## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in pupils and attendance, further providing for nonprofit school food program.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 1337(d) of the act of March 10, 1949
10	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is
11	amended to read:
12	Section 1337. Nonprofit School Food Program* * *
13	(d) Boards of School Directors.
14	(1) Pursuant to any power of boards of school directors to
15	operate or provide for the operation of school food programs in
16	schools under their jurisdiction, boards of school directors may
17	use therefore funds disbursed to them under the provisions of
18	this section, gifts and other funds, received from sale of
19	school food under such programs.
20	(2) Regardless of whether a student has money to pay for a

1	school meal or owes money for earlier school meals, each board
2	of school directors shall establish a requirement for schools
3	<u>under its jurisdiction to provide a school food program meal to</u>
4	a student who requests one, unless the student's parent or
5	guardian has specifically provided written permission to the
6	school to withhold a school meal.
7	(3) Each board of school directors shall require schools
8	under its jurisdiction to comply with the following when a
9	student owes money for five or more school meals:
10	(i) The school shall determine if the student is eligible
11	for the school food program.
12	(ii) If the student is eligible for the school food program,
13	the school shall make at least two attempts to reach the
14	student's parent or guardian and have the parent or guardian
15	apply for participation in the school food program.
16	(iii) The principal, assistant principal, school counselor
17	or other school employee designated by the board of school
18	directors to contact the student's parent or guardian to offer
19	assistance with applying for participation in the school food
20	program shall:
21	(A) Determine if there are other issues within the student's
22	household that have caused the student to have insufficient
23	funds to purchase a school meal.
24	(B) Offer appropriate assistance on behalf of the student.
25	(4) Each board of school directors shall:
26	(i) Require schools under its jurisdiction to direct
27	communications regarding money owed by a student for school
28	meals to the student's parent or guardian and not to the
29	student.
30	(ii) Permit schools under its jurisdiction to contact the
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1	student's parent or guardian by means of a letter addressed to
2	the parent or guardian that is delivered by the student.
3	(5) Each board of school directors shall prohibit schools
4	under its jurisdiction from implementing the following:
5	(i) Publicly identifying or stigmatizing a student who
6	cannot pay for a school meal or who owes money for earlier
7	school meals, including a requirement that a student wear a
8	wristband or hand stamp for the purpose of identifying the
9	student as eligible for the school food program.
10	(ii) Requiring a student who cannot pay for a school meal to
11	perform chores or other work to pay for the school meal. This
12	subclause shall not apply if chores or other work are required
13	of all students regardless of the student's inability to pay for
14	the school meal.
15	(iii) Requiring a student to discard a school meal after it
16	was served to the student due to the student's inability to pay
17	for the school meal or the amount of money owed by the student
18	for earlier school meals.
19	(iv) Requiring a student's parent or guardian to pay fees or
20	costs charged by a collection agency that is contracted to
21	collect money owed for school meals.

23	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
