AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in miscellaneous provisions relating to institutions of higher education, establishing the Hunger-6 Free Campus Grant Program and the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Fund. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known

- 12 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a

- Section 2002-I. Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program. 14
- 15 (a) Establishment. -- The Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program is
- established within the Department of Education for the purposes 16
- 17 under subsection (b).
- (b) Purpose. -- The purpose of the Hunger-Free Campus Grant 18
- 19 Program shall be to provide grants to public institutions of
- 20 higher education that have one or more campuses designated by
- the Secretary of Education as hunger-free campuses under 21

1	subsection (c). The purpose of the grant funding shall be to:
2	(1) Address student hunger.
3	(2) Leverage more sustainable solutions to address basic
4	food needs on campus.
5	(3) Raise awareness of services currently offered on
6	campus which address basic food needs.
7	(4) Continue to build strategic partnerships at the
8	Federal, State and local levels to address food insecurity
9	among students.
10	(c) Hunger-free campus designation In order to be
11	designated as a hunger-free campus, a public institution of
12	higher education shall:
13	(1) Establish a hunger task force that meets a minimum
14	of three times per academic year to set at least two goals
15	with action plans and includes representatives from the
16	current student body.
17	(2) Designate a staff member responsible for assisting
18	students with enrollment in the Supplemental Nutrition
19	Assistance Program (SNAP).
20	(3) Provide options for students to utilize SNAP
21	benefits at campus stores or provide students with
22	information on establishments in the surrounding area of
23	campus where they can utilize SNAP EBT benefits.
24	(4) Participate in an awareness day campaign activity
25	and plan a campus awareness event during the National Hunger
26	and Homelessness Awareness Week.
27	(5) Provide at least one physical food pantry on campus
28	or enable students to receive food through a separate,

near campus.

- 1 (6) Develop a student meal credit donation program or
- 2 <u>designate a certain amount of money for free meal vouchers</u>
- 3 <u>for students.</u>
- 4 (7) Annually conduct a student survey on hunger,
- 5 <u>developed by the Department of Education, and submit the</u>
- 6 results of the survey to the Secretary of Education at a time
- 7 <u>prescribed by the Secretary of Education for inclusion in a</u>
- 8 <u>comparative profile of each campus designated as a hunger-</u>
- 9 <u>free campus. Survey data on student hunger shall be</u>
- disaggregated by race, gender identity, sexual orientation,
- 11 parenting status and financial aid status of students. In the
- development of the survey, the Department of Education may
- 13 utilize any existing surveys designed to collect information
- on food insecurity among students enrolled in public
- institutions of higher education.
- 16 (d) Allocation.--The Secretary of Education shall allocate
- 17 grant funding to each public institution of higher education
- 18 that has one or more campuses designated by the Secretary of
- 19 Education as a hunger-free campus as provided under subsection
- 20 (c). The Secretary of Education, or a designee, shall determine
- 21 the amount of each grant which shall be used by the public
- 22 institution of higher education to further address food
- 23 insecurity among students enrolled in the public institution of
- 24 <u>higher education</u>. The Secretary of Education or a designee shall
- 25 prioritize grants to public institutions of higher education
- 26 serving minority, low-income and high Pell-grant-recipient
- 27 campuses.
- 28 (e) Report. -- The Department of Education shall submit a
- 29 report to the Governor, the chair and minority chair of the
- 30 Education Committee of the Senate and the chair and minority

- 1 chair of the Education Committee of the House of Representatives
- 2 <u>no later than two years after the establishment of the Hunger-</u>
- 3 Free Campus Grant Program. The report shall include, but not be
- 4 <u>limited to, the number and amounts of the grant awards, the</u>
- 5 impact the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program had on establishing
- 6 additional hunger-free campuses at public institutions of higher
- 7 <u>education and reducing the number of students experiencing food</u>
- 8 <u>insecurity</u>, the disaggregated data on students served reflecting
- 9 the students' race, gender identity, sexual orientation,
- 10 parenting status and financial aid status and recommendations on
- 11 the expansion of the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program.
- 12 (f) Hunger-Free Campus Grant Fund. -- The Hunger-Free Campus
- 13 Grant Fund is established as a special fund in the State
- 14 Treasury. The following shall apply to the operation of the
- 15 fund:
- 16 (1) Money in the fund shall be appropriated on a
- 17 continuing basis to the Department of Education for the
- 18 purpose of awarding grants under this section.
- 19 (2) The sum of \$1,000,000 shall be transferred from the
- 20 General Fund to the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Fund to be used
- 21 <u>exclusively for the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Fund.</u>
- 22 (q) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 23 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 24 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 25 "Public institution of higher education." Any of the
- 26 following:
- 27 (1) A community college operating under Article XIX-A.
- 28 (2) A rural regional college established under Article
- 29 XIX-G.
- 30 (3) A university within the State System of Higher

- 1 <u>Education under Article XX-A.</u>
- 2 (4) A State-related institution as defined in section
- 3 <u>2001-C.</u>
- 4 (5) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.
- 5 (6) The Pennsylvania College of Technology.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
