A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in taxation and finance, providing for spending limitations.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
8	That Article VIII be amended by adding a section to read:
9	<u>§ 18. Spending limitations.</u>
10	(a) Except as provided in subsection (c), total spending by
11	the Commonwealth in a fiscal year shall not exceed the spending
12	appropriation limit as set forth in this section.
13	(b) (1) The spending appropriation limit for any fiscal
14	year shall be equal to total appropriations made during the
15	immediately prior fiscal year, adjusted by the lesser of:
16	(i) the average percentage change in personal income in

1	Pennsylvania for the three preceding calendar years as reported
2	by the Federal Government or as determined pursuant to an act of
3	the General Assembly; or
4	(ii) the average percentage change in inflation for the
5	three preceding calendar years plus the average percentage
6	change in the State population for the three preceding years as
7	reported by the annual Federal census estimates and adjusted
8	every decade to match the official Federal census.
9	(2) For purposes of this subsection, inflation shall mean
10	the percentage change in the United States Department of Labor,
11	Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index for All Urban
12	<u>Consumers, not seasonally adjusted; all items index, or its</u>
13	successor index.
14	(c) The spending appropriation limit may be exceeded in any
15	fiscal year:
16	(1) to respond to a declared emergency, if the General
17	Assembly approves by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the
18	members elected to each House of the General Assembly; or
19	(2) in other situations if the Governor so requests at least
20	30 days prior to the beginning of the fiscal year and the
21	General Assembly approves by the affirmative vote of two-thirds
22	of the members elected to each House of the General Assembly.
23	(d) For purposes of this section, total spending by the
24	Commonwealth means the total of the amounts approved as
25	executive authorizations by the Governor plus the total amounts
26	of appropriations made by the General Assembly, excluding
27	appropriations made with money received from the Federal
28	<u>Government.</u>
29	Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
30	Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the

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Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

7 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 8 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 9 10 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 11 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 12 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 13 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the 14 15 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment as a single ballot question to the qualified electors of this 16 17 Commonwealth at the first primary, general or municipal election which meets the requirements of and is in conformance with 18 section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and 19 20 which occurs at least three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is passed by the General Assembly. 21

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
