## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for a synthetic plastic microbead prohibition.
- 2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 3 hereby enacts as follows:
- 4 Section 1. Short title.
- 5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Synthetic
- 6 Plastic Microbead Prohibition Act.
- 7 Section 2. Definitions.
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 9 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Over-the-counter drug." Any drug that contains a label
- 12 which identifies the product as a drug, as required by 21 CFR
- 13 201.66 (relating to format and content requirements for over-
- 14 the-counter (OTC) drug product labeling). The label shall
- 15 include:
- 16 (1) "Drug Facts" panel;
- 17 (2) a statement of the active ingredient or active

- 1 ingredients with a list of those ingredients contained in the
- 2 compound, substance or preparation.
- 3 "Personal care product." Any article intended to be
- 4 introduced into or applied to the human body for cleansing,
- 5 beautifying, promoting attractiveness or altering the
- 6 appearance, or any item intended for use as a component thereof.
- 7 "Plastic." A synthetic material made from linking monomers
- 8 through a chemical reaction to create an organic polymer chain
- 9 that can be molded or extruded at high heat into various solid
- 10 forms retaining their defined shapes during the life cycle and
- 11 after disposal.
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Environmental Protection of
- 13 the Commonwealth.
- "Synthetic plastic microbead." Any intentionally added solid
- 15 plastic particle that is not biodegradable in water and
- 16 measuring less than five millimeters in size and used to
- 17 exfoliate or cleanse in a rinse-off product.
- 18 Section 3. Prohibition.
- 19 (1) On or after January 1, 2018, no person shall produce
- or manufacture in this Commonwealth a personal care product
- 21 containing synthetic plastic microbeads, except for an over-
- the-counter drug.
- 23 (2) On or after January 1, 2019, no person shall:
- 24 (i) sell, offer for sale or offer for promotion in
- 25 this Commonwealth a personal care product containing
- 26 synthetic plastic microbeads, except for an over-the-
- counter drug; or
- 28 (ii) produce or manufacture in this Commonwealth an
- over-the-counter drug that contains synthetic plastic
- 30 microbeads.

- 1 (3) On or after January 1, 2020, no person shall sell,
- 2 offer for sale or offer for promotion in this Commonwealth an
- 3 over-the-counter drug containing synthetic plastic
- 4 microbeads.
- 5 Section 4. Penalties.
- 6 (a) First offense.--A first violation of section 3 shall be
- 7 a misdemeanor of the third degree. An individual convicted under
- 8 this subsection shall pay a fine of not less than \$1,000 and not
- 9 more than \$10,000 for each offense.
- 10 (b) Second and subsequent offenses. -- If the violation is of
- 11 a continuing nature, each day during which it continues
- 12 constitutes an additional, separate and distinct offense.
- 13 (c) Powers and duties of secretary. -- The secretary may
- 14 institute a civil action for injunctive relief to enforce the
- 15 provisions of section 3 and to prohibit and prevent a violation
- 16 of this act.
- 17 Section 5. Preemption.
- 18 The provisions of this act shall preempt any ordinance or
- 19 resolution of a municipality, county or other local government
- 20 entity concerning synthetic plastic microbeads.
- 21 Section 6. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
