AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled  
 2 "An act relating to the finances of the State government;  
 3 providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for  
 4 ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint  
 5 Underwriting Association, for entertainment business  
 6 financial management firms, for private dam financial  
 7 assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for  
 8 the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes,  
 9 bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the  
 10 collection and recovery of fees and other money or property  
 11 due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,  
 12 including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale,  
 13 the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds  
 14 and securities belonging to or in the possession of the  
 15 Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the  
 16 Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the  
 17 courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the  
 18 Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and  
 19 all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting  
 20 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,  
 21 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,  
 22 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes  
 23 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of  
 24 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of  
 25 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of  
 26 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every  
 27 department, board, commission, and officer of the State  
 28 government, every political subdivision of the State, and  
 29 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,  
 30 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or  
 31 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws  
 32 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or  
 33 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,  
 34 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the  
 35 Commonwealth," in general budget implementation, further

1 providing for Multimodal Transportation Fund.

2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
3 hereby enacts as follows:

4 Section 1. Section 1798.3-E of the act of April 9, 1929  
5 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, amended July 11,  
6 2022 (P.L.540, No.54), is amended to read:

7 Section 1798.3-E. Multimodal Transportation Fund.

8 (a) Department of Transportation.--

9 (1) From funds available to the Department of  
10 Transportation under 74 Pa.C.S. § 2104(a)(2) (relating to use  
11 of money in fund), the local match under 74 Pa.C.S. § 2106  
12 (relating to local match) may be waived by the Secretary of  
13 Transportation for good cause if the applicant for assistance  
14 is a municipality.

15 (2) From funds available to the Department of  
16 Transportation under 74 Pa.C.S. § 2104(a)(2), the local match  
17 under 74 Pa.C.S. § 2106 may be waived by the Secretary of  
18 Transportation for good cause if the applicant for assistance  
19 is a port authority.

20 (b) Commonwealth Financing Authority.--Notwithstanding the  
21 provisions of 74 Pa.C.S. § 2106, a municipality or port  
22 authority receiving financial assistance under 74 Pa.C.S. §  
23 2104(a)(4) may not be required to provide a local match.

24 (c) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following  
25 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this  
26 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

27 "Municipality." A county, city, borough, incorporated town,  
28 township or local, regional or metropolitan transportation  
29 authority.

30 "Port authority." A port authority as established under the

1 act of July 10, 1989 (P.L.291, No.50), known as the Philadelphia  
2 Regional Port Authority Act.

3 (d) Expiration.--This section shall expire December 31,  
4 [2023] 2024.

5 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023, or  
6 immediately, whichever is later.
