## AN ACT

| 14  | The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  |
| 15  | hereby enacts as follows:   |
| 16  | Section 1. The act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known  |
| 17  | as the Pennsylvania Election Code, is amended by adding an  |
| 18  | article to read:  |
| 19  | ARTICLE V-A   |
| 20  | Congressional Redistricting Process   |
| 21  | Section 501-A. Definitions.   |
| 22  | The following words and phrases when used in this article   |
| 23  | shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the  |

- 1 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 2 "Commission." A congressional redistricting commission
- 3 established under this article.
- 4 "Immediate family member." A parent, spouse, child, brother
- 5 or sister.
- 6 <u>"Secretary." The Secretary of State of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 7 Section 502-A. Census data.
- 8 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in the year
- 9 <u>immediately following the Federal decennial census, the</u>
- 10 Legislative Data Processing Center shall:
- 11 (1) Obtain the census data for this Commonwealth from
- the United States Census Bureau.
- 13 (2) Provide the adjusted population data to the
- 14 <u>commission within 60 days after the Legislative Data</u>
- 15 <u>Processing Center receives the census data from the United</u>
- 16 <u>States Census Bureau.</u>
- 17 Section 503-A. Congressional redistricting commission.
- 18 (a) Establishment. -- No later than March 1 in the year
- 19 immediately following the Federal decennial census, a
- 20 congressional redistricting commission shall be constituted for
- 21 the purpose of redistricting the congressional districts of this
- 22 Commonwealth.
- 23 (b) Commission composition. -- The commission shall consist of
- 24 the following members:
- 25 (1) Two individuals who are registered with the largest
- 26 political party in this Commonwealth based on registration.
- 27 (2) Two individuals who are registered with the second-
- 28 largest political party in this Commonwealth based on
- 29 registration.
- 30 (3) One individual who is not registered with either of

| 3  | (c) Qualifications Each member of the commission:            |
| 4  | (1) Must be a voter who, in the five years immediately       |
| 5  | preceding the date of the individual's appointment to the    |
| 6  | <pre>commission:</pre>                                       |
| 7  | (i) has been registered continuously in this                 |
| 8  | Commonwealth with the same political party or has been       |
| 9  | unaffiliated with a political party and has not changed      |
| 10 | political party affiliation during that five-year period;    |
| 11 | <u>and</u>   |
| 12 | (ii) has voted in at least three elections. For              |
| 13 | purposes of this subparagraph, the term "election" means     |
| 14 | a primary, general or municipal election.                    |
| 15 | (2) May not have been a candidate for election to or         |
| 16 | served as Governor, a member of the General Assembly or a    |
| 17 | member of the Congress of the United States from this        |
| 18 | Commonwealth during the five years immediately preceding the |
| 19 | date of the individual's appointment, or be an immediate     |
| 20 | family member established through blood or legal relation of |
| 21 | a candidate for an office specified in this paragraph or an  |
| 22 | individual who held an office specified in this paragraph.   |
| 23 | (3) May not have been convicted, found guilty or pleaded     |
| 24 | guilty or nolo contendere to embezzlement of public money,   |
| 25 | bribery, perjury or other infamous crime.                    |
| 26 | (4) May not be registered as a lobbyist in this              |
| 27 | Commonwealth under 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 13A (relating to lobbying  |
| 28 | disclosure), registered as a lobbyist before a political     |
| 29 | subdivision in this Commonwealth or registered as a lobbyist |
| 30 | before the Federal Government.                               |

| 1  | (5) May not be or have served as staff, a consultant to        |

| 3  | family relationship through blood or legal relation to the     |
| 4  | Governor, a member of the General Assembly or a member of the  |
| 5  | Congress of the United States from this Commonwealth.          |
| 6  | (6) May not hold an appointive office in the executive         |
| 7  | branch or legislative branch of the Federal, State or local    |
| 8  | <pre>government.</pre>   |
| 9  | (d) Procedure for selection of members Application and         |
| 10 | selection of the members of the commission shall be subject to |
| 11 | the following:   |
| 12 | (1) Application to serve as a member of the commission         |
| 13 | may be filed with, and on a form developed by, the secretary   |
| 14 | indicating thereon evidence of the individual's                |
| 15 | qualifications as provided by this section.                    |
| 16 | (2) The secretary shall verify the qualifications of           |
| 17 | each applicant. If the secretary finds that an applicant is    |
| 18 | not qualified, the secretary shall not include the             |
| 19 | applicant's name in the pool of applicants.                    |
| 20 | (3) The secretary shall separate all qualified                 |
| 21 | applicants into three subpools consisting of those who are:    |
| 22 | (i) registered with the largest political party in             |
| 23 | this Commonwealth based on registration;                       |
| 24 | (ii) registered with the second-largest political              |
| 25 | party in this Commonwealth based on registration; and          |
| 26 | (iii) not registered with either of the two largest            |
| 27 | political parties in this Commonwealth based on                |
| 28 | registration.  |
| 29 | (4) The secretary shall randomly select 20 qualified           |
| 30 | applicants from each of the three subpools provided in         |

| 1  | paragraph (3). The Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the |

| 2  | Senate and the Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the     |
| 3  | House of Representatives may each strike up to two applicants |
| 4  | from each subpool. Each leader shall have no more than six    |
| 5  | strikes.  |
| 6  | (5) After the legislative leaders have exercised their        |
| 7  | strikes under paragraph (4), the secretary shall randomly     |
| 8  | select for appointment as members of the commission from the  |
| 9  | remaining applicants in each of the three subpools of         |
| 10 | qualified applicants. In addition to the qualification        |
| 11 | requirements provided in subsection (c), appointments from    |
| 12 | each subpool shall reasonably reflect the racial, geographic  |
| 13 | and gender diversity of this Commonwealth.                    |
| 14 | (6) One of the members shall be selected as chairperson       |
| 15 | by a vote of at least three members of the commission.        |
| 16 | (7) For purposes of this subsection, "randomly select"        |
| 17 | means to select by the following process:                     |
| 18 | (i) The secretary shall fix a day for each random             |
| 19 | drawing of names from each of the three subpools of           |
| 20 | qualified applicants created under paragraph (3), in such     |
| 21 | a manner as may be prescribed by the secretary, for the       |
| 22 | <pre>purpose of:</pre>  |
| 23 | (A) preliminary selection of 20 applicants from               |
| 24 | each of the three subpools under paragraph (4); and           |
| 25 | (B) final selection from the remaining                        |
| 26 | applicants in each of the three subpools for                  |
| 27 | appointment as members of the commission pursuant to          |
| 28 | paragraph (5).  |
| 29 | (ii) For purposes of preliminary selection of 20              |
| 30 | applicants from each of the three subpools under              |
|    |   |

| 1  | <u>paragraph (4), each applicant shall draw a number from a</u> |
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| 2  | set of sequentially numbered cards assigned to each             |
| 3  | subpool. The applicants who draw cards numbered 1 through       |
| 4  | 20 shall remain in the subpool.                                 |
| 5  | (iii) For purposes of final selection from the                  |
| 6  | remaining applicants in each of the three subpools for          |
| 7  | appointment as commission members pursuant to paragraph         |
| 8  | (5), each applicant shall draw a number from a set of           |
| 9  | sequentially numbered cards assigned to each subpool. The       |
| 10 | secretary shall appoint the following applicants to serve       |
| 11 | on the commission:  |
| 12 | (A) Applicants in the subpool created under                     |
| 13 | paragraph(3)(i) who draw cards numbered 1 and 2.                |
| 14 | (B) Applicants in the subpool created under                     |
| 15 | paragraph(3)(ii) who draw cards numbered 1 and 2.               |
| 16 | (C) The applicant in the subpool created under                  |
| 17 | paragraph(3)(iii) who draws the card numbered 1.                |
| 18 | (iv) The secretary shall give at least two days'                |
| 19 | notice by mail of the date to all applicants remaining in       |
| 20 | each subpool of qualified applicants and by publication         |
| 21 | once in at least two newspapers of general circulation          |
| 22 | <pre>published in each county.</pre>                            |
| 23 | (v) All remaining applicants in each of the three               |
| 24 | subpools subject to random selection may appear in person       |
| 25 | or by agent duly authorized by letter of attorney, signed       |
| 26 | and acknowledged by an officer empowered to take                |
| 27 | acknowledgments.  |
| 28 | (vi) In the event a selected applicant is not                   |
| 29 | present in person or by representative at the time of the       |
| 30 | random drawing, the secretary shall appoint another             |

- 1 <u>individual to represent such absentee.</u>
- 2 (e) Terms. -- The terms of office of each member of the
- 3 commission shall expire on the appointment of the first member
- 4 of the succeeding commission.
- 5 (f) Voting.--
- 6 (1) Four members of the commission shall constitute a
- 7 quorum.
- 8 (2) Except as provided in subsection (d) (6), at least
- 9 <u>four affirmative votes of the commission shall be required</u>
- 10 <u>for official action, including preliminary and final plans</u>
- for congressional districts adopted by the commission.
- 12 <u>Section 504-A. Member removal and vacancies.</u>
- 13 <u>(a) Member removal.--</u>
- 14 (1) If a member of the commission is convicted, found
- 15 <u>guilty or pleads guilty or nolo contendere to embezzlement of</u>
- public money, bribery, perjury or other infamous crime,
- 17 whether or not sentence has been imposed, the member's
- 18 position shall be deemed vacant.
- 19 (2) If a member of the commission fails to attend more
- than two consecutive meetings at which a vote of the
- 21 commission is scheduled, the member's position shall be
- deemed vacant unless the member is absent due to the member's
- 23 serious illness or the death or serious illness of an
- immediate family member.
- 25 (b) Vacancies.--A vacancy on the commission shall be filled
- 26 within 14 days from the time the commission is notified of the
- 27 <u>vacancy in the same manner that the position was originally</u>
- 28 filled and using the same pool of applicants from which the
- 29 vacating member was chosen. If none of the remaining applicants
- 30 are available for service, the secretary shall fill the vacancy

- 1 from a new pool of applicants created from the same voter
- 2 <u>registration category as the vacating member.</u>
- 3 Section 505-A. Commission conduct.
- 4 (a) Public access.--
- 5 (1) The activities of the commission are subject to the
- 6 provisions of 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to open meetings)
- and the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the
- 8 Right-to-Know Law. The commission shall be considered a
- 9 <u>legislative agency as defined in section 102 of the Right-to-</u>
- 10 Know Law.
- 11 (2) Notwithstanding 65 Pa.C.S. § 709(a) (relating to
- 12 <u>public notice</u>), the commission shall provide no less than 14
- days' prior public notice for each meeting.
- 14 (3) The commission shall maintain a publicly accessible
- 15 <u>Internet website for purposes of providing public notice of</u>
- hearings, receiving public comment, publishing census data in
- 17 multiple commonly used formats, such as geographic
- information systems (GIS) mapping files, keyhole markup
- 19 language (KML) files and Microsoft Excel files, and
- 20 publishing the preliminary and final redistricting plans as
- 21 required by this article.
- 22 (b) Hearing process.--
- 23 (1) The commission shall establish and implement an open
- hearing process for public comment and deliberation that is
- 25 designed to encourage citizen outreach and solicit broad
- 26 public participation in the redistricting public review
- process.
- 28 (2) The hearing process shall:
- 29 <u>(i) Include hearings to receive public comment</u>
- 30 before the commission adopts preliminary and final plans

| 1  | and at least one hearing following the adoption and              |
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| 2  | display of a preliminary plan.                                   |
| 3  | (ii) Be supplemented with other activities as                    |
| 4  | appropriate to further increase opportunities for the            |
| 5  | public to observe and participate in the review process.         |
| 6  | (3) The commission shall:  |
| 7  | (i) Display the plan for public comment in a manner              |
| 8  | designed to achieve the widest public access reasonably          |
| 9  | possible.  |
| 10 | (ii) Take public comment for 14 days from the date               |
| 11 | of public display of a preliminary redistricting plan.           |
| 12 | (c) Ex parte communication                                       |
| 13 | (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), commission              |
| 14 | members and staff may not communicate with or receive            |
| 15 | communications about redistricting matters from anyone unless    |
| 16 | during a public hearing or as provided in this article.          |
| 17 | (2) Commission members may communicate with other                |
| 18 | members, staff, legal counsel, consultants retained by the       |
| 19 | commission, staff and consultants of the Legislative Data        |
| 20 | Processing Center and the United States Census Bureau.           |
| 21 | (d) Compensation Members of the commission may not receive       |
| 22 | a salary, but the General Assembly shall appropriate sufficient  |
| 23 | funds for the reimbursement of reasonable and necessary expenses |
| 24 | for members and staff appointed by the commission incurred in    |
| 25 | the performance of their duties under this article.              |
| 26 | Section 506-A. Congressional redistricting process and           |
| 27 | criteria.  |
| 28 | (a) First meeting The commission shall convene its first         |
| 29 | meeting on or before May 1 of the year following each Federal    |
| 30 | decennial census.  |

| 1  | (b) Timeline for hearings and plans                           |

| 2  | (1) At its first meeting or on or before 30 days after        |
| 3  | the commission receives the adjusted census data from the     |
| 4  | Legislative Data Processing Center, whichever is later, the   |
| 5  | commission shall commence a series of public hearings to      |
| 6  | receive public comment concerning a redistricting plan.       |
| 7  | (2) (i) On or before October 1 of the year that the           |
| 8  | commission receives the adjusted census data from the         |
| 9  | Legislative Data Processing Center, the commission shall      |
| 10 | hold at least six hearings throughout this Commonwealth.      |
| 11 | (ii) The hearings required under this paragraph               |
| 12 | shall be held at times that are likely to maximize public     |
| 13 | participation and in locations that encompass the             |
| 14 | geographic, racial and ethnic diversity of this               |
| 15 | Commonwealth.   |
| 16 | (iii) The commission shall conduct an open and                |
| 17 | transparent process enabling public consideration of and      |
| 18 | comment on the drawing of district lines as required by       |
| 19 | this article.   |
| 20 | (3) Following the conclusion of the public hearings           |
| 21 | required under paragraph (2), but no later than October 31 of |
| 22 | the year that the commission receives the adjusted census     |
| 23 | data from the Legislative Data Processing Center, the         |
| 24 | commission shall prepare and adopt a preliminary plan for     |
| 25 | congressional districts.                                      |
| 26 | (4) On or before November 30 of the year that the             |
| 27 | commission receives the adjusted census data from the         |
| 28 | Legislative Data Processing Center, the commission shall:     |
| 29 | (i) Publish the preliminary plan on the commission's          |
| 30 | publicly accessible Internet website.                         |

| 1  | <u>(ii) Submit the preliminary plan to the secretary</u>     |
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| 2  | for publication once in at least one newspaper of general    |
| 3  | circulation in each congressional district.                  |
| 4  | (iii) Issue with the preliminary plan a report that:         |
| 5  | (A) Explains the basis which the commission used             |
| 6  | in preparing the preliminary plan in compliance with         |
| 7  | the criteria required under this article.                    |
| 8  | (B) Includes definitions of the terms and                    |
| 9  | standards the commission used in preparing the               |
| 10 | preliminary plan.  |
| 11 | (iv) (A) Hold at least one public hearing on the             |
| 12 | preliminary plan.  |
| 13 | (B) Allow the public to submit comments to the               |
| 14 | commission through the commission's publicly                 |
| 15 | accessible Internet website concerning the                   |
| 16 | <pre>preliminary plan.</pre>                                 |
| 17 | (5) On or before December 15 of the year the commission      |
| 18 | receives the adjusted census data from the Legislative Data  |
| 19 | Processing Center, the commission shall adopt and publish a  |
| 20 | final congressional redistricting plan on the commission's   |
| 21 | publicly accessible Internet website and submit the final_   |
| 22 | redistricting plan to the secretary for publication once in  |
| 23 | at least one newspaper of general circulation in each        |
| 24 | congressional district.                                      |
| 25 | (6) If the commission does not complete and approve a        |
| 26 | final redistricting plan within the time prescribed in this  |
| 27 | section, unless the time is extended by the Supreme Court of |
| 28 | Pennsylvania for cause shown on application by the           |
| 29 | commission, the secretary shall immediately petition the     |
| 30 | Supreme Court for an order directing the appointment of a    |

| Τ  | special master to develop and complete a final redistricting  |
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| 2  | plan in accordance with the district requirements provided in |
| 3  | this section. The special master must demonstrate expertise   |
| 4  | in geographic information systems by holding a graduate       |
| 5  | degree in geographic information systems and currently        |

| 7  | systems program at an institution of higher learning located  |
| 8  | within this Commonwealth and must meet the qualifications in  |

| 16 | (ii) Each congressional district shall:                       |
| 17 | (A) Comply with the Constitution of the United                |
| 18 | States.   |
| 19 | (B) Comply with the Voting Rights Act of 1965                 |
| 20 | (Public Law 89-110, 52 U.S.C. § 10301 et seq.).               |
| 21 | (C) Be equal in population, except where                      |
| 22 | deviation is required to comply with the Voting               |
| 23 | Rights Act of 1965 or is otherwise allowed by law.            |
| 24 | (D) Without violating the requirements of this                |
| 25 | section, respect the geographic integrity of a county         |
| 26 | or municipality, to the extent possible.                      |
| 27 | (E) Be geographically contiguous. Areas that                  |
| 28 | meet only at the points of adjoining corners shall            |
| 29 | not be deemed contiguous.                                     |
| 30 | (F) To the extent practicable and, if it does                 |

- 1 not conflict with the criteria specified in clauses 2 (A), (B), (C), (D) and (E) and paragraph (2), be 3 drawn to encourage geographic compactness. (2) To the extent consistent with paragraph (1)(ii)(C), 4 5 district boundaries shall coincide with the boundaries of political subdivisions of this Commonwealth. The number of 6 counties and municipalities divided among more than one 7 8 district shall be as few as possible. 9 (d) Other redistricting data. -- In establishing districts consistent with Federal and State law, the commission may 10 utilize other redistricting data, including voter registration 11 12 and previous election results. Section 507-A. Final congressional redistricting plan. 13 14 (a) General rule. -- The final redistricting plan for congressional districts prepared and adopted by the commission 15 16 under section 506-A shall: 17 (1) be the congressional redistricting plan for the 18 Commonwealth; and 19 (2) be filed with the secretary within seven days of the 20 plan being adopted by the commission. 21 (b) Aggrieved persons. -- An aggrieved person must file an appeal from the final congressional redistricting plan with a 22 23 United States District Court in Pennsylvania within 30 days 24 after the filing of the final congressional redistricting plan. 25 (c) Effective date of plan. -- When a court has finally 26 decided an appeal under subsection (b) or when the last day for filing an appeal has passed with no appeal taken, the final 27 congressional redistricting plan shall have the force and effect 28
- 29 of law and the districts in the final congressional
- 30 redistricting plan shall be used thereafter in elections for

- 1 representatives from this Commonwealth to the House of
- 2 Representatives of the United States until the adoption of a new
- 3 <u>congressional redistricting plan following the next Federal</u>
- 4 <u>decennial census.</u>
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2017, or
- 6 immediately, whichever is later.
