Prohibition on expenditures for emission inspection 9 program. 10 11 (q.1) Enhanced emission inspection program amendment REVISED <--12 STATE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN. --13 (1) The Department of Environmental Protection, 14 cooperation with the department, shall develop and submit 15 approval to the Environmental Protection Agency an amendment 16 to the existing enhanced emission inspection program. The 17 amendment shall provide that a A subject vehicle with a model <--18 year of 1992 through 1995 that is registered in a county

12	administered as specified in 67 Pa. Code § 177.204, of
13	the vehicle emission control system.
14	(2) WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
15	SUBSECTION, THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION SHALL
16	INITIATE THE PROCESS FOR THE SUBJECT VEHICLES UNDER THIS
17	SUBSECTION IN THE VEHICLE EMISSION INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE
18	PROGRAM. THE FOLLOWING SHALL APPLY:
19	(I) THE REVISED STATE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN SHALL BE
20	COMPLETED NO LATER THAN JANUARY 1, 2020, AND SHALL
21	CONVINCINGLY DEMONSTRATE THAT THE SUBJECT VEHICLES UNDER
22	THIS SUBSECTION CAN MAINTAIN THE RELEVANT STANDARDS
23	WITHOUT BENEFIT OF THE EMISSIONS REDUCTIONS ATTRIBUTABLE
24	TO THE VEHICLE EMISSION INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE
25	PROGRAM.
26	(II) THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION
27	SHALL COMPLY WITH FEDERAL LAW DURING THE PROCESS,
28	INCLUDING ENSURING THAT THE REVISION WILL NOT INTERFERE
29	WITH ATTAINMENT REQUIREMENTS OR REASONABLE FURTHER
30	PROGRESS TOWARD ATTAINMENT AND THAT FEDERAL FUNDING IS

1	NOT NEGATIVELY IMPACTED AS A RESULT OF THE REVISION.
2	(III) THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION
3	SHALL NOTIFY THE CHAIR AND MINORITY CHAIR OF THE
4	TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIR AND
5	MINORITY CHAIR OF THE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE OF THE
6	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE CHAIR AND MINORITY CHAIR OF
7	THE ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY COMMITTEE OF THE
8	SENATE AND THE CHAIR AND MINORITY CHAIR OF THE
9	ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE
10	OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL
11	PROTECTION'S NOTIFICATION TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION
12	AGENCY.
13	(2) (3) Upon approval by the Environmental Protection <
14	Agency of the amendment to the enhanced emission inspection <
15	program, the secretary UNDER PARAGRAPH (2), THE SECRETARY OF <
16	ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION shall transmit notice of the
17	approval to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication
18	in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. The emissions testing required
19	by the amendment REVISED STATE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN shall <
20	apply 120 days following publication of the notice.
