## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in public safety, providing for limits
- 3 on opioid prescriptions.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:
- 8 <u>CHAPTER 52B</u>
- 9 LIMITS ON OPIOID PRESCRIPTIONS

- 11 52B01. Definitions.
- 12 <u>52B02</u>. Limits on prescribing opioids.
- 13 <u>52B03</u>. Penalties.
- 14 § 52B01. Definitions.
- 15 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 "Controlled substance." A drug, substance or immediate

- 1 precursor included in Schedules II, III, IV and V of section 4
- 2 of the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The
- 3 Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.
- 4 "Medical emergency." A situation that in a prescriber's good
- 5 <u>faith professional judgment creates an immediate threat of</u>
- 6 serious risk to the life or physical health of a minor.
- 7 "Opioid." Any of the following:
- 8 <u>(1) A preparation or derivative of opium.</u>
- 9 (2) A synthetic narcotic that has opiate-like effects
- 10 <u>but is not derived from opium.</u>
- 11 (3) A group of naturally occurring peptides that bind at
- or otherwise influence opiate receptors, including opioid
- 13 <u>agonist.</u>
- 14 <u>"Patient." A person that is under the medical care of a</u>
- 15 prescriber.
- 16 "Prescriber." A person that is licensed, registered or
- 17 otherwise authorized to distribute, dispense or administer a
- 18 controlled substance, other drug or device in the course of
- 19 professional practice or research in this Commonwealth. The term
- 20 <u>does not include a veterinarian.</u>
- 21 § 52B02. Limits on prescribing opioids.
- 22 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided in subsection (b):
- 23 (1) A prescriber may not prescribe to a patient a
- combination of opioids in an aggregate amount in excess of
- 25 <u>100 morphine milligram equivalents of opioids per day.</u>
- 26 (2) A prescriber may not prescribe to a patient, who on
- 27 <u>the effective date of this section has an active prescription</u>
- for opioids in excess of 100 morphine milligram equivalents
- 29 of opioids per day, an opioid in an amount that would cause
- 30 the patient's total amount of opioids to exceed 300 morphine

- 1 <u>milligram equivalents of opioids per day. This paragraph</u>
- 2 <u>shall expire July 1, 2018.</u>
- 3 (b) Exceptions. -- The prescription limits in subsection (a)
- 4 shall not apply under any of the following circumstances:
- 5 (1) In the professional medical judgment of the
- 6 prescriber, the prescription of opioids in an aggregate
- amount in excess of 100 morphine milligram equivalents of
- 8 <u>opioids per day is required to stabilize a patient's acute</u>
- 9 medical condition and the prescriber:
- 10 (i) documents the acute medical condition in the
- 11 patient's record with the prescriber; and
- 12 <u>(ii) indicates the reason why a nonopioid</u>
- 13 <u>alternative is not appropriate to address the acute</u>
- 14 <u>medical condition.</u>
- 15 <u>(2) The prescription is for:</u>
- 16 <u>(i) management of pain associated with cancer;</u>
- 17 (ii) use in palliative or hospice care; or
- 18 (iii) medication-assisted substance abuse treatment.
- 19 (3) The prescription is for treatment associated with or
- incident to a medical emergency documented in the patient's
- 21 medical record.
- 22 § 52B03. Penalties.
- 23 A prescriber who violates this chapter shall be subject to
- 24 administrative sanctions by the prescriber's licensing board
- 25 under applicable law.
- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
