner At Large. The_
- 7 Agricultural Commissioner At Large shall represent the interest_
- 8 of agricultural commodities that pertain to normal agricultural
- 9 operations and wildlife. The remaining members of the commission-
- 10 shall be appointed from the various geographical sections of
- 11 this Commonwealth so that one and only one shall be a resident-
- 12 of each of the following districts:

- 15 (B.1) ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATION. -- THE GOVERNOR SHALL ENSURE
- 16 THAT AT LEAST ONE MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION REPRESENTS THE
- 17 INTEREST OF AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES THAT PERTAIN TO NORMAL
- 18 AGRICULTURAL OPERATIONS AND WILDLIFE.

- 20 (e) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 21 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 22 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 23 "Agricultural Commissioner At Large." An individual who-
- 24 raises an agricultural commodity and who owns or leases a normal
- 25 agricultural operation.
- 26 "Agricultural commodity." As defined in section 2 of the act
- 27 <u>of June 10, 1982 (P.L.454, No.133), entitled "An act protecting</u>
- 28 agricultural operations from nuisance suits and ordinances under
- 29 certain circumstances."
- 30 "Normal agricultural operation." As defined in section 2 of

- 2 protecting agricultural operations from nuisance suits and
- 3 ordinances under certain circumstances."
- 4 Section 2. Sections 2122 and 2125 of Title 34 are amended to
- 5 read:
- 6 § 2122. Report to commission officer.
- 7 Any person who kills any game or wildlife, other than
- 8 raccoons, under the provisions of this subchapter shall, within
- 9 24 hours, report, orally or in writing, the killing to an
- 10 officer of the commission. The report shall set forth the date,
- 11 time and place of the killing, the number of species killed
- 12 [and], the sex of the species[.] and the location of each
- 13 carcass. The commission shall establish a self-reporting system
- 14 that allows a person assigned to remove deer for crop damage
- 15 purposes to report each harvest to an officer of the commission
- 16 <u>via a toll-free telephone number, online application or publicly</u>
- 17 accessible Internet website.
- 18 § 2125. Surrender of carcass [to commission officer].
- 19 Except as otherwise provided in this subchapter, the entire
- 20 carcass, including the head and hide[,] of all big game animals
- 21 and the entire carcass of any other game or wildlife, other than
- 22 raccoons, less entrails, shall be made available, unless
- 23 otherwise directed by an officer of the commission, intact[,
- 24 less entrails,] to any commission officer calling for them[.] or
- 25 <u>delivered to a processor for final disposition. As used in this</u>
- 26 <u>section, the term "processor" means a location specified by the</u>
- 27 <u>commission that is willing to accept donations of animals taken</u>
- 28 <u>under this chapter.</u>
- 29 Section 3. Section 2303 of Title 34 is repealed:
- 30 [§ 2303. Hunting on Sunday prohibited.

- 1 (a) General rule. -- Except as otherwise provided in this
- 2 title, it is unlawful for any person to hunt for any furbearer
- 3 or game on Sunday.
- 4 (b) Construction of section. -- This section shall not be
- 5 construed to prohibit:
- 6 (1) The training of dogs.
- 7 (2) The participation in dog trials as provided for in
- 8 this title.
- 9 (3) The removal of lawfully taken game or wildlife from
- traps or the resetting of the traps on Sunday.
- 11 (b.1) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to:
- 12 (1) The hunting of foxes.
- 13 (2) The hunting of coyotes.
- 14 (3) Any hunting which occurs on noncommercial regulated
- hunting grounds holding a valid permit under section 2928(b)
- (2) (relating to regulated hunting grounds permits).
- 17 (4) Hunting on three Sundays each calendar year, as
- 18 follows:
- (i) One day of Sunday hunting shall be instituted by
- the commission during the deer rifle season.
- (ii) One day of Sunday hunting shall be instituted
- by the commission during the Statewide deer archery
- season.
- (iii) One day of Sunday hunting as determined by the
- commission shall be instituted by the commission.
- Authority to hunt on any Sunday instituted by the commission

- to secure a hunting license who attempts to hunt on private
- land without obtaining written permission of the landowner,
- an agent of the landowner or lessee.

- 5 (a) General rule. -- The commission may institute Sunday
- 6 hunting by regulation promulgated in accordance with section
- 7 2102 (relating to regulations).
- 8 (b) Applicability. -- Authority to hunt on any Sunday
- 9 instituted by the commission under subsection (a) shall not
- 10 apply to any person required to secure a hunting license who
- 11 attempts to hunt on private land without obtaining written
- 12 permission of the landowner, an agent of the landowner or a
- 13 <u>lessee.</u>
- 14 (c) Lawful hunting. -- It shall be lawful for a person to hunt
- 15 for any furbearer or game on Sunday on and after the publication
- 16 of the final regulation under subsection (a).
- 17 Section 5. Sections 2314(a), (b) and (c) and 2315(a) of
- 18 Title 34 are amended to read:
- 19 § 2314. Trespass on private property while hunting.
- 20 (a) General rule. -- A person, while engaged in hunting or
- 21 furtaking, commits an offense if, knowing that the person is not
- 22 licensed or privileged to do so, the person:
- 23 (1) enters or remains on any land of another without
- authorization to do so, when the land is posted in a manner
- 25 prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the
- 26 person's attention [or is fenced or enclosed in a manner
- 27 manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or];
- 28 (2) enters or remains on any land of another without
- 29 authorization and defies an order not to enter or to leave
- 30 that has been personally communicated to the person by the

- owner of the land or other authorized person[.];
- 2 (3) enters or remains on any land of another without
- 3 authorization to do so, when the land is fenced or enclosed
- in a manner manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or
- 5 (4) subject to subsection (b), enters or remains on any
- 6 land of another without authorization to do so when notice
- 7 against trespass is given by the placement of identifying
- 8 purple paint marks on trees or posts on the property, which
- 9 are:
- 10 <u>(i) vertical lines of not less than eight inches in</u>
- length and not less than one inch in width;
- (ii) placed in a manner so that the bottom of the
- 13 <u>mark is not less than three feet from the ground and not</u>
- 14 more than five feet from the ground; and
- 15 <u>(iii) placed at locations that are readily visible</u>
- to a person approaching the property and no more than 100
- feet apart.
- 18 (b) Applicability.--
- 19 (1) This section shall not apply to an unarmed person
- 20 who enters onto posted property for the sole purpose of
- 21 retrieving a hunting dog.
- 22 (2) Subsection (a) (4) shall not apply in a county of the
- 23 first class or a county of the second class.
- 24 (c) Penalty.--An offense under this section shall be graded
- 25 as follows:
- (1) A person who violates subsection (a) (1), (3) or (4)
- commits a summary offense of the [third degree.] <u>second</u>
- 28 <u>degree and may result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt</u>
- 29 or take game or wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth
- for a period of up to one year.

- 1 (2) A person who violates subsection (a) (2) commits a
- 2 misdemeanor[.] and shall result in forfeiture of the
- 3 privilege to hunt or take game or wildlife anywhere within
- 4 <u>this Commonwealth for a period of three years.</u>
- 5 (3) A person who commits a second or subsequent
- 6 violation of this section within a seven-year period commits
- 7 a misdemeanor, and the second or subsequent violation shall
- 8 result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt or take game or
- 9 wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth for a period of
- 10 [one year] five years.

- 12 § 2315. Hunting on Sunday without written permission.
- 13 (a) General rule. -- A person required to secure a hunting
- 14 license to hunt commits an offense if, while engaged in hunting
- on Sunday under section [2303(b.1)(4) (relating to hunting on
- 16 Sunday prohibited)] 2303.1 (relating to hunting on Sunday), the
- 17 person enters private land without obtaining written permission
- 18 of the landowner, an agent of the landowner or lessee.
- 19 * * *
- 20 Section 6. Title 34 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 21 § 2931. Agriculture access permit list.
- 22 (a) Permit list. -- The commission shall create the
- 23 agriculture access permit list to connect licensed hunters with
- 24 private agricultural landowners for the purpose of crop damage
- 25 <u>mediation</u>.
- 26 (b) Applications. -- An individual may submit an application
- 27 for placement on the list and a permit under this section in a
- 28 form and manner determined by the commission. The commission
- 29 shall provide an applicant with the option of applying for
- 30 placement on the list and a permit under this section when the

- 1 applicant is purchasing the applicant's hunting license. The
- 2 <u>following shall apply:</u>
- 3 (1) By selecting the option specified under this
- 4 <u>subsection</u>, the applicant shall give the commission the right
- 5 to share the information authorized under subsection (d) upon
- 6 <u>approval of the application.</u>
- 7 (2) The applicant may reapply for placement on the list
- 8 <u>and a permit under this section based on the criteria under</u>
- 9 <u>subsection (c).</u>
- 10 (c) Criteria. -- In order to be eligible for placement on the
- 11 <u>list and a permit under this section, an applicant shall meet</u>
- 12 <u>all of the following criteria at the time of submission of the</u>
- 13 <u>application under subsection (b):</u>
- 14 (1) Has not committed an offense under this title in the
- prior seven years.
- 16 (2) Be 18 years of age or older.
- 17 (3) Furnish proof of a valid hunting license and tags
- for the game or wildlife that the applicant will be hunting
- on the eligible hunting grounds.
- 20 (d) Retention of records. -- The commission shall retain all
- 21 of the following:
- 22 (1) The name of each applicant and corresponding records
- 23 <u>containing each applicant's name, telephone number and</u>
- 24 municipality.
- 25 (2) Each application approved under subsection (e).
- 26 (3) Each application disapproved under subsection (e)
- 27 <u>and reasons for the disapproval. Notwithstanding the act of</u>
- February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know
- 29 Law, or any other provision of law, the commission may not
- 30 publicly disclose the reasons for the disapproval of an

- 1 <u>application</u>.
- 2 (e) Notice. -- The commission shall, via telephone, first
- 3 class mail or email, notify an applicant who has been approved
- 4 or disapproved for placement on the list and a permit under this
- 5 section.
- 6 (f) Duration. -- The commission shall issue a permit under
- 7 this section in accordance with the duration of the license
- 8 period under section 2707 (relating to license periods). Upon
- 9 the expiration of the license period, the commission shall
- 10 remove each permittee from the list.
- 11 (g) Landowners. -- A private agricultural landowner may
- 12 request the list from the commission, including each permittee's
- 13 <u>name</u>, telephone number, municipality and county preference.
- (h) Guidelines. -- A permittee shall adhere to guidelines
- 15 specified by a private agricultural landowner when conducting
- 16 hunting activities on the landowner's property if the guidelines
- 17 are in accordance with the commission's regulations, including
- 18 all of the following:
- 19 (1) Specific days access is allowed to the property.
- 20 (2) Specific game species or sex of game species that
- 21 are available for harvest.
- 22 (i) Boundaries. -- The boundaries of the premises covered by a
- 23 permit under this section as eligible hunting grounds shall be
- 24 grounds which are owned by a private agricultural landowner who
- 25 <u>entered into an agreement with a permittee to conduct hunting</u>
- 26 activities on the landowner's land.
- 27 (j) Termination of access. -- A private agricultural landowner
- 28 may terminate an agreement specified under subsection (i) for
- 29 any reason at any time if the landowner provides 24 hours'
- 30 notice of the termination to a permittee. Upon the private

- 1 agricultural landowner providing notice under this subsection,
- 2 the permittee shall cease hunting activities on the landowner's
- 3 land.
- 4 (k) Removal from list. -- A permittee shall relinquish the
- 5 permittee's placement on the list and permit under this section
- 6 if the permittee:
- 7 (1) commits an offense under this title;
- 8 (2) fails to comply with quidelines under subsection
- 9 <u>(h); or</u>
- 10 (3) submits a request to the commission to be removed
- from the list.
- 12 (1) Limitations.--The commission shall limit the list for
- 13 the purposes specified under this section, including connecting
- 14 licensed hunters with private agricultural landowners. The
- 15 commission may not share the list in a manner not specified
- 16 under this section.
- 17 (m) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 18 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 19 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 20 "Applicant." An individual who submits an application under
- 21 subsection (b) for placement on the list and a permit under this
- 22 <u>section</u>.
- 23 <u>"Eliqible hunting grounds." Hunting grounds that are located</u>
- 24 on any of the following:
- 25 (1) Privately owned land.
- 26 (2) Land and water combined where the ground is wholly,
- or in part, regularly and continuously engaged in cultivating
- 28 the soil for general farm crop purposes, commercial truck
- 29 growing, commercial orchards or commercial nurseries.
- 30 "List." The agriculture access permit list created under

- 1 <u>subsection (a).</u>
- 2 "Permittee." An individual who has been placed on the list
- 3 and holds a permit under this section.
- 4 Section 7. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 5 (1) The repeal of 34 Pa.C.S. § 2303 shall take effect on
- 6 the publication of regulations by the commission under 34
- 7 Pa.C.S. § 2303.1.
- 8 (2) This section shall take effect immediately.
- 9 (3) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
- 10 days.
